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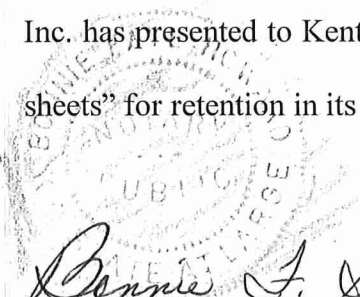

against it. Residents along the road who claim their properties vacated their concerns and frustrations with the state of their neighbors' properties as well. One resident, who identified himself as Mr. Merston, said he had been to city hall four times over the last couple of years to get the properties taken care of. He said because of the state of the neighborhood he was "embarrassed" to have people visit. In addition to the garbage and detritus in the yards, he said, one of the properties has a pool in the front yard - in violation of city ordinances - which he said created a safety hazard by blocking the view of oncoming traffic when exiting the neighborhood. Another neighbor, Mr. Harr, who owns property in the neighborhood, said he was, "fed up with the dogs down there." Harr said the dogs tear the garbage out "every Monday night" when it was put out for Tuesday morning pickup. He said he didn't know if they were turned loose purposely, or they just happened to get out before garbage day, but the result was a mess. He said one of the dogs, a

German shepherd that was not a stray, was aggressive towards children and other dogs, and had also chased an elderly neighbor into her home. Harr said there was also an issue with feral cats in the neighborhood, but they weren't as pressing or concerning as the dogs that were allowed to run free. One of the property owners whose property was the topic of discussion said he had received letters from the city, and talked with Hammer, and he "thought (he) had cleaned it up" to the city's satisfaction, but that he was addressing the other issues that had been raised with him. "It won't be much longer until it's cleaned up," he said. He is also the home with the pool, and said there was no room for the pool in the backyard area. He asked about the possibility of flipping his front and back yards to be in compliance with city ordinances, noting that he has entrances onto both yards, but councilman Troy Combs pointed out he had already defined the area with the pool as his front yard when he said the pool wouldn't fit in his back

yard. The property owner also claimed some of the garbage on his property on the dogs that tear into trash. But another neighbor said the problem was more than just daily trash strewn about by dogs. "I'm talking about junk, not trash," she said, noting that her complaint was with things like "old washing machines." "We're not talking about hamburger packages," she said. She also noted that she has baited moths, mice, and other vermin that she believes stems from the garbage that accumulates on adjacent properties. While the city took action to begin the process of dealing with problem dogs by adding a new position to the street department (see "Grayson adds animal control position" in this issue), Larry Doucet asked the city to consider having a dumpster placed in the neighborhood for garbage collection. If residents carried their trash to a central dumpster instead of individual receptacles, he said, they could mitigate the impact of loose dogs until the root of the problem could be addressed.

While some residents complained they couldn't carry their garbage several blocks to dump it - "we're old," one stated - Combs brought the issue before council, asking about the cost to the city to have a dumpster placed in the neighborhood. Councilpersons Terry Stamper and Sudy Walker said it wasn't the responsibility of the city to provide receptacles like a dumpster. But Combs countered that Grayson was a home rule city, and they could take action to place dumpsters in neighborhoods if they had the political will to do so. Council also discussed plans to add another street department employee, and to have that department handle dog complaints, which Stamper and Walker opposed as well. Councilman Jerry Yates joined with Stamper and Walker in opposing the hiring of another street department employee at this time, but said he thought the city did need to move on dumpsters, to help now," Yates said. "But I cannot go in favor of the

support holding the imposition of any fines for a period of two weeks, to give the property owners time to address the rest of the issues. After that time, he said, the city should look at the possibility of imposing the fines on any property owners who were still not in compliance. Councilman Bradley Cotten made a motion to that effect, moving to hold the fines for two weeks, and to continue to hold them if the property stayed in compliance, but not to waive them completely. That way, he said, the possibility of future fines could serve as a deterrent to property owners backsliding and allowing junk to accumulate on their land. Transportation crews to soon begin treating for noxious weeds

Treat select nuisance weeds found on adjacent state-owned right of way. The Cabinet targets 11 noxious weeds: Johnson grass, giant foxtail, Canada thistle, nodding thistle, common teasel, multiflora rose, Amur honeysuckle, poison hemlock, marestail, Japanese knotweed and kudzu. "Weeds are more than a nuisance - they pose safety concerns," said KYTC Secretary Jim Gray. "Actively treating the weeds on state-maintained property enhances driver visibility near roadways, prevents damage to ditches and drains and minimizes the presence of plants that attract deer near highways." Noxious weeds often invade and destroy the roadside turf grass, leaving these areas vulnerable to erosion. They can also smother native plants through rapid reproduction and long-term persistence. Kentuckians who want to request weed treatment must submit a written application to their local KYTC highway district office. Motorists are reminded to use extra caution when crews spraying for weeds are out on the roadways.

