## **APPLICATION**

Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU"), pursuant to KRS 278.018(6), 807 KAR 5:001 Section 14, and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 22, hereby applies for approval of changes in its certified service territory as agreed to with South Kentucky Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation ("South Kentucky RECC").

- 1. KU's mailing address is Kentucky Utilities Company, Post Office Box 32010, 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky 40202. KU may be reached by electronic mail at the electronic mail addresses of its counsel set forth below.
- 2. KU was incorporated in Kentucky on August 17, 1912, and in Virginia on November 26, 1991 (and effective as of December 1, 1991), and is in good standing in both Kentucky and Virginia.
- 3. KU is a public utility, as defined in KRS 278.010(3)(a), engaged in the electric business. KU generates and purchases electricity, and distributes and sells electricity at retail in the following counties in Central, Northern, Southeastern, and Western Kentucky:

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## 5. <u>Description of Changes in Service Territory:</u>

As explained in this application and in the attached exhibits, KU and South Kentucky RECC have individually agreed to the requested territorial change for the tracts of land described

below. The proposed territorial boundary change serves the purposes of KRS 278.016. The change avoids the wasteful duplication of facilities and the unnecessary encumbrance of the landscape, and also minimizes disputes between retail electric providers.

This proposed territorial change stems from a developer's request to have a single utility provide electric service to five new apartment buildings (Kenneth Goff Apartments) located off Oak Hill Road in central Pulaski County Kentucky. Two of the five buildings (located within the Rebecca Light Tract 2) are split by the electric service certified territorial line, and three buildings (located within the Rebecca Light Tract 1) are wholly within KU's certified electric service territory. Due to the customer's request and KU's existing services in the immediate area, South Kentucky RECC contacted KU about KU serving the entire development. KU has provided electric service to this immediate area for over forty years.

Upon review of the maps in this area, in preparing to make this filing, KU and South Kentucky RECC realized that the Commission's certified territorial line, as interpreted from Quadrant 30-I-3, did not match the existing property lines in terms of which utility is already providing service. It appears that KU may have been inadvertently serving outside of its respective certified territory. Therefore, in this application, KU also seeks to move the official boundary line to match the existing property lot lines. No customers will change providers; but the territorial lines will, upon approval, reflect the reality of which utility is serving which lots.

Therefore, in addition to redrawing the boundaries to include all of Tract 2 (Rebecca Light property) as part of KU's certified territory, KU and South Kentucky RECC agree to redraw the boundaries to include the following existing lots (that KU is already serving) within KU's certified territory as well:

• Lot #'s 11-13, 24-29 (Irongate Estates)

- Lot #'s 5-9, 20-24 (Heritage Estates) and one open tract (Tract abuts Lot #'s 20, 21, 23, 24)
- Lot #'s 1 and 2 (Oakland Estates) and one open tract (Tract abuts Thurman Road and Lot #1)
- Lot #'s 7, 20, 21, 24, and 25 (Silvers Estates)

The territorial maps and other attachments provided constitute the entire agreement between KU and South Kentucky RECC.

## 6. Agreement and Maps:

Application Exhibit 1 includes the summary list identifying KU and South Kentucky RECC personnel familiar with the specifics of the facilities available, the reason for the change, and agreement signed by both parties for the properties involved. Application Exhibit 2 includes the signed territorial (quadrant) map that shows the new GPS coordinates. Application Exhibit 3 includes the signed, detailed site map that includes the locations of KU and South Kentucky RECC distribution facilities.

WHEREFORE, KU hereby requests, pursuant to KRS 278.018, that the Commission enter an order approving the updates to the Quadrant Map to reflect the current requested service territory changes and the agreement between KU and South Kentucky RECC.

## **AGREEMENT**

Kentucky Utilities Company (KU) and South Kentucky Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation (SKRECC) hereby agree to a territorial boundary change that will match with existing property lot lines. The boundary line includes existing residential homes, the Rebecca Light tracts one and two, and two vacant lots. All lots are either wholly or partially within Irongate Estates, Heritage Estates, Oakland Estates and Silvers Estates subdivisions.

Electric service has been provided to these subdivisions for approximately 45 years.

This change simply clarifies which existing lots are served by which utility as the existing territorial line does not match the electric services that are there today. No customers will change providers.
