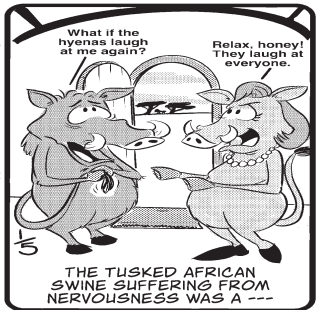

## Disaster Relief teams prepare response to flooding, tornadoes

Ron Crow barely had time to catch his breath between phone calls as he returned home from a brief respite to Missouri with his wife to visit family.

Welcome to the life of the leader of the hard-working Kentucky Baptist Disaster Relief.

Only a few days after closing up sites in western Kentucky after spending nearly three weeks helping with tornado recovery, a new weather episode — this time devastating floods and five more tornadoes — have paralyzed parts of Kentucky.

A flood recovery operation will be stationed at First Baptist Church Belfry with the team arriving Sunday night and two recovery teams coming Monday night. He said a small feeding team and two chaplains will be working the devastated Pike County area.

Crow said he would be taking supplies and a mobile office to them on Sunday before returning home.

In Campbellsville, Hopkinsville, and Madison County, assessors were on the ground Saturday and will keep working Sunday to begin preliminary plans on what response is needed.

"We are not forgetting western Kentucky," Crow said in an email update late Saturday night. "The continued needs there will still be our focus too. We still have some

equipment there that we are working on getting back to Stanford. Our volunteers are tired, but amazing that they once again are stepping up like they always do."

The severe weather system on New Year's Day impacted much of western, eastern and south central Kentucky with at least five tornadoes and massive flooding to thousands of Kentuckians.

Tornadoes swept through Hopkinsville and Bowling Green, according to storm damage surveys by the National Weather Service. There were no immediate reports of any deaths or injuries.

The severe weather comes three weeks

after deadly tornadoes ripped through Kentucky, killing 77.

The NWS confirmed the New Year's Day tornadoes on Sunday afternoon.

- Christian County: Hopkinsville had an EF-2 with peak winds of 115 mph and a path wide of 125 yards.

- Madison County: EF-1 tornadoes with 110 mph in Union City.

- Taylor County: EF-1 near Campbellsville with peak winds of 110 mph

- Barren County: EF-1 near Glasgow with

peak winds of 95 mph

- Warren County: EF-0 in Bowling Green with peak winds of 85 mph.

The Kentucky governor's office reported flash flooding had caused water rescues and many road closures in the southern and central portions of the state. Gov. Andy Beshear declared a state of emergency Saturday.

Flash flooding in Green, Barren, Taylor, Adair, Owsley, Breathitt and Casey counties has resulted in numerous road closures and

water rescues. High water was blocking all or parts of multiple roads in Floyd, Knott and Pike counties as of noon. Casey County and Owsley County have declared local states of emergency.

A tornado touchdown was reported in Hopkinsville, causing severe damage to downtown businesses, and a possible tornado touchdown was reported in Taylor County, where numerous households have been damaged. Severe thunderstorm warnings

have also been issued for Logan, Simpson, Marion and Washington counties.

"It is devastating that we are once again experiencing severe weather just weeks after the deadly tornadoes hit Western Kentucky. Sadly, some counties have been affected by both of these events," Beshear said in a statement.

# Ashes of movie star dolphin Winter released into Gulf

**CLEARWATER, Fla.** — The ashes of Winter the dolphin were returned to the sea on Thursday, about two months after the beloved marine mammal of movie fame died at a Florida aquarium.

Clearwater Marine Aquarium staff members released a Himalayan sea salt urn containing Winter's ashes into the Gulf of Mexico from the back of a U.S. Coast Guard response boat.

"Being able to return Winter to her natural home was the best feeling in the world," Kelly Martin, the aquarium's vice president

of animal care, said in a statement. "Our goal at Clearwater Marine Aquarium is always to rehabilitate rescued marine life so they can return to the wild. "In Winter's case, as is the case with all

non-releasable animals, she unfortunately could not complete her return to the wild in life. But today, we were able to give her that final step — a return home."

Winter died on Nov. 11 at age 16 of an inoperable intestinal problem. The dolphin was rescued in December 2005 along Florida's East Coast after her tail got caught in a crab trap rope and had to be amputated.

The uplifting story of Winter's recovery using an unprecedented prosthetic tail was the subject of the two Dolphin Tale films in 2011 and 2014, making the creature a hero to people with disabilities and

chronic illnesses around the world.

