Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:110, Section 2(2)(b), the Martin County Solar Project will be capable of generating approximately 200 MW of electricity from a solar array covering a total of approximately 1,500 acres. The project will connect to the Inez substation that is owned by American Electric Power (AEP) and located on the proposed site.

3. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:110, Section 2(2)(c), the Martin County Solar Project is located in

Martin County, KY, near Pilgrim, Kentucky. The street address for the Martin County
