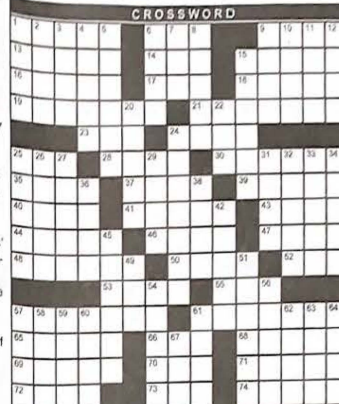

million of federal money to expand access to broadband connectivity. However, the bills stipulate that no more than \$50 million can be spent before April of next year to make sure efforts are deliberate, effective and will go to the areas that need it most. This initial \$50 million will get the ball rolling. Legislators will return next January to provide ample opportunity to assess the efforts made between now and then to determine the best path forward. The funding will be targeted to utilize existing infrastructure and the experienced workforce through electric co-ops. In reality, the allocated funds will equate to \$500 million because the \$250 million will be used as matching funds for the projects.

Other bills passed in both the House and Senate include:

House Bill 95 aims to help Kentuckians struggling with diabetes by capping the cost of out-of-pocket insulin at \$30 for a 30-day supply. It applies to state-regulated, comprehensive private health insurance plans and the Kentucky employee health plan. It does not apply to Medicare, Medicaid, or self-funded health plans.

For too long, the high cost of insulin has caused patients to ration their supply, resulting in a loss of life. Others have had to make desperate financial decisions to maintain their access to their insulin. Kentucky ranks 8th in

the nation in diabetes prevalence and is the 5th highest state in diabetes-related deaths. Between 2009 and 2018, the percentage of Kentuckians diagnosed with diabetes doubled. Diabetes can be associated with heart failure, stroke, blindness, and more.

Senate Bill 80 would strengthen the police decertification process in Kentucky by expanding the number of acts considered professional wrongdoing. A second provision would set up a system for an officer's automatic decertification under certain circumstances. A final provision would prevent an officer from skirting decertification by resigning or retiring before an internal investigation is complete.

House Joint Resolution 77 extends certain COVID-19 regulations an additional 60 days. This joint resolution, which can carry the force of law, will be effective only if the court ultimately rules in favor of the legislature on pending litigation. The Governor is challenging House Bill 1 and Senate Bills 1 and 2. Those three bills, if upheld, provide the legislative seat at the table as life-altering executive decisions are made. It is worth noting that Kentucky is the exception to executive authority rule during a state of emergency. The bills being challenged by the Governor would merely bring Kentucky more in line with other states in regards to oversight of executive

authority during times like these.

House Bill 273 named the Bailey Holt-Preston Cape Victims Privacy Act. The bill would exclude from the open records act photographs or videos that depict a person's death, killing, rape, sexual assault or abuse. It is named in honor of Bailey Nicole Holt and Preston Ryan Cope, who were killed in the 2018 Marshall County High School shooting at the age of 15.

House Bill 497 would help convicts transition out of prison get jobs, health care, state IDs and access to social services such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP. It would also create a "certificate of employability" to help former inmates find jobs for which they are trained.

Senate Bill 8 would expand Kentuckians' ability to opt out of mandatory vaccinations. It would do this by providing exemptions only to mandatory immunization requirements during an epidemic based on religious grounds or conscientiously held beliefs. The Senate voted 33-1 to carry with a House amendment.

Looking ahead, the General Assembly will return on March 29 and March 30 for the final two days of the session and sine die adjournment. That is when lawmakers will be able to act on any votes issued during the recess. Additional bills could also be passed, but they would not be veto-proof.

clear message that Kentuckians should have access to life-saving medication. It will save countless Kentucky lives once it becomes law and will clear the way for a healthier Kentucky.

HB 472: Another piece of legislation that I am particularly proud of is HB 472. This measure would extend the statute of limitations for misdemeanor sex offenses in criminal and civil cases, allowing more time for victims to report the crime. Multiple studies show that most children who experience sexual abuse do not disclose it, or significantly delay reporting it. Because of the existing statute of limitations on these crimes, this often leaves many adult victims of childhood sexual abuse without recourse. HB 472 will extend the criminal statute of limitations for misdemeanor sex offenses

es against minors from five to ten years, which gives the victims more time to seek justice for their crimes.