A C-130 flyover by the U.S. Coast Guard began the ceremony-at-sea followed by the reading of a poem, aquarium staff said. The ashes were released by Martin and Veterinarian Dr. Shelly Marquardt. Flower petals of roses and orchids were released into the Gulf, and the team blew bubbles, honoring one of Winter's favorite enrichment activities.

Clearwater Marine Aquarium will continue to honor Winter's legacy with an onsite memorial, virtual reality experiences, and an endowment to safeguard indefinite support of the aquarium.

Proposed Flood Hazard Determinations for Union County, Kentucky and Incorporated Areas

The Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency has issued a preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), and where applicable, Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report, reflecting proposed flood hazard determinations within Union County, Kentucky and Incorporated Areas. These flood hazard determinations may include the addition or modification of Base Flood Elevations, base flood depths, Special Flood Hazard Area boundaries or zone designations, or the regulatory floodway. Technical information or comments are solicited on the proposed flood hazard determinations shown on the preliminary FIRM and/or FIS report for Union County, Kentucky and Incorporated Areas. These flood hazard determinations are the basis for the floodplain management measures that your community is required to either adopt or show evidence of being already in effect in order to qualify or remain qualified for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. However, before these determinations are effective for floodplain management purposes, you will be provided an opportunity to appeal the proposed information. 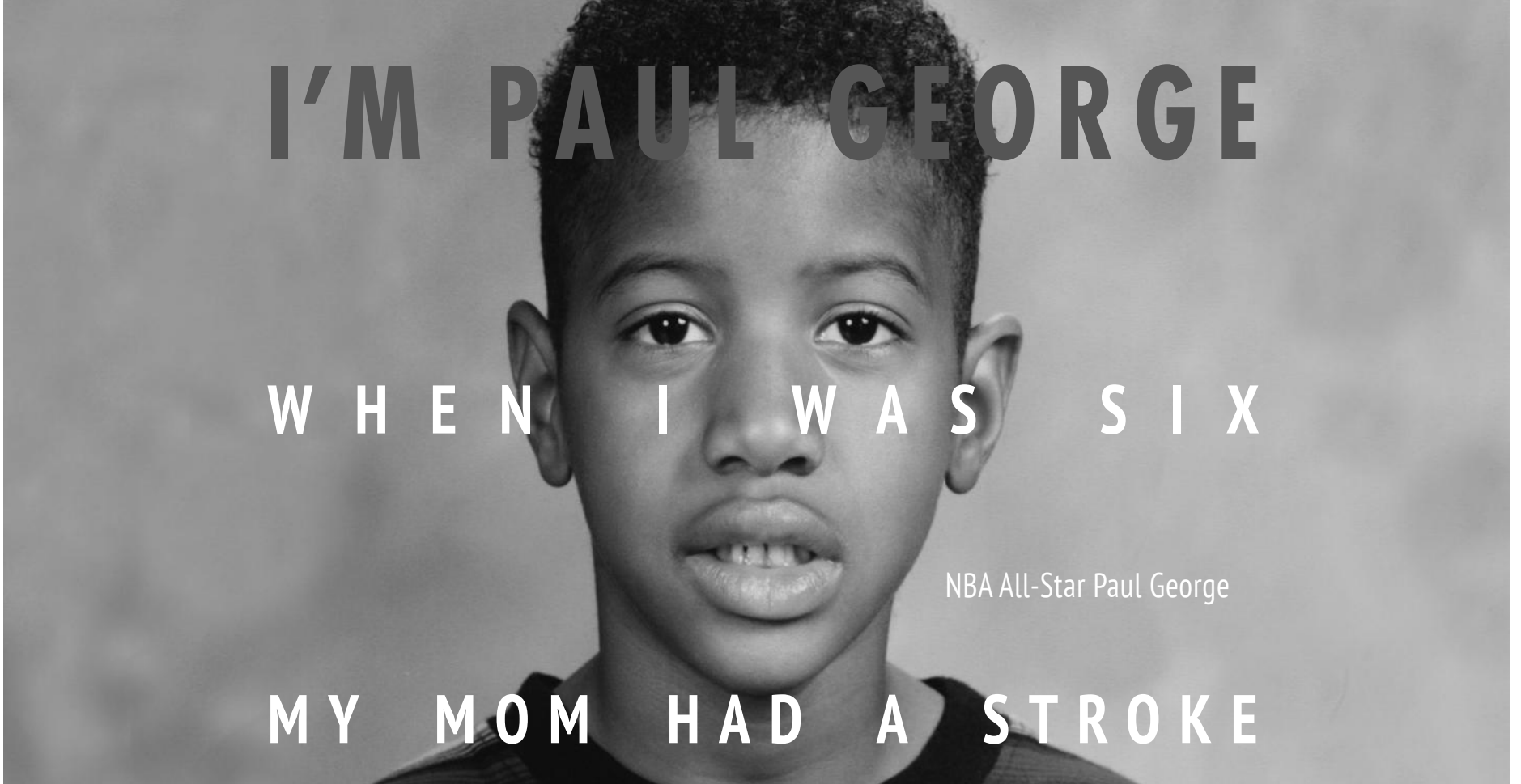

