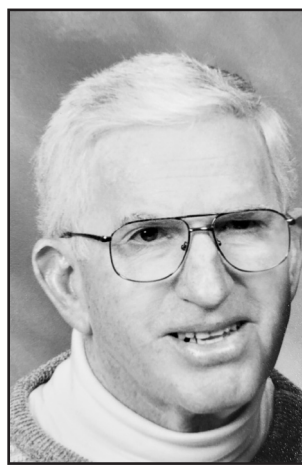

Avoid Making These Common Financial Aid Mistakes

"Even if you don't believe you'll qualify for financial aid, you should still file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, commonly known as the FAFSA, each school year," Gov.

Andy Beshear said. "You may be surprised to discover that you are eligible for some federal and state student aid. Plus, some schools may require the FAFSA for students to be considered for merit-based scholarships."

Another common mistake is waiting until the last minute to apply for financial aid. Some programs have deadlines, while others have limited funds.

Colleges send each student who has applied for student aid a

financial aid package. Students and their families should examine these carefully, comparing offers from schools to see which is the best deal. Of course, cost is only a part of the higher-education decision. Students should also consider other factors, such as whether a school offers the academic program they want to pursue or if it meets other expectations they may have.

KHEAA is the state agency that administers Kentucky's stu-

dent financial aid programs, including the Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES). Its sister agency, the Kentucky Higher Education Student Loan Corporation (KHESLC), offers low-cost Advantage Loans to help students and parents pay for college or refinance student loans. What Does The Bible Say?

The Sermon on the Mount: The Golden Rule (Matthew 7:12)

The majority of problems in the world would be resolved by following the Golden Rule. Jesus says, "Therefore, whatever you want men to do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets." I don't want to focus on the practicality of his statement. Obviously, we should treat people how we want to be treated and the world would become a much better place. Instead, I want to focus on the context.

First, Jesus starts his sentence with "therefore." This means that whatever he's about to say is linked to what

he just said. In this case, he was talking about God providing for them. This is profound for two reasons. One, God is good and provides for his people. We don't want a God who doesn't, so in turn we help others. The second, bigger thing, that is so critical here is his audience was mostly common people. The Romans were constantly mistreating the Jews (some of which was addressed earlier; see Matthew 5:38ff), and it would have been very difficult for a Jew to treat a Roman how they wanted to be treated. Jesus truly challenged them with something that was life-altering.

Secondly, Jesus states, "...this is the Law and the Prophets." This is a remarkably

bold statement. The audience was mostly common, but there would have been Pharisees and other Jewish leaders. Jesus reminds them that they are not the Law nor prophets, and neither do their actions reflect such. Further, Jesus stripped that authority by the Jews that PEOPLE are not the

authority of God. Let us treat each other well and follow God, and God only.

Bills deficiencies exposed yet again

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. — Whether it was the gusting wind or New England's unrelenting running attack, the Buffalo Bills' two biggest deficiencies this season were exposed yet again on Monday night.

An inability to effectively run the ball or stop the run, combined with a string of self-inflicted errors led to a 14-10 loss to the Patriots that may have cost Buffalo its best chance at repeating as AFC East champs — and perhaps put the Bills in jeopardy of missing the playoffs altogether.

In outgaining Buffalo 222-99 on the ground, the Patriots (9-4) moved two wins ahead of the Bills (7-5) in the division and are now the No. 1 seed in the conference.

"We are what our record says we are," Bills coach Sean McDermott said. "We've been inconsistent, and again, had opportunities to win the game."

It wasn't just that the Patriots beat the Bills, but the manner in which they did it. In the face of 40 mph wind gusts, New England rookie quarterback Mac Jones attempted

only three passes — completing two for 19 yards — as the Patriots ran up and down the field and right through the Bills.

Damien Harris scored on a 64-yard scamper up the middle on New England's ninth play from scrimmage and racked up a season-best 111 yards rushing before being limited by a hamstring injury.

"Not good enough," McDermott said. "We've got to be able to run the football, we've got to be able to stop the run. Those things don't change."

Something's going to have to change for the Bills, and soon.

Buffalo is 3-4 in its past seven and hasn't won consecutive games since capping a 4-0 run with a 38-20 win over Kansas City on Oct. 10 — the only team currently with a winning record the Bills have defeated this year.

And Buffalo's run defense continues springing leaks after allowing 264 yards and four touchdowns in a 41-15 loss to Indianapolis two weeks ago.

"Do I think that's an issue for this team, for this defense? No, I do not, and I feel like

we can always do better," safety Micah Hyde said. "We can always do better."

Hyde and fellow safety Jordan Poyer bristled at the notion that this loss was embarrassing.

"What are you doing, bro? What kind of question is that?" Poyer said. "I think we gave up ... 14 points? 14-10, was that the final score? We made stops when we had to, they had one big run. They've got good backs. They kept coming back to a couple of runs. I mean, I don't know how you want us to answer that question."

"That's funny," Hyde added. "We'll remember that. I'll remember that."

It wasn't just the defense that failed Buffalo against New England. The Bills' offense scored only 10 points on four trips inside the red zone. Tyler Bass missed a 33-yard field goal attempt into the wind midway through the fourth quarter, and Buffalo's final drive ended on fourth-and-14 from the New England 18 with Myles Bryant batting down Josh Allen's pass at the goal line.

Hutchinson is one of the nation's best pass rushers with 14 sacks.

The senior led No. 2 Michigan to its first playoff appearance as Big Ten champions and helped end an eight-game losing streak to rival Ohio State.

Pickett returned to Pitt for a fifth season in 2021, taking advantage of the NCAA's eligibility give-back for playing through the pandemic in 2020, and had a record-breaking year. Pickett passed for 4,319 yards with 42 touchdowns to eclipse school marks and led the 13th-ranked Panthers to their first Atlantic Coast Conference title.

The last Pitt player to be a Heisman finalist was receiver Larry Fitzgerald in 2003.

Stroud completed 71% of his passes for 3,862 yards, 38 touchdowns and five interceptions as the seventh-ranked Buckeyes finished 10-2 in his first season as a starter.

He is the third straight Ohio State starting quarterback to be a Heisman finalist, joining Justin Fields (2019) and Dwayne Haskins (2018).

14 bye a week before closing out with a visit to Indianapolis followed by a rematch with the Bills at Gillette Stadium on Dec. 26, another home game against the upstart Jacksonville Jaguars and a road game at resurgent Miami.

They have the smoothest path to the lone bye that goes to the AFC's top playoff seed and home

field throughout the playoffs, something they've usually parlayed into Super Bowl appearances.

Belichick is the only person on the planet who owns more than Brady's seven Super Bowl rings.

They won six together in Foxborough and Belichick won two as Bill Parcell's right-hand man with the New York Giants before

that, giving him eight titles to go with four runner-up finishes.

Although the NFC features Brady's Bucs, Prescott's Cowboys, Aaron Rodgers' Packers, Kyler Murray's Cardinals and Matthew Stafford's Rams, would anyone be surprised if Belichick won his ninth overall ring a year after Brady won his seventh?


