Some people think these numbers are artificially inflated by all the stimulus money. But be mindful. Kentucky only has a 3.0% unemployment rate right now, even though it is not as evident in small rural areas. Louisville, which is the driving force for most everything in Kentucky, only has a 3% unemployment rate and has filled 99.5% of the jobs lost pre-pandems.

State Auditor Mike Harmon has even been talking about unemployment. He says the unemployment fraud issues have improved in 2021. Allke Harmon is set to run for Governor in the 2022 election.

The car tax is still being talked about in Frankfort. Refunds are likely under many various Bills, possible even freezing the vehicle taxes prior to the vehicle evaluations skyrocketed during the pandemic.

tucky is losing more than 6,000 teachers a year and that is not sustainable. Ed-ucators have been crying about a teacher shortage for years. Many Kentucky teachers say that the 2021 2022 school year has been 2022 school year has been the worst for them to date. Finding a solution is so difficult, especially with the underlying shortage. Critical race theory in education is, also, the talk in Frankfort that has been expected.

ongoing Senate President Robert Stivers (R-District 25) Stivers (R-District 25) made a statement last Fri-day, saying to be prepared to vote because some of this money is going to be given back. People wonder what he meant when he said that, but many think it is a fease to tay reform A big centerpiece of that is an income tax cut, being mindful that it must follow the rules that these federal stimulus Bills laid out when they allowed them to have the money, but specified that it cannot be used for tax cuts. This has Kentucky having three billion dollars in the bank right now. Despite possible tax reform, the Republi-

tax reform, the Republi-cans still say the economy is doing well.

Covid numbers are still declining in Kentucky. Governor Beshear says if the decline continues, some recommendations, even for schools, could change within several weeks that would include not wearing masks. It is not wearing masks. It is unclear if this will be helpunclear if this will be help-ful for schools or not. The death toll due to Covid in Kentucky is over 13,000. Even when the surge goes away, still stay alert.



The study assessed Take-mask or respirator use annong ob 2 people who lesied positive for the virus and 1,176 who tested negative from Feb. 18 to Dec. 1, 2021 and self-reported being in indoor public settings during the two weeks preceding their test, with no known contact with any confirmed or suspected Covid-19 infection. The samples were randomly selected residents of Cali-

The study concluded, "Always using a face mask or respirator in indoor public settings was associated with lower adjusted odds of a positive test result, compared with never wearing a face mask or respirator in these settings." Among the 534 study participants who reported the type of mask they used, cloth masks offered 56% more protection against the virus than wearing no mask indoors; surgical masks offered 66% more; and respirator mask, such as N95 or KN95, offered the most additional protection, 83%.

"These data from real-world settings reinforce the importance of consistently wearing face masks or respirators to reduce the risk of acquisition of infection among the general public in indoor community settings," the report says.

CDC guidance says that N95 masks, when they fit well and are worn correctly, provide the highest level of protection, while also maintaining that "any mask is better than no mask." Last month, the federal government began distributing 400 million free N95 masks through pharmacies and community health centers.

State officials have long urged Kentuckians to wear masks in indoor spaces and especially in schools, but in September the legislature took away Gov. Andy Behsear's power to impose mask mandates.

A Kaiser Family Foundation survey taken mid-January found that most American adults (54%) say they wear a mask every time in an indoor, crowded space. The rate was highest among among vaccinated people (62%; unvaccinated 28%). It was also higher among Democrats (77%), followed by independents (50%) and Republicans (31%).

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

Kentucky began accepting tax returns Jan. 24

FRANKFORT, Ky. - According to the Kentucky Department of Revenue, the Internal Revenue Service began accepting electronic and paper federal individual income tax returns on Monday, Jan. 24, 2022, and Kentucky will follow the same timeline and will also begin accepting and processing returns on that same date.

The agency will begin pro-cessing individual income tax returns on Monday, Feb. 7 2022. Electronic individual income tax returns typically take two to three weeks to process with refunds issued shortly thereafter. Taxpayers may check the status of their refund by visiting refund.ky.gov and entering their Social Secu-rity number and exact dollar amount of the expected refund.

The deadline to file 2021 tax returns is Monday, April 18, 2022. However, individuals and households affected by the December 2021 severe storms. tornados and flooding have been granted an extension until May 16, 2022.