# Regional schools maintaining current virus protocols

COVID-19 cases have caused some districts to struggle with staffing

Regional students are back in classrooms this week, and officials from Hancock, McLean, Muhlenberg and Ohio county schools say they're hopeful for this second half of the school year, but they are also weary with the threat of the omicron variant.

All but Ohio County Schools have a universal masking policy, which district leaders say will remain in place for the foreseeable future.

Seth Southard, Ohio County Schools superintendent, said the decision was made in October to go to a mask-optional policy because it is what the school community preferred. He distributed surveys to parents and staff at that time, which indicated a preference for the choice to wear a mask.

He also said when that decision was made, there were "manageable" COVID-19 cases in schools.

"When we became mask optional we didn't really see any increase in our numbers," he said.

At this time, there are 11 total students and staff who have positive COVID-19 cases, which Southard said makes the school system "very fortunate."

He attributes that good fortune to parents and other community members following protocols, such as distancing and staying home when sick.

Southard, like other education leaders, knows that could change in a day.

Ohio County Schools haven't yet seen the "post holiday surge" that is expected, but they are monitoring cases on a daily basis and will make adjustments as needed, he said.

Tuesday was the first day back for Muhlenberg County Schools students, and district public information officer Carla Embry said the school system wouldn't have a count on how many students are out due to the virus until later in the week.

The tornado that came through the area on Dec. 10 gave everyone something else to focus on, Embry said, but she knows the virus is still ever-present and cause for concern in the community.

She did say numbers are "just raging" in the community, and there are several students and staff members absent. Before winter break, the district struggled to have enough bus drivers to transport students, as well as cafeteria workers to feed students.

"Right at this moment we are all just holding our breath," she said. "We all know what it was like last year when numbers started increasing. You just get this lump in your chest."

Each month MCS officials monitor cases in the county and across the school system to see if it can change virus protocols, but at this time they are sticking with CDC guidelines, which recommend indoor masking for all individuals age 2 and older, Embry said.

McLean County Public Schools Superintendent Tommy Burrough also said the district is abiding by CDC guidelines for dealing with the virus and its variants, which includes masking. The district handles positive cases and quarantines among students and staff on a case-by-case basis.

Case rates have been "constantly high" in the community and within the school system, Burrough said.

"Once I see we are in a decline, then we can discuss other actions, but right now, as long as we are in school, we are going to stay our current course," he said.

The district also has experienced staffing issues due to the virus, and employees being out for other reasons. There were even moments last semester when central office staff members were serving meals in schools because there weren't enough cafeteria

workers to provide service, he said.

He said the district hasn't reached "critical levels" with teachers and bus drivers, but he didn't have a definite count of how many are absent at this time. Later this week there will be more information regarding absences, and he and other officials are watching numbers closely.

Robby Asberry, Hancock County Schools superintendent, said the district hasn't changed its COVID-19 protocols since the start of this school year, and it doesn't have any immediate plans to do so. About 3.5% of staff and students are absent due to quarantines or positive test results.

Cases are up in the county and the region, but Asberry also considers the district in a good position because it hasn't yet seen a spike in case load following the holiday break.

"We have been blessed to not have as bad a time as other districts, as far as positive COVID-19 cases go," he said.

Like all other districts in the region, Hancock schools utilize a Test to Stay option, which is helpful for keeping students in classrooms as much as possible, he said.

He also said the district has contingencies in place if it has to move to remote learning due to significant student or staff absences because of the virus.

All other districts in the region also have such a plan in place, however, as of Dec. 31, the state changed the flexibility districts have with Non-Traditional Instruction days. Before, districts could move specific classes or schools impacted by the virus to remote instruction while the rest of students continued normally.

Now districts are limited to 10 NTI days. If a specific school needs to shut down, that means the entire district has to also close for that period and utilize those NTI days, according to the Kentucky Department of Education.

