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

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic state of emergency and the continuing need to maintain social distancing, taxpayer conferences with the PVA may be held remotely. Conferences may be held via videoconference such as zoom, where available held via videoconference such as zoom, where available, or by telephone by appointment; or you may exchange correspondence requesting a conference with the PVA via email or fax. Written documentation supporting your opinion of value will continue to be required. However, you will be instructed on the best method to submit your documentation after contacting our office regarding your request to have a conference. Any taxpayer still aggrieved by an assessment on real property, after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may

The appeal must be filed with the county clerk's office no later than one work day following the conclusion of the inspection period (May 18th). Please contact the county clerk's office to receive instructions on the method the office is using to accept appeals this year and to obtain a form that can be used to file your appeal.

Any taxpayer failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Tax

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the property valuation administrator.

(1) He must list under protest (for certification) what he believes to be the fair cash value of his property.

(2) He must file a written protest directly with the Department of Revenue, Office of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.

(3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131,110. (4) The final decision of the Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.
