Kentucky Power Company's Notice of Filing of Proof of Publication
and Motion for Deviation

Kentucky Power Company gives notice of its filing of the following attached documents as evidence of the publication of the public notice required by 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b) and the Commission's March 17, 2022 Order in this case:

- (a) The March 28, 2022 affidavit of Rachel McCarty, Advertising Assistant, Kentucky Press Service, Inc., including list of publications and publication dates; and
- (b) A copy of the accompanying newspaper "tear sheets," verifying the contents of the required notice of hearing and that the notice was published in all but one of the newspapers in the Company's service territory.

Further, in accordance with the Commission's March 17, 2022 Order in this matter, the Company used its best efforts to give notice of the hearing in compliance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b). The Company's Notice of Filing Proof of Request for Publication of Hearing Notice (filed herein on March 18, 2022) reflects that it made the request for publication with the Kentucky Press Service on March 17, 2022, the same day that the Commission's Order setting the March 30, 2022 hearing was issued.

As demonstrated by the March 28, 2022 affidavit of Rachel McCarty, the Hindman Troublesome Creek Times did not publish the notice on March 24, 2022 as requested by the Company and Kentucky Press Service. The Hindman Troublesome Creek Times publishes once

weekly on Thursdays, and as such, will not publish the notice prior to the March 30, 2022 hearing currently scheduled in this case. Kentucky Power is unaware of the reason the newspaper failed to publish the notice as originally scheduled.

Kentucky Power acted in good faith and with due care in arranging for the timely publication of the notice and used its best efforts to give notice of the hearing in compliance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b) as ordered. Due to reasons outside the Company's control, the notice was not published in one of the newspapers in the Company's service territory. The notice was published in each of the remaining 19 newspapers in the Company's service territory as indicated in Ms. McCarty's affidavit.

For the foregoing reasons, and to the extent the Commission deems it necessary, Kentucky Power requests that the Commission grant a deviation from the requirements of its March 17, 2022 Order and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b).

Wesley's Grandparent Rights Bill passes

Legislation protecting the relationship between grandparents and their grandchildren unanimously passed the House Health and Family Services Committee Thursday.

Sponsored by Representative Bill Wesley, HB 157 establishes that grandparent rights cannot be adversely affected by any investigation into a child's parent for dependency, neglect or abuse. The measure puts the best interest of children first by allowing kids to be engaged with someone they know and have a relationship with, rather than the foster care system.

"As we continue to see a staggering decline and breakdown of families being split apart, HB 157 is common sense," said Wesley, who represents Estill, Powell, and part of Madison counties. "This law establishes continuity in an often-traumatic time for kids since we know that losing the relationship with the grandparent as well will likely lead to more harm."

The legislation makes clear that once a grandparent has visitation rights, those rights will not be affected by an investigation into the parent. This includes if parental rights are terminated or in the event a parent is deceased.

"Kids don't get to choose their parents, their home life or their zip code," added Wesley. "If a child is taken out of a dysfunctional home environment, that doesn't mean they should be cut off from all family relationships."

Kentucky has unfortunately led the nation in child abuse and neglect cases for three straight years, according to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Wesley said the legislation will be named "Joyce's Rights" in honor of a young man and his grandmother from House District 91. The measure moves back to the House floor. For more information on HB 157, visit the Legislative Research Commission website.

Kim Davis is the subject of a lawsuit filed in Rowan Circuit Court by the ACLU and opening arguments were heard Monday morning on behalf of four Rowan County couples. Two same sex and two of different sex who were denied marriage license applications.

While Senator Rand Paul did not return phone calls regarding his stand on the topic, Senator Mitch McConnell did.

"I've always believed that marriage is between one man and one woman, but the Supreme Court ruled otherwise," McConnell said in a release to KNG Monday. "The Supreme Court's decision underscores the need to respect the religious beliefs and practices of private citizens who disagree with its ruling."