Most educators in the region are hopeful there will be some decisions made in regards to leniency to that plan now that the General Assembly is back in session and a new variant is hitting the world.

### Victim killed in Monday collision identified

The driver killed in a collision Monday on Kentucky 81 in Daviess County had been identified.

A Daviess County Sheriff's Office press release said Mary C. Spencer, 61, of Owensboro was killed in a collision that occurred at 11:19 a.m. Monday in the 2600 block of Kentucky 81, near the Daviess County Operations Center.

Reports say Spencer was driving a passenger car when she attempted to make a left turn onto Kentucky 81, turning into the path of a pickup truck driving south on the highway.

The vehicles collided, and Spencer was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver of the pickup truck, Brock A. Hopper, 34, of Mortons Gap, refused medical treatment, reports say.

### Maglinger files for new term on City Commission

Owensboro City Commissioner Larry Maglinger has filed to run for a third term of office.

Maglinger, a local businessman, was first elected in 2018. In 2020, Maglinger received the most votes among city commission candidates, making him the commission's Mayor Pro Tem.

In a press release, Maglinger said: "I want to continue providing the leadership needed to keep Owensboro growing, safe and the best place to live, work and raise a family."

### Beshear: Omicron causing COVID-19 test positivity rate to soar

FRANKFORT — Kentucky reported almost 30,000 new COVID-19 cases last week, nearly twice the previous week's total as the omicron variant spurs a record

test positivity rate, Gov. Andy Beshear said Monday.

"Omicron has not only come to the commonwealth, it has hit us harder in terms of escalation of cases than anything we have seen to date," Beshear said at a news conference.

Kentucky reached a new daily record for COVID-19 cases, with 6,441 reported on Dec. 30, the governor said. The previous high was 5,742 cases on Jan. 6, 2021, the governor's office said.

The statewide test positivity rate has soared to 20.7%, he said.

New virus cases are likely to continue escalating statewide, since some reports haven't yet come in because of the long holiday weekend, the governor said.

"We went from being in a relative plateau to the second highest week of reported cases since the start of the pandemic, surpassed only by the week of Aug. 30 when the delta variant was hitting us at its peak," Beshear said.

The Democratic governor stressed the need for people to self-isolate once they're infected to try to prevent an even more dramatic spread of the virus.

"If you have omicron and you don't isolate, you will infect a ton of people," he said. "And yes, it appears to be less severe, though with the number of cases, you're going to see hospitalizations and the rest are going up."

People who become infected also need to alert those who were in close contact with them, he said.

"This thing spreads so fast, you need to pick up the phone and call everybody you have been around recently," the governor said. "This is happening to a ton of people. So it doesn't need to be any guilt."

Beshear and Dr. Steven Stack, Kentucky's public health commissioner, stressed that the state's school districts need to require mask wearing in schools.

# Washington to reveal new name Feb. 2

Washington's NFL team announced Tuesday it will unveil its new name on Feb. 2 and that it will not be the Wolves or RedWolves.

Commanders, Admirals, Armada, Brigade, Sentinels, Defenders, Red Hogs, Presidents and the status quo "Washington Football Team" were among the other finalists.

"We are on the brink of starting a new chapter, but our history, our legacy cannot be lost along the way," team president Jason Wright said in an episode of the team-produced show "Making the Brand." "Now, more than ever, it's important that we stay connected to our roots. We understand the importance of choosing a meaningful name: one that will anchor the team for the next 90 years and beyond."

Wright said the decision was made not to go with Wolves or RedWolves because of trademarks held by other organizations. Those possibilities were popular among Washington fans.

The new helmets and uniforms will feature the franchise's signature burgundy-and-gold colors, with three stars on the collar and stripes on the shoulders of otherwise plain jerseys. In a "Making the Brand" clip showing him getting a look at one of the helmets, coach Ron Rivera said: "I love this. Right on. I think the look's going to be hot."

A trailer teasing the reveal included a "W" logo making an appearance.

The video featured the messages: "Hail to the greats that laid the founda-

tion for our legacy," "Hail to the fans we consider family," "We are and always have been Washington," "We will fight for our community" and "Together we will define our future."

Photos of franchise greats were mixed in with current players meeting with military personnel and fans.

The organization dropped its old name in July 2020 after decades of complaints that it was racist toward Native Americans and recent pressure from team sponsors. The decision was made to be known as the Washington Football Team that season, which stuck around for 2021 while the front office went through a lengthy rebranding process.