HB 254: Another measure aimed at protecting the innocent. It raises the penalty for possessing, viewing or distributing matter portraying a sexual performance by a minor under the age of 12 years to a class C felony. Under the provisions of HB 254, offenders will be charged with a class C felony for the first offense, and a class B felony for each subsequent offense. Our law enforcement community works tirelessly to identify, arrest, and prosecute those who take advantage of our most vulnerable. HB 254 gives them greater tools in their work to keep these severely troubled people off the streets.

Though we passed quite a lot of meaningful legislation, we still have work to do on the last two days. We will

reconcile on March 29 and 30 to consider any overrides of Executive branch vetoes and also look at other pieces of legislation like the transportation budget; a liability reform bill from the Senate that mirrors language from our own House version passed in the first week of session, and HB 321 which requires the Department of Revenue to adhere to an extension of the 2020 federal income tax return filing or payment for Kentucky income tax purposes.

SIGNS: Today and Saturday ruled by Virgo

Continued from B1

A look at the signs finds a series of days ruled by the flowering signs continuing. Today and Saturday are ruled by Virgo (the bowls) then Sunday and Monday by Libra (the reins). These are "bloom days" and gardening activities should be limited to planting flowers and not vegetables unless you're planting the latter for blossoms — which likely you are not!

Later in the season I'll reprise a story or two from gardeners who planted veggies on days ruled by flowering signs. They were not happy when harvest time came around.

March concludes with the dark moon (changing on Sunday) in force for below-ground producers and the very fertile sign Scorpio/the secrets in force on the 30th and 31st after the flowering signs are over. Look at the list elsewhere here, see what produces what you eat underground, and plant some veggies like potatoes, onions, radishes, beets — there are a lot.

We flip the calendar into April to find a stretch of so-so signs all ruled by the dark moon. I wish I had a name for them other than "so-so" because they are second only to the very fertile signs (Scorpio, Pisces, Taurus, and Cancer) for planting.

In order they are Sagittarius/ribs, Capricorn/knees and Aquarius/legs. They are progressing down the body "beyond anything that functions" and when we add the three days ruled by the very fertile sign Pisces/feet on April 7-9, we have a great stretch for planting — and for making changes since the moon is in the dark phase.

Changes might include stopping smoking, starting a diet or exercise program, scheduling elective surgery,

weaning small animals or children — anything that requires a change. According to the phases and signs, April 1-9 will be perfect days to get underway.

A testimony: Our son stopped smoking a few years back, replacing the craving for a cigarette with nicotine gum. He said he wanted to get off that and during the last change period, which was March 4-12, he just had a "feeling" on March 10 to give it a try.

The day was ruled by Aquarius (the legs) with the dark moon ruling — perfect for changes.

Since then, he's gone from several pieces of the gum a day — sometimes two at a time — down to one piece or a half of a piece. He believes the "change time" helped. I, of course, do too!

EARLY GARDENS

Here's what you can plant now according to the chart found in "Home Gardening in Kentucky," published by the University of Kentucky's College of Agriculture for the Cooperative Extension Service and available at your local office.

These plants can safely withstand frost and light freezes and they love the ground temperature being cool. When it gets hot they'll "boil" and quit producing. It's safe now to plant all veggies on the list. We'll see a lot of them back for our fall gardens.

Now: peas, snow peas, spinach, collards, onion sets, radishes, rhubarb crowns, rutabaga, turnips, asparagus crowns, Irish potatoes, beets, carrots, chard, eggplant plants, kale, kohlrabi, onion seed, parsley, parsnips, cabbage, leaf lettuce, Bibb lettuce plants, head lettuce plants and onion plants.

Woodford Reserve Distillery to expand facilities

Brown-Forman Corporation announces the planned expansion of the Woodford Reserve Distillery to meet the growing demand for Woodford Reserve, the world's top-selling superpremium American whiskey. The expansion will double its production capacity, including adding three new iconic copper pot stills.

Woodford Reserve is celebrating its 25th anniversary throughout 2021, and the expansion of the distillery allows us to look to the next 25 years," Master Distiller Chris Morris said.

