**New Drinking Water Regulations and How They Will Impact Your Utility

Drinking water regulations are always subject to change, sometimes in substantial ways. The United States Environmental Protection Agency has proposed significant changes to the Lead and Copper Rule. New requirements for utilities to identify and map all known sources of lead in their distribution system will potentially be costly in terms of dollars and manpower. The maps, along with new requirements for testing schools and day care centers, will mean utilities are also going to encounter major customer outreach challenges. Other regulations, such as upcoming PFAS/PFOS regulations also have the potential to significantly burden utility finances. Commissioners will have to stay ahead of this curve to meet these challenges.
