ATTORNEY GENERAL’S MOTION TO INTERVENE

Comes now the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, through his Office of Rate Intervention, and moves the Commission to grant him intervention in the instant proceeding. KRS 367.150(8) provides the Attorney General the power and duty to appear before regulatory bodies of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and to be made a real party in interest in order to represent and be heard on behalf of consumers’ interests, “whenever deemed necessary and advisable . . . by the Attorney General.” The Attorney General has determined that it is in the consumers’ interest for him to be made a real party in interest in this matter, and hereby moves the Kentucky Public Service Commission to grant him full intervenor status in this action.

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 8(9), the Attorney General provides notice that in the event the Commission grants his Motion to Intervene, he waives any right to service of Commission orders via U.S. Mail; and certifies that: (a) the Office of the Attorney General and its agents are capable of receiving electronic transmissions; and (b) the electronic email addresses to which all electronic notices and messages related to the above-styled proceeding should be served are those provided in the below signature line.