Woodford Reserve Distillery is a national landmark where distilling first began in 1812. The day's announcement builds on that legacy.

In addition to the three new pot stills, the expansion includes a new building that will house the boiler plant, additional fermentation tanks, a grain unloading area, a barrel unloading area, and a conference and training center for employees.

Construction will begin this spring and is expected to be completed in summer 2022. The site, located at McCracken Pike in Woodford County, will be fully operational throughout this period.

Brown-Forman opened the Woodford Reserve Distillery and introduced Woodford Reserve Kentucky Bourbon in 1996. Woodford Reserve Distillery is a national historic landmark where distilling first began in 1812. The expansion plans were reviewed by the Kentucky Heritage Council, the state's historic preservation office.

longer-term care needed," Olsson said. One has a open wound, another a cleft palate and few have skin problems, she said.

Stimulus Check - Okay!

You may have gotten or soon will be receiving a stimulus check that is the result of the American Rescue Plan Act. These \$1,400 payments are meant to help offset the financial hardships for individuals and families caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Everybody likes to get money, but what we do with our money is important. You may have basic needs that the stimulus check will help cover. Carefully consider what to do with this money before spending it. Here are some ideas to help you get the most from your stimulus check.

1. Take care of the basics: If you have lost your job or have been laid off as a result of COVID-19, you may be struggling to take care of your basic needs, such as food, medicine and utilities. This money is intended to help you do that. If you are struggling, spend it on those items.
2. Get up to date on your bills: If you have fallen behind on your debts, you can use the stimulus as a chance to get caught up on those payments. Make sure you prioritize your debts in order of the most urgent payments.
3. Build an emergency fund: If you are able to meet all of your debt obligations and provide for your family's basic needs, consider saving the money in an emergency fund. Just because you do not need the money right now does not mean that you will never need it in the future. Conservation Stewardship Program Applications Being Accepted

The next deadline for Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) applications to be considered for funding from NRCS Kentucky this year is April 23, 2021. Through CSP, USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) helps farmers, ranchers and forest landowners earn payments for expanding conservation activities while maintaining agricultural production on their land. CSP also encourages adoption of new technologies and management techniques.

"CSP continues to be a very effective tool for private landowners working to achieve soil conservation and management goals," said Greg Stone, NRCS state conservationist in Kentucky. "It is the largest conservation program in the United States with more than

70 million acres of productive agricultural and forest land enrolled. While applications are accepted throughout the year, interested producers should submit applications to their local NRCS office by the deadline to ensure their applications are considered for 2021 funding.

About the Program

CSP is offered in Kentucky through continuous signups. The program provides many benefits including increased crop yields, decreased inputs, wildlife habitat improvements and increased resilience to weather extremes. CSP is for working lands including cropland, pastureland, rangeland, nonindustrial private forest land and agricultural land under the jurisdiction of a tribe.

For additional information about CSP, contact your local service center. USDA Service Centers are open for business by phone appointment only and field work will continue with appropriate social distancing. While program delivery staff will continue to come into the office, they will be working with producers by phone, and using online tools whenever possible. All Service Center visitors wishing to conduct business with NRCS, Farm Service Agency, or any other Service Center agency are required to call their Service Center to schedule a phone appointment. 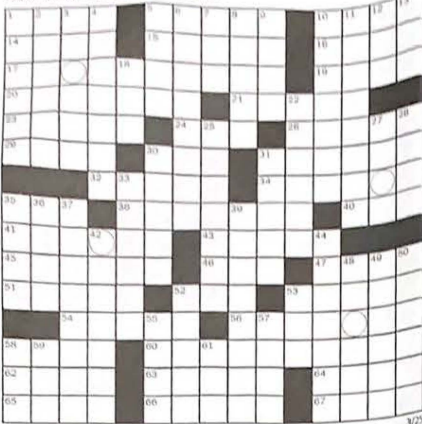

Martha Layne Collins Featured In This Week's Women's History

The month of March has been officially designated as Women's History Month. There were countless females who stood out among the crowd and excelled, who achieved above and beyond their expectations.