"Our journey to a new identity is a marathon, not a sprint," Wright said. "To get it right, we had to take every step of the process seriously, and the destination is a sum of all those parts."

Washington was the first team in the four major North American professional sports leagues to move away from Native American imagery amid a national reckoning on race. Cleveland in Major League Baseball followed suit, adopting the new name Guardians that is now in effect after settling a lawsuit with a roller derby team by the same name.

MLB's Atlanta Braves and the NHL's Chicago Blackhawks have defended keeping their names.

Wright made it clear during the rebranding process that Washington would not use any sort of Native American imagery moving forward. He, Rivera and others have made references to wanting to honor the once-storied franchise's tradition, which includes three Super Bowl championships.

"I just think the heritage and the history of our team is what's so important, and, as fans, I think we're going to rally around that team," Hall of Fame coach Joe Gibbs said. "I'd say probably what's more important about naming the team, it's trying to bring everybody together. ... That's the one thing that we've got going for ourselves is the loyalty that we have for that team."

Washington has not had a lot going on or off the field in recent years. The league fined the team \$10 million after an investigation into workplace conduct, owner Dan Snyder squabbled with minority partners before buying out their shares, the front office took criticism this season for botching late safety Sean Taylor's jersey retirement and over the past 15 years the team has not won a playoff game.

# Browns' Mayfield to undergo surgery, sit out season finale

Baker Mayfield's broken fourth season with the Browns has mercifully ended with one game left.

His time in Cleveland could be running short as well.

Mayfield is sitting out the season finale against Cincinnati so he can undergo surgery on his left shoulder, an injury that affected his performance, contributed to the Browns' falling way short of expectations and may have altered the path of his NFL career.

Mayfield, who played with a torn labrum suffered in Week 2 and a fracture in his non-throwing shoulder for most of the season, was sacked nine times in Monday night's 26-14 loss to the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Afterward, the 26-year-old said he "was pretty damn beat up" and planned to consult with his family and agents about whether to play against the AFC North champion Bengals.

Coach Kevin Stefanski said conversations Tuesday between Mayfield, his representatives and the team led to the decision to have the operation as soon as possible so he has more time to recover ahead of next season.

"Obviously frustrating for him, but we felt this was the best thing for him right now," said Stefanski, who did not have a timeline for recovery.

While the operation, which has yet to be scheduled, ends this season for Mayfield, there's no certainty on where he'll take his next snap.

The Browns picked up Mayfield's fifth-year, \$18.8 million contract option for 2022, but his erratic and often poor play this season has raised doubts as to whether the team wants to go forward with him.

## The Sermon on the Mount: You Shall Know Them by Their Fruits (Matthew 7:15-20)

In this portion of Jesus sermon on the mount there is quite a bit to take away. I want to focus on 3 ideas. First, we can know someone is a Christian/faithful by their life. This is in line with what we discussed when we discussed the earlier part of chapter 7; you can judge righteously.

James does go so far as to say we should flee Satan. Further, we should always be on the lookout for ourselves spiritually. We should always examine what someone is preaching to us, no matter how good it may feel, and be like the

Bereans who searched the scriptures daily to determine whether the things taught were true (Acts 17:11).

Lastly, those who do not produce the right fruit are cast into the fire. Jesus mentions that grapes can't come from thorns nor figs from thistles. Someone

can't claim to be Christian and their doctrine and lifestyle say otherwise. That makes them a hypocrite and worthy of being cut down and cast into hell. These three key points are so closely intertwined we must judge so that we can know the fruit (using scripture), to avoid

being devoured, and to not be cast into hell. We must be watchful and ever present in our Bibles.



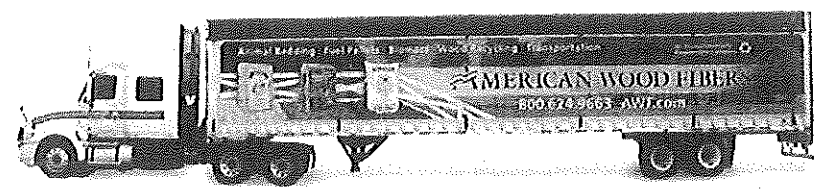

## KSP Post 16 Issues Proactive Patrol Reminder

## BETWEEN YOU AND ME

Dr. Thom Ranier has done us a favor sharing five unmovable church members in his conferences "In Leading Churches in Change". So let's look at these unmovable church members. There are different kinds of stubborn members but most of them fall in five categories:

1) Deniers- Leading in a church change, Ranier found a lady in her 70s' attending the church for a half century. He asked her what she believed about the church declining. Surprised by her response, "My church is not declining." Sharing her the attendance graph she denied it's accuracy, did not know of who left the church. She could not recall. . .though it went from 358 to 180 in five years. Total and total complete denial-fastest path to death.

