J. Kirkpatrick, who is
responsible for compos-
ing 11 other hymns listed
in my hymn book. Most
notable might be the
Charles Wesley hymn,
"Blessed Be the Name".
The other version's tune
name is "Away in a Man-
ger" was composed by
James R. Murray. The
latter is probably the
more familiar. I like both
tunes.
