The proposed rates are required under the terms of an agreement between the District and RD and KRS 278.023 does not grant the PSC any discretionary authority to modify or reject any portion of the agreement between the District and RD, or to defer the issuance of all necessary orders to implement the terms of the agreement. The RD loan proceeds will be used to finance the costs of the installation of approximately 111.000 linear feet of 3°, 4°, 6°, and 8°-inch SDR 21 water main plus all necessary appartenances on roads in the southwestern and northern parts of the county.
