IV. APPROVAL OF TODAY'S AGENDA

A motion was made by Mag. Buck Simmons and seconded by Mag. Clark Wood to approve the day's agenda as presented. There was no other discussion. Vote of the Court was unanimous.

V. APPROVAL OF BOTH THE APRIL 24, 2017 SPECIAL CALLED MEETING MINUTES AND THE REGULAR APRIL 24, 2017 FISCAL COURT MINUTES

A motion was made by Mag. Johnny Brooks and seconded by Mag. Joe Durbin to dispense with the reading of the April 24, 2017 Special Called Meeting minutes. There was no discussion, and the Vote of the Court was unanimous.

Another motion was then made by Mag. Johnny Brooks and seconded by Mag. Mark Woosley to dispense with the reading of the regular April 24, 2017 Fiscal Court minutes. There was no discussion, and the Vote of the Court was unanimous.

Foreman Page said that two mowers will be going as of today, with one on each side of the Green River. As he mentioned in the previous Fiscal Court meeting, a few tiles still need to be put in, as well. In conclusion, in regards to breakdowns, the TS-110 ditcher remains at Hobdy, Dye, and Reed, and Foreman Page said he continues to wait on it to be fixed.

IX. SHERIFF'S REPORT

Sheriff Shane Doyle was present, speaking next to the Court. The sheriff began by announcing for those in attendance who did not already know that the new Commonwealth Attorney for the district is Blake Chambers. Sheriff Doyle said now cases will move forward, and for the first time all year, the Grand Jury will convene.

Next, Sheriff Doyle reported to the Court he had traveled to Cave Hollow Bay on April 29th and performed golf cart inspections with Deputy Quentin Phillips. He was glad to announce that most all of the carts passed, with only three or four failing. He said his plan was to conduct another meeting with residents in about a month. Sheriff Doyle also announced that state-paid overtime was coming soon through a pair of mini-grants involving the initiatives "Blue Lights Across the Bluegrass" and "Click It or Ticket."

In his closing remarks, Sheriff Doyle addressed a situation briefly discussed in the previous Fiscal Court meeting. He began by apologizing to a contingent of residents who live in the Cedar Grove Church Road and Key Cemetery Road area. He said that miscommunication in his office was the culprit. He has spoken with the resident who has been engaging in target practice that has upset his neighbors, and the sheriff said he hopes he will be safer and exhibit better

XIII. PARKS AND RECREATION

Greg Hudson with the Parks and Recreation Department was present, and gave a report. Mr. Hudson began by saying youth baseball and softball seasons are set to resume tonight, weather permitting, and that the free bluegrass music at Bee Spring Park is tonight as well. Hudson also announced that a meeting of Edmonson County's Special Olympics team is scheduled for tonight. Currently, the team is comprised of 12 athletes. In closing, Mr. Hudson said the vandalism issues seem to have lessened, and that maintenance efforts continue to go well at all parks.

XIV. CORONER REPORT

County Coroner Brentley Esters was not present to provide a report.

XV. COMMITTEE REPORTS

J. Corrisoft Program - Pertaining to Prisoner Incarceration

County Attorney Greg Vincent told the Court that he had seen a presentation on the Corrisoft Program for prisoner incarceration. The program allows the prisoner to be incarcerated at home. The program uses smart phones to track the prisoners by satellite and also calls the phone randomly to check the prisoner's location. The prisoner's voice is recorded before the program begins to assure the prisoner is the person answering the calls. The cost of the program is \$10 per day and if an ankle bracelet is also used there will be an additional \$4 per day charge. If the phone is lost, the county is responsible for the cost of the phone. It was suggested for the prisoner to pay a deposit for the phone before he/she is allowed to participate. County Attorney Vincent stated that most of the people who are incarcerated have no money. Judge Reed felt they should be able to pay something. This program will save the county \$15 per pay on incarceration costs. This will be really helpful since some cases have a year to wait to come to trial. County Attorney Vincent stated that the County Attorneys and Commonwealth Attorneys recommend the use of this program. The company has agreed to give the county 30 days free to test the program.

- 1. The road was not constructed for large trucks.
- 2. Hwy. 259 not conducive to increased traffic
- 3. Kyrock Elementary School children's safety is an issue
- 4. Traveling Hwy 259 to get to the interstate will tear up the roads and the taxpayers will have to pay for the repairs.
- 5. He stated semi trucks gross 80,000 lbs which will do a lot of damage.
- 6. The bad smell associated with the Distillery will have an environmental impact.
- 7. With such a major issue, people of Edmonson County need to do an extended study.

County Attorney Greg Vincent stated he checked the law and Edmonson County Fiscal Court can't do anything about the Distillery. Since Edmonson County is dry, the matter goes straight to the state. Alcohol Beverage Control will decide on the Distiller's license for the project. He stated that Distiller's license is for alcoholic beverages only. Distilled water does not require a license. He stated that under the statutes there is an application fee, bond fee and the owners will be screened to be sure they are not felons. If they meet the guidelines, the Distillery will be subject to approval. The only impact Edmonson County citizens can have on the process is to write letters and express their objection to the Distillery. Sometimes this will red flag an application and cause further consideration on granting a license. Jonathan and Sherry Williams asked Bill Canty the cost of publishing a ½ page article in the Edmonson News opposing the Distillery.

Mr. Leo Stevenson questioned the redistricting of the county. County Attorney Greg Vincent stated that the redistricting that was passed is in effect now and will remain in effect unless the Judicial Judge over rules the Fiscal Court.