In Friday's ruling, U.S. District Court Judge, Honorable David Bunning, said the nation's highest court determined marriage is a fundamental right under the Fourteenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution and it is "readily apparent that Davis made a conscious decision to violate" the rights of David Ermold and David Moore and of James Yates and Will Smith.

Bunning's ruling said

ner because it would violate her constitutional right to the free exercise of religion.

"Ultimately, this Court's determination is simple — Davis cannot use her own constitutional rights as a shield to violate the constitutional rights of others while performing her duties as an elected official," wrote Bunning, of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky.

The couples in this litigation are seeking compensatory and punitive damages as well as legal fees that gradually mounted during this years-long court battle.

Bunning's ruling said the plaintiffs' testimony "at the very least creates a genuine issue of material fact as to whether they are entitled to damages." For example, Ermold said every time he thinks of his marriage, "I have to think about Kim Davis and the experience, how we were humiliated and treated like less than human beings," according to published reports.

Yates, another plaintiff, testified that damages would compensate for his and Smith's "experience with Davis, the resulting publicity, and

awarded will be determined by a jury, per Bunning's ruling, which said: "It is this Court's opinion that Davis violated Plaintiffs' constitutional right to marry and the only remaining issue is the issue of damages."

The Florida-based organization Liberty Counsel is representing Davis in court and said Friday it will keep arguing she's not liable for damages.

"This case raises serious First Amendment free exercise of religion claims and has a high potential of reaching the Supreme Court," Liberty Counsel chairman Mat Staver said in a statement Friday.

Expanding Access to Child-care: On Friday, we passed HB 499 which would establish the Employee Child-Care Assistance Partnership. This partnership would encourage non-profit and for-profit employers to offer child-care assistance as a benefit by matching employer contributions with state dollars. Not only will it address child-care the measure is meant to encourage people to get into the workforce, and not have to worry about finding quality child-care.

Rural Broadband Access: HB 315 will address the many issues people are facing when getting access to reliable and affordable broadband. The measure would do four things to improve the access to internet. It would improve the function and operation of the Broadband Deployment fund, allocate \$300 million to the fund for grants to incentive broadband in our underserved communities and establish an Office of Broadband which would help allocate the funds from the Federal Infrastructure Act. It also will relieve statutory restrictions from the Public Service Commission, and it will incorporate provisions from HB 492 to establish a utility pole replacement fund.

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Kami's Law Heads to the Governor's Desk: Legislation to increase the penalties of those convicted of child abuse passed the Senate last week and is now waiting for action by Governor Beshear. HB 263 would increase the penalties of the crime, if the child is under 12 years old to a Class B Felony, which would mean they would be subject to registration in the Kentucky Caregiver Misconduct and Kentucky Child Abuse registries. It would also require for the abuser to serve out 85 percent of their time. The

bill is named after Kami who was a victim of child abuse, and her life has been forever changed because of it. Her attack left her with permanent physical and cognitive disabilities. The legislation comes from Kiera Dunk, a 12-year-old from Oldham County, who is friends with Kami. Covid year three brings new back breaking pain

Physical therapists treat latest COVID symptom...back pain

LEXINGTON, Ky. — March 23 — Heading into year three of pandemic living has a growing number of Americans dealing with back breaking pain in 2022.

Lower back pain (LBP) affects four out of five adults, and the lingering pandemic is making the problem worse. Here's why:

Lower back pain has emerged as a prevalent symptom of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 this year. Sometimes people mistake their back pain for muscle spasms or kidney stones, like Good Morning America's Amy Robach, who was one of many who experienced back pain as part

of their COVID illness. "Pandemic posture" is taking its toll with poor work-from-home habits, including slouching at desks or on couches, putting an increased or imbalanced pressure on joints. Even if poor posture doesn't cause your pain, it can worsen it.

Latest research shows Americans now spend a whopping 9.5 hours being sedentary each day, whether at work or play. This can cause muscle spasms or muscle fatigue resulting in back pain.

