Re: Intervention in Case No. 2021-00346

Dear Ms. Bridewell:

After receiving the filing by Stites & Harbison, attorneys representing Kentucky Electric Power, on December 28, 2021. I'm requesting the following information and documentation from the Kentucky Public Services Commission.

1. Names of "Impartial witnesses" designated by the KPSC, prior to making a ruling in this case. Did "KEP", use one of its employees in responding to your requested information, "Nicholas Koehler"? (Unbelievable)! "Old Saying": Letting the Fox, guard the Hen House!!
2. Page 4, Data Request KPSC 2_(4): "KEP" states in their response, that a study was done previously, on a totally different tract. How can KEP claim (NO) thermal or voltage violations. When their proposed "transmission lines" haven't been constructed? (DAH)!

3. KPSC 2_(12), page 22-23: KPSC asked KEP, if they anticipated the widening of the right of way for transmission lines. KEP cited case No. 2020-0062 & Case 2018-209. They have “No Clue”. Question: what Case’s has the KPSP, objected EKP, from widening the right of way, after KPSC has already granted KEP in taking property owners property by Eminent Domain?
4. Is Kentucky Electric Power’s, expert witness, who responds to KPSC’s requested documentation, “Nicholas C. Koehler”, Director of Transmission Planning for American Electric Power Service Corporation?.....
5. I am requesting the Kentucky Public Service Commission to request the “intervention” in this case by the Kentucky Attorney General, under its Purview “Kentucky Revised Statutes” ... (15.255). If not, please state the rationale for all the “Environmental Damage” I have aforementioned in my “Filings”!
6. Kentucky Electric Power witness stated, in their response to the KPSC, their substation, located on Hays Branch, KPSC DATA REQUEST 2_2: their substation was subject to flooding. There are (2) routes to access the substation. (1) Rt 777, which is subject to flooding (2) Rt 680 which is not subject to flooding!! Once again the KPSC needs to have an impartial party, documenting “Fact”!