Here is one such lady, Martha Layne Hall Collins. She was elected as Kentucky's first woman governor. She was born in Bagdad, Kentucky in 1918. When she was 6, her parents relocated to Shelbyville, Ky. Her parents were involved in local politics, and the young Martha often took part in stuffing envelopes, answering the phone and distributing pamphlets, etc.

This was the making of what would spark an interest in politics. She observed how dedicated her parents were to what they were doing and believed that she, too, could make a change in people's lives.

After her formal education, she enrolled in Anderson College in St. Charles, Missouri. From here she transferred to the University of Kentucky at U.K., she earned her Bachelor of Science degree in economics. Although this was the first step her future husband Billy Collins. The couple had two children.

This lady won many, many hats and performed each one equally as well. She was a school teacher, secretary of the state democratic party, clerk of the Kentucky Court of Appeals, and the first to hold office of the Clerk of the Supreme Court. In addition to all that, she served as Lieutenant Governor and chaired all 120 counties in Kentucky. Her reputation was well known and regarded. She was even considered as a running mate to Walter Mondale as Vice President of the U.S.

One of her most significant accomplishments came in 1985 when she traveled to China which was a \$100 million grant in Chicago. She persuaded Toyota to locate a \$500 million plant in the town, Ky. This business deal provided jobs for the town, making it one of the best places to live.

Ms. Collins has a prolific long-lasting legacy in politics of anyone past and present, and for any state, not just Kentucky in the U.S., was the first female Governor of Kentucky and as of date, the only woman who has held the position in the state of Kentucky.

Reorganization Of Democratic Party Begins With Virtual Convention

In the reorganization that takes place in the Democratic Party every four years, each precinct in Bourbon County elects one male, one female and one youth (13 & under) from among its registered Democrats to be its precinct committee. The reorganization from 2020 was rescheduled because of COVID restrictions, but it will begin this year with a virtual Precinct Convention on April 10 at 10 a.m. To attend the Convention, register at <https://www.mobillize.us/kydem/even370077> by 8 PM April 12. You will be given a link to the meeting.

All events will take place at Statewide Online Zoom Meetings from the nominating period starting March 15 and going through to the state convention on June 26. All meetings will be held online and can be accessed by computer, tablet, or phone. Anyone registered as a Democrat as of April 8, 2021, may be nominated as a precinct committee member. Yes, you may nominate yourself - in fact, most people DO self nominate.

According to Kenny Fugle, Deputy Political Director for the Kentucky Democratic Party, "Our response to people signing up for Precinct participation, either as a nominator for a Committee position or just to vote in the Precinct elections has been beyond our expectations."

In past cycles, the nominating and electing of precinct committee members has taken place on a single day. This year nominations will take place from March 15 through April 12. To nominate your self or someone else in YOUR precinct, visit <https://kydemocrats.org/2021/precinct/> or call the Reorganization Hotline at 833-468-6835. NOTE: The person nominated must have voted for the Democratic candidate in the 2020 general election. Be sure the person is willing to be nominated.

Voting for Precinct Committee members will take place - again, ONLINE - from April 15 to 17 and results will be tabulated by the Kentucky Democratic Party and posted by April 21. One of the three will be elected Precinct Chair between April 23-26.

There are 16 precincts in Paris and Bourbon County: Paris #1 through #7, Hatchison #1,2 & 3, Centerville, Ruckless Mill, Millersburg, Flat Rock (that's the Little Rock area), North Middletown, and Clantonville. If each precinct elects its three committee members, that is 48 people that will be responsible for nominating and electing the Executive Committee of Bourbon County Democrats. ONLY the precinct committee members may vote for the Executive Committee, but any Bourbon County Democrat may be nominated to serve on the Executive Committee, which manages the activities of the party for the next four years.

Bourbon County Democrats discovered the significance of the Precinct Committees in 2007 when the members of the Precinct Committees were the only persons allowed to vote on three special election Democratic nominees: for Judge, Circuit Court Clerk, and State Representative for the 12th district.

Precincts were once fairly cohesive neighborhoods and the residents mostly knew one another - but today, precinct lines include urban, rural, and suburban voters whose paths may never cross. So it's harder to think of yourself as part of a precinct.
