



Justice Department opens police probe

The Justice Department is opening a sweeping probe into policing in Louisville, Kentucky, over the March 2020 death of Breonna Taylor, who was shot to death by police during a raid at her home, Attorney General Merrick Garland announced Monday.

It's the second such probe into a law enforcement agency by the Biden administration in a week: Garland also announced an investigation into the tactics of the police in Minneapolis following the death of George Floyd.

The attorney general has said there is not yet equal justice under the law and promised to bring a critical eye to racism and legal issues when he took the job. Few such investigations were opened during the Trump administration.

The 26-year-old Taylor, an emergency medical technician who had been studying to become a nurse, was roused from her bed by police who came through the door using a battering ram after midnight.

Her boyfriend, Kenneth Walker, fired once hitting a policeman. A no-knock warrant was approved as part of a narcotics investigation. No drugs were found at her home.

investigation The announced Monday is into the Louisville-Jefferson **County Metro Government** and the Louisville Metro Police Department. It is known as a "pattern or practice" -- examining whether there is a pattern or practice of unconstitutional or unlawful policing--and will be a more sweeping review of the entire police department.

"I can't wait for the world to see Louisville Police Department for what it really is," Taylor's mother, Tamika Palmer, tweeted after the announcement.

Sam Aguiar, an attor ney for Breonna Taylor's family, also posted a celebratory message on social media shortly after the announcement. Aguiar and other attorneys nego tiated a \$12 million settlement in September with the city of Louisville over Taylor's death.

Louisville city leaders said they supported the broad probe and the city's mayor called it a "really exciting, positive thing."

"I think it's a good thing," said Louisville Chief Erika Shields. "I think that it's necessary because police reform quite honestly is needed in near every agency across the country.





Any taxpayer still aggrieved by an assessment on real property, after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may appeal to the county board of assessment appeals.

The appeal must be filed with the county clerk's office no later than one work day following the conclusion of the inspection period. Please contact the county clerk's office to receive instructions on the method the office is using to accept appeals this year and to obtain a form that can be used to file your appeal.

Any taxpayer failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the property valuation administrator.

(1) He must list under protest (for certification) what he believes to be the fair cash value of his property.

(2) He must file a written protest directly with the Department of Revenue, Office of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
(3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.
(4) The final decision of the Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

a state level audit and were approved for a reimbursement by the state. Morris will distribute \$8142 to one tax payer and will make \$23,011 in refunds to other taxpayers. In total the district will refund \$31,154.

The local district will also send an invoice for \$23,866.92 to the county for transporting private school students. That number is down due to the remote and virtual instruction used during the pandemic.

Board members also heard a presentation related to "Teaching and Learning During the Pandemic" by Michelle Hall. The research project was part of Hall's requirements for her superintendent certification. Hall told the board what they can expect to happen with the graduation rate, learning loss and the social and emotional impact of students learning from home over the past year. She also reported on ways the district will help offset issues students face during the pandemic. IN part the local district will use ESSER funding to provide meals for children, protective gear, professional development for teachers and enrichment activities to help students rebuild their learning skills. Union County has received \$1.7 million dollars to use over the next three years to help with

learning intervention, extra learning sessions and other opportunities for students. This summer the district will offer two separate session of enrichment activities to help rebuild social and academic skills of students. According to Hall's report, the most significant academic losses for students occur in the area of mathematics. Locally, teachers will focus not just on remediation but on providing challenging work for students as well.

Following Hall's presentation, the board turned to a brief discussion concerning SB 128-the redo bill that will allow students to repeat last year's curriculum. Legislators left it up to local districts to determine if students will be allowed to repeat a year; however, it is an "all of no one" bill. When the board reviews the application for a student to repeat a grade, they must approve all applications or none of them. County education leaders urge parents and students to log on to the district website and review all the material related to repeating a grade so they know both the positives and negatives of their decision to make application. Application for "re-do" are due this week with the board making a decision in May whether or not they will approve the applications.