2) Entitled-This person treats the church more like a country club than a church. They view their financial gifts as offerings to get perks and privileges. They make pastors cringe when they say,

"Do you know who pays your salary?" They expect their worship style, the pastor to jump when they call, to get what they want. It's called entitlement. After all, it's "our" church. This member is described in 1Corinthians 12. They are in churches to get their needs met. Change is thus difficult and sometimes futile.

3) Blamers-These people blame the pastor for being at fault. It is the fault of new members not knowing the church culture. Blamer's blame because they do not want to change and do not carry their weight in the church.

4) Critics-The critics are a lot like the Blamer's because they also believe the problems of the church are someone else's fault. They drain the pastors and other leaders of their energies. Sometimes critics are direct and others are cowardly. They go to Facebook or other social media to air their grievances. They are among

the first who will voice their complaint when change is initiated.

5) Confused-These are often confused well-intending church members. They really do view some things are more important than they were intended. The outcry of church members over the new pulpit is a classic example of the confused who resist change. They see the pulpit as something sacred in itself. No change in the pulpit, it is therefore a sacred violation.

About nine in ten churches in America have settled into dangerous complacency. Many members have dug in deeply and are head-strong to resist change. Do not enter into change leadership lightly. Do not begin the process without concerted prayer. The last question for careful study-what kind of reputation does your church have in your community?

## Individual Needs Should Be Used To Help Formulate Emergency Plans

Storms, natural disasters and other emergency situations are unpredictable. Planning for the unpredictable is no small task, but emergency response professionals and public health agencies emphasize the importance of having a plan in place should disaster strike.

The National Centers for Environmental Information reported there were a record 22 separate billion-dollar weather and climate disasters across the United States in 2020. That shattered the previous annual record and led to \$95 billion in damages, marking a book-end to a five-year period between 2016 and 2020 that saw the total cost of a billion-dollar disasters exceed \$600 billion. Such figures illustrate that while the disasters themselves may be unpredictable, it's not hard to conclude that they're going to be costly.

When planning for disasters, families are urged to consider the specific needs of each person in their household. Ready.gov, a disaster preparedness public service campaign sponsored by the U.S. government, urges families to keep the following factors in mind as they prepare disaster response plans for their households.

- Ages of members within your household: The ages of individuals within the household

- merit consideration. Young children or seniors may not be able to navigate the household in emergency situations, and it may take longer for heads of household to get everyone out if some people need assistance. Emergency plans can be altered as children grow older and can take on more responsibility.

- Responsibilities for assisting others: Assign older children and adults specific responsibilities if anyone in the household will require assistance. For example, adolescents can help a live-in grandparent get out of the house.

- Locations frequented: Defining the household members frequent can make it easier to find everyone in the case of

- emergency. Dietary needs: Document the unique dietary needs, including food allergies, of each person in the household so no one has an adverse reaction to food during or after evacuating.

- Medical needs: Document each individual's medical needs, including their prescriptions and any equipment they need.

- Disabilities: Include individual's disabilities-related needs or access and functional needs, including devices and equipment.

- Languages spoken: This information can help emergency response personnel communicate with anyone who does not speak the native tongue.

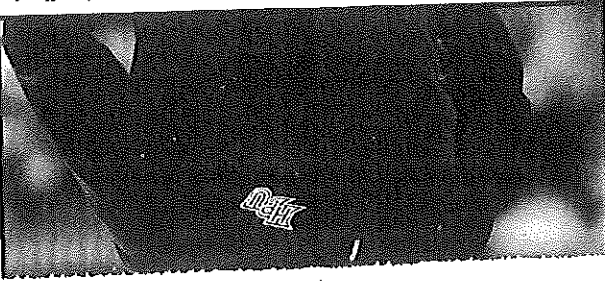

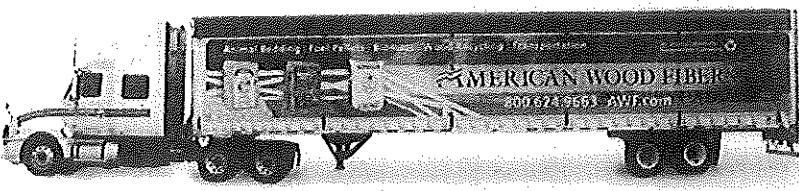
