1.0 DESKTOP CULTURAL RESOURCES ASSESSMENT

Stantec Consulting Services has prepared this Cultural Resources Assessment as part of the Martin County Solar Project for Martin County Solar, LLC. The purpose of this assessment is to identify cultural resources of significance or other areas of concern that should be considered during project development.

1.1 **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Martin County Solar is proposing to develop a 100 – 150-megawatt photovoltaic (PV) solar project. The study area under review includes two polygons with a total project area of approximately 1053.34 acres in Martin County, Kentucky (**Figure 1**) in the Kermit United Stated Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5-minute topographic quadrangle.

1.2 RECORDS REVIEW

A desktop review of agency databases and secondary sources was conducted to document known resources. Resources utilized for the review included, but are not limited to::

- Cultural and historical resources
 - National Register of Historic Places (NRHP)
 - Kentucky Heritage Council (KHC), which serves as the Kentucky State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)
- Archaeological resources
 - Office of the State Archaeologist (OSA)
- Historical aerial and topographic imagery
 - o United States Geological Survey (USGS) National Map
 - Google Earth Pro Maps
 - USGS Historical Topographic Map Explorer (<u>USGS Historical Topographic Map Explorer</u> (arcgis.com))

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Table 1 below provides a summary of the features that were identified within the study area. Project location and aerial features are identified in **Figure 1**. This information provides an overview of resources of significance within the study area as well as other issues of potential concern. More detailed cultural or archaeological studies may be required as individual actions are further developed in accordance with the SHPO.

There is another cemetery, Cemetery-04, on Figure 1 known as Moses Stepp Cemetery located directly adjacent to the project area on KY-1714, near the southeast border of the study area. Historical Aerial and Topographic Imagery	Based on a review of historical aerial imagery, as available through Google Earth 2020, portions of the study area have been historically mined. 
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
