Response: There have been no significant changes in the distribution of South Eastern's customer usage in many years. Therefore, an across-the-board increase is considered to be the most equitable means of passing along increased costs to the association's customers. Applying a uniform percentage increase to all customer classes lessens the likelihood that the public will perceive that any customer class is being unfairly favored or disfavored. No alternative methods were considered.

Response: This is the total amount for leak adjustments in the test year. The usage associated with all other adjustments (e.g., misread meters, meter changes, etc.) is corrected in the billing system when the adjustment is made and is, therefore, already included in the data provided from the system for the Billing Analysis. The amount of \$83,299 is from a test year adjustment report (see file: Item 6d - Adjustments).

Response: The billing adjustment amount from the Current BA is increased by the overall rate increase percentage ($\$83,299 \times 1.0554 = \$87,840$).

Response: Each commissioner does not have a related party interest. The only related party transactions are those with Reed Insurance as reported in the revised disclosure statements. The Association interpreted the language in the Disclosure Statement to mean that each Commissioner is attesting to the transactions of the <u>utility as a whole</u>, not just those related to themselves individually. This appears to be indicated in the first sentence of the disclosure and the first check box below the table of related parties.

b. Provide a detailed explanation of how decisions are made when all commissioners refrain from voting on areas where they have a party interest.

Response: Southeastern Water Association's Board of Directors consists of eight members: President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer and 5 board members. In recent years if an elected member has an interest in a topic to be voted on; they announce to the other board members the reason they are affiliated with the topic being discussed, they also announce that they will be refraining from any discussion on said topic and they refrain from voting. There have been no situations as described in Item 9b above.