Physical therapists at Orthopedic and Sports Physical Therapy in Lexington have long treated patients with acute and chronic back pain and know how to help those who are suffering from COVID-induced back pain, as well as all

the other ways pandemic living has contributed to an increase in lower back pain.

"We still don't know exactly why the Omicron variant is causing lower back pain, but the good news is we know how to treat it," says Pat Wempe, CEO of Orthopedic and Sports Physical Therapy. "Throughout the pandemic we have seen an increase in lower back and hip pain from increased sitting, and 'pandemic posture' with hunched backs and rounded necks in front of screens for extended periods of time. Now, the virus itself is causing back pain, and it's more important than ever for people to take action to make sure an acute back pain doesn't become chronic pain."

Acute Back Pain = short-term pain that lasts for a few days to a few weeks.

Chronic Back Pain = pain that lasts 12 weeks or more. About 20% of those with acute back pain will develop chronic pain.

Best Practices/Stretches for Lower Back Pain

Lower Trunk Rotation — Lie on your back with knees bent and shoulders and back flat to the floor. Let your legs fall to one direction. Hold for 5 seconds. Bring knees back to center and let them fall in the opposite direction. Repeat 5-10 times on each side.

Child's Pose — Sit back on your knees, push your butt back onto your heels, with your knees apart. Lower your upper body between your knees and reach forward, stretching your arms along the floor above your head and place your forehead near the floor. Hold this position for 20 to 30 seconds.

Piriformis Stretch — Lie on back with both knees bent feet flat on the floor. Place your right ankle at the base of your left thigh. Place your hands behind your left thigh and pull up toward your chest until you feel a stretch. Hold for 30 seconds to 1 minute. Repeat on opposite side.

Therapeutic-focused massage — Manual massage or percussive hand-held massage gun on sore muscles.

Follow the "30-30 rule" (30 seconds of movement for every 30 minutes of sitting) and incorporate targeted stretches into day.

Don't stop moving. Take at least a 15-20-minute walk every day to loosen tight muscles and increase blood flow.

*PT treatments are used in conjunction with movement-based therapy to give patients alternatives to using pain medications which can become addictive with harmful side effects.

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How to combat rising costs of living across Kentucky

Kentuckians are feeling the weight of rising living expenses. With national inflation at 7.5 percent, prices for goods and services are at record highs. These steep costs have forced many households to consider ways to better manage their resources.

To combat rising living expenses, start by finding intentional ways to manage your resources, reduce expenses and stretch your income. Below are a few ways to help your budget absorb the ill effects of inflation.

An inexpensive way to reduce heating and cooling bills is to check for insulation leaks around your home. Simple repairs, such as purchasing a bottle of expanding foam for under \$10, can help if you have cracks around windows or foundations. Stick-on foam strips to place under your doors or along vertical openings also sell for less than \$10.

Setting your thermostat at 68 degrees or below in the winter, or 78 degrees or above in the summer, can reduce your annual heating and cooling costs by as much as 10 percent. Remember to regularly clean or change your air filters

to keep your HVAC system efficiently working.

Free gas station apps or websites track the best local prices on gasoline. If your vehicle can operate on regular gas, choose that over mid-grade or premium fuel options. You are likely to find better deals at stations away from major highways or intersections. Traveling between 65 and 75 miles per hour on highways can save 10 percent to 20 percent on fuel costs. Keeping your car's maintenance current can help to keep it running at optimal capacity. Check your tire pressure and look for opportunities to batch errands. Carpool, take public transportation or walk when possible.

Track sales at your local grocery stores and stock up on pantry and freezer staples when items are on sale and in stock. Shelf-stable items such as canned vegetables, legumes and grains can add volume to your meals for less money. Freeze produce, meats or some cheeses when you find them on sale. Meal plan before you go shopping and select recipes that will yield leftovers or that can be repurposed in multiple meals.

Be flexible when you shop for and prepare meals. Select store-brand products to save money. Explore adding meat- or dairy-free recipes to your menu to cut costs on higher-priced ingredients. When you look for small ways to save money on everyday essentials, you can stretch your dollars.