Games from A-2

Both Sony and Microsoft - who recognized the importance the internet would play in the future of gaming from the outset - have also realized that the future of gaming is not in hardware, it's in streaming and access to game catalogs. Like it or not, the future of gaming looks a lot more like Netflix than your old Nintendo GameCube. If the rumors are true, Sony is going all in on the streaming side and making PlayStation Now an integrated part of their PS Plus service, rather than a separate stand-alone service. This not only means all Plus subscribers could soon have access to that streaming catalog, on their PCs as well as their consoles, if existing Now

subscribers are converted to Plus, they could start playing online with their friends. For subscribers to both services it could mean a small savings on their yearly or monthly subscriptions. It could also mean the PlayStation 6 could save a lot of money on hardware by skipping discs altogether, and offer a variety of hard drive sizes instead of local downloads and faster loading times. Microsoft already offers disc-free, download only versions of their latest Xbox consoles. But with a focus on streaming, which is where it looks like gaming is going, console manufacturers could save even more on hardware, while also maintaining even tighter control on their IPs.

It might not be ideal for all gamers - for instance what do you do if the internet is down? - and it raises serious questions about the ownership of titles that gamers pay for, and continued access to those titles. But there have been issues gamers have had to contend with since the beginning of digital downloads and associated digital rights management from content publishers. And, despite the problems, gamers seem to have embraced an online, digital ecosystem. In that ecosystem, streaming is the next logical step, even if it raises as many issues as it addresses. OLD FARMER'S ALMANAC Shamrocks & Four-Leaf Clovers: What's the Difference? Learn About the Symbol of Ireland and St. Patrick's Day!

Many of us remember hunting for that elusive "four-leaf clover" as a child, and we've all seen that green shamrock on St. Patrick's Day. That brings us to today's garden musings. Let's talk about what a shamrock really is—and what it isn't!

What Is a Shamrock? The shamrock is a symbol that we commonly associate with St. Patrick's Day and with Ireland. It can be seen all over St. Patrick's Day decor, representing the rebirth of spring. Sometimes, the shamrock is depicted as a four-leaf clover, but this isn't quite accurate. Traditionally, a shamrock is a three-leaf clover.

Why three leaves and not four? According to legend, St. Patrick used a three-leaf shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity, with one leaf representing the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, respectively. More recently, the four-leaf clover has also come to represent the Holy Trinity, with the fourth leaf symbolizing God's Grace.

The True Shamrock The word "shamrock" comes from the Irish word Seamróg, meaning "little clover" or "young clover," but there isn't a consensus on which species of clover is the "true" shamrock. In fact, there are a few plants that go by this nickname! In Ireland, the plants that are most often associated with the name "shamrock" are the suckling clover (Trifolium dubium) and the white clover (Trifolium repens). Both clovers are native to Europe, but can be found throughout the world today. Their genus name, Trifolium, means "three-leaf clover"—an appropriate description!

According to Encyclopedia Britannica, a number of other similar-looking plants go by the name "shamrock": "Shamrock [refers to] any of several similar-looking trifoliolate plants—i.e., plants each of whose leaves is divided into three leaflets. Plants called shamrock include the wood sorrel (Oxalis acetosella) of the family Oxalidaceae, or any of various plants of the pea family (Fabaceae), including white clover (Trifolium repens), suckling clover (T. dubium), and black medic (Medicago lupulina). Wood sorrel is shipped from Ireland to other countries in great quantity for St. Patrick's Day."

As mentioned, "shamrock" can also refer to a plant called common wood sorrel (Oxalis acetosella). Wood sorrel looks very similar to clover, though the plants are not related. Tropical relatives of wood sorrel are often sold in stores as "shamrock" houseplants, since they're better suited to the indoor environment than clover species are.

How Rare is a Four-Leaf Clover? Why Are They Lucky?

As kids, we would spend hours searching for that lucky four-leaf clover—and often come home empty handed! A four-leaf clover isn't a special variety of clover; it's just an unusual mutation of a three-leaf clover, but it's a "lucky" symbol because it's so hard to find. In fact, your chances of finding a four-leaf clover are 1 in 10,000! That's where the luck comes in, apparently. According to popular lore, if you do find a four-leaf clover, giving it to someone else doubles your luck.

