

4. The process the utility used to advertise rate assistance available to customers were sharing the community action programs flyer on the Martin County Water and Sanitation's Facebook page. Also, the customer service clerks contacted customers in arrears, explaining the program to them. Clerks even filled out customers information and turned into cap for those customers. Any customer that called or came into the billing office was informed to contact the community action program if they were in arrears and needed assistance.

RESPONSE 5.

5. The following is the amount of money received from federal COVID relief money and the sources.

-Cares 2020-2021, 170 Customers, \$21,454.59 total in funds.

-Healthy at Home Subsidy, 151 Customers, \$75,500.00 total in funds.

-Healthy at Home Crisis, 89 Customers, \$22,419.16 total in funds.

-Healthy at Home DWWW, 61 Customers, \$17,451.38 total in funds.

RESPONSE 6.

6. Alliance staff and the district, are working with a grant administrator and Fishbeck Engineering to obtain an already approved FEMA mitigation grant to provide 3 new fixed generators for pump stations, and 2 new portable generators that we can use at various pump stations throughout the system. The preliminary engineering has been completed and the grant process has started.

RESPONSE 7.

7. Currently all pump stations are in operation.

RESPONSE 8.

8. Staff are working on plans to add redundancy to all pump stations through a couple of different routes. First through repairing current pumps or motors that are out of service. Second by identifying critical areas and putting them on a master plan for replacement through grant funding. Thirdly by working with engineering firms to generate plans for upgrades of booster stations and seeking funding for these projects. Finally, by working towards financial stability to ensure the district has the ability to fund small capital projects on their own accord.
