

# Gateway COVID case totals drop but remain high

VACCINATION RATES SLOWLY INCREASING

New COVID-19 cases in the Gateway Health District saw a significant drop over the past 7-day period but remain high compared with case numbers just a month ago.

The Gateway District Health Department reported a total of 99 new cases in the 5-county region during the period April 21-27, 2021. This total is down by 51 cases from the previous period, April 14-20, which represented the highest spike in cases since late January.

COVID-19 vaccination numbers continue to rise in the Gateway District counties as well.

According to data from the Centers for Disease Control, updated on Monday:

\* 3518 people in Bath County were fully vaccinated, representing 28.1 percent of the population; 32.8 percent of people over 18 were fully vaccinated, and 71.6 percent of people over 65.

\* 1497 people in Elliott

County, 19.9 percent, were fully vaccinated; 24 percent over age 18 were vaccinated, and 34 percent over age 65

\* 1578 people in Menifee County, 24.3 percent, were vaccinated; 29.7 percent over age 18, and 50.8 percent over age 65

\* 3982 people in Morgan County were vaccinated, 29.9 percent; 36.3 percent over age 18, and 52.5 percent over age 65

\* 7096 people Rowan

County have been vaccinated, 29 percent; 36 percent of people over age 18, and 72.1 percent over age 65.

Across the state of Kentucky, just over 1.7 million have been vaccinated, and in the United States, 231 million people.