Traditionally, four leaves were considered lucky because they reflected the shape of a cross and were thought to be magical or sacred. It's supposedly told a four-leaf clover with her when she was banished from the Garden of Eden, too. In the Middle Ages, it was believed that carrying a four-leaf clover would enable you to see fairies, recognize witches and evil spirits, and be protected from the evil eye. Even dreaming of clover was supposed to bring good luck.

Superstitious aside, clover is a valuable plant in many ways. Hees and other pollinators can't resist his flowers (red clover is especially attractive to bumblebees), and the plants can be turned into the soil as green manure, too. Additionally, the roots host nitrogen-fixing bacteria that enrich the soil, and the plants are high-quality forage for many animals. The reasons to grow clover are endless!

The Value of Clover

In recent years, the idea of growing clover has been making a comeback. White clover (Trifolium repens) is well known for crowding out broadleaf weeds while growing harmoniously with grass. It will thrive in areas that are poorly drained or too shady for a conventional lawn, making it a great grass alternative.

As a legume, clovers have the ability to convert nitrogen into fertilizer using bacteria in its root system (a process called "nitrogen fixation"), practically eliminating the need for additional fertilization.

Despite today's push for perfectly green lawns (which often involves a lot of chemicals), clover was not always viewed as a "weed." The University of Minnesota Extension Service points out that, until relatively recently, it was standard practice to include clover seed in lawn seed mixes. Until the 1950s, clover was included in lawn seed mixes, as it was regarded as a prestigious lawn plant. It may be considered an attractive, low-maintenance ground cover that is soft to walk on, mows well and will fill in thin spots in a yard. Today, it seems clover is returning as a more eco-friendly lawn alternative. Since it is nitrogen fixing, it can supply its own nutrients to poor soil. Overseeding clover seed into your existing lawn is an easy way to establish a clover lawn. For lawns, the most popular is the white clover because it is relatively low growing, tolerates close mowing, and outcompetes weeds

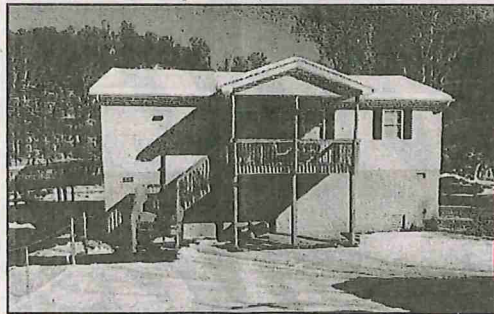

Money Tip for Students, March 2022

First-time federal student loan borrowers must complete entrance counseling

Kentuckians who are borrowing their first federal student loans for the coming academic year must complete entrance counseling, according to the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA).

"Many students take out loans to help them pay for higher education," said Gov. Andy Beshear. "If you apply for a loan, entrance counseling can help you make sure you understand the responsibility that goes along with borrowing money and have a plan for repaying the loans."

The U.S. Department of Education requires borrowers to complete entrance counseling before they can receive loan funds.

The department offers online counseling at studentaid.gov under the Complete Aid Process tab. The counseling should take between 20 to 30 minutes. Borrowers should check with their college to see if the federal counseling session is accepted as some schools have alternate counseling program requirements.

KHEAA is the agency that administers the state's grant and scholarship programs, including the Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES). The agency also provides free copies of "It's Movey, Babv." a guide to financial literacy, to Kentucky schools and

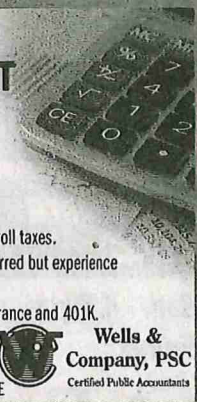

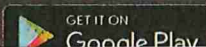

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911 Wireless Phone Calls in Wilderness Areas

Who will I reach?
You need to know that wireless telephone service may not be available in the wilderness. If service is available, your 911 call for help will be picked up by the nearest cellular tower in the most direct line of sight to your location.

It could be picked up at a county 911 centers or by a State Police dispatch. Since these call answering centers are all located outside the boundaries of the calling area, they would have no way of knowing from where you are calling unless you tell them. Be prepared to provide your location. Remember, help may be several hours away or longer. Use 911 only in case of an actual emergency. Remember to:

- Start out with a fresh, fully charged battery and carry extra charged batteries with you. Keep batteries warm for extra-long use.

- Be prepared to give complete information about the nature of the emergency.

- You may only be able to make one call. Turn the phone off when not in use.

- Establish a call schedule with the emergency center so there are specific times when you will have your phone turned on to receive calls or to make calls out.

Be sure you know:
•Your location, including the trailhead and nearest city, destination or waypoints.
•Your wireless telephone number, including the area
