



Veterans Memorial may locate at the Lake Linville Park

By: Mike French Editor A majority of the regular monthly meeting of the Mount Vernon City Council last week focused on the possibility of a Veterans Memorial to be located at the Lake

Linville Park.
The idea had been discussed several times in the past but when local VFW representatives approached the city about a memorial, city officials began discussing a space at a local park. "A Veterans Memorial would beef up our city's image, espe-cially to visitors. The

Lake Park would be a very visible location for us to show our respect and admiration for our veterans," said Mayor Mike Bryant. "Such a memorial could also provide a location for special events and could even bring more visitors to our

city."

Much discussion followed concerning logis-tics and who pays for what and who would be responsible for mainte nance or possible liabili-ties, but the idea is in the beginning stages and such details are "not yet set in stone," according to

City Consultant Josh Bray.
All members ex-

forward with the idea, especially councilman Clifford Mullins who said. "I think the more we can do to bring people to the Lake Linville Park,

the better. According to Bray, the VFW is requesting assis-tance from the city in creating the memorial but mainly through labor. Frank Baker, head of the City Maintenance Department, said VIW of ficials are looking for specific help at this time. I'm not sure of every detail yet but right now they are just needing our help with excavation and building the forms to pour the concrete. They would pay for the con-crete and the materials but since we have the equipment, they would like the city to help with everything getting

Mayor Bryant said the council could discuss possible financial involvement later but he would like to see the city help the VFW get the

area prepared.
The memorial would he located next to a cur-rent shelter next to the existing parking lot at the park, according to a ren-dering presented to the

Several members of the council asked Bray what the next step should be to begin the process. "We will have to work out details and decide the city's level of involve-ment," he said. "But right now I think all we need to know is that the coun cil is in agreement with moving ahead with the project and helping them get this together before we begin writing con-tracts or resolutions."

Councilmembers expressed their desire to move forward and dis-cuss possible financial involvement at a later

Bray said he hopes to have a draft resolution that councilmembers can adjust according to their desired level of involve-ment. "Bobby (Amburgy, City Attorney) would have to work out a prop-erty long-term lease and details of the resolution," said Bray. "We can then present that to the coun-cil and work with the VFW and have a nice

memorial honoring our veterans in the end." In other action, the council approved the March financial state ments and heard reports from each department

Before Police Chief Brian Carter gave his re-port for March, Mayor Bryant commented. want to say that I have the utmost respect for our police department and what they do. We need you all," he said to Carter. "We have a wonderful police department and we are blessed in Mount Vernon to have the officyou for what you do Chief."

Carter then told the council his department answered 514 calls for service and worked 18 non injury and nine in jury accidents.
