Federal and state environmental regulations require Duke Energy Kentucky to build and upgrade equipment and facilities that produce energy from coal to operate in an environmentally sound manner. Specifically, the Company is seeking Commission approval of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the Landfill Closure at East Bend. This project requires an amendment of Duke Energy Kentucky's Amended Environmental Compliance Plan that was approved by the Commission in 2018.

Additionally, Duke Energy Kentucky is seeking an order approving the recovery of the costs of the Landfill Closure through its Environmental Surcharge tariff. The Landfill Closure is required for the Company to comply with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's federal Hazardous and Solid Waste Management System; Disposal of Coal Combustion Residuals from Electric Utilities (Federal CCR Rule), and other environmental requirements that apply to Duke Energy Kentucky facilities used in the production of energy from coal. The estimated fully loaded cost of the Landfill Closure for which the Company is seeking recovery at this time is approximately \$22.6 million. 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

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

Drevets said he also believes vaccinated people who are also experimenting with ivermectin are wanting to do everything they can to fight the virus and simply want to exhaust every option. "I have more understanding of that, particularly if they're scared or if they've watched a loved one struggle with COVID," Drevets said. "I could understand wanting to do something, in trying to do everything that's available. It's unfortunate that, I think, they go that way, but again I can understand that position pretty easily, and have a lot of sympathy with it."
