Notice of Filing of Proof of Publication

Kentucky Power Company gives notice of its filing of the following documents in conformity with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b)(6):

- (a) The August 3, 2022 affidavit of Rachel McCarty, Advertising Assistant, Kentucky Press Service, Inc., including list of publications and publication dates;¹ and
- (b) A copy of the accompanying newspaper “tear sheets,” verifying the contents of the required notice of hearing and that the notice was published.

The *Booneville Sentinel*, the paper of record for Owsley County, Kentucky, failed to publish the notice as requested. When contacted by Kentucky Press Service the *Booneville Sentinel* acknowledged it received the request to publish the notice in time to be published on July 27, 2022 and thus within the prescribed window. The *Booneville Sentinel* indicated it failed to publish the notice because of human error. The Kentucky Press Service subsequently confirmed that the *Booneville Sentinel* published the notice on August 3, 2022.

¹ Because of the flooding in the Company’s service territory, the Kentucky Press Association was unable to confirm the timely publication of the notice in *The Hindman Troublesome Creek Times*, the paper of record for Knott County, Kentucky, and the *Leslie County News*, the paper of record for Leslie County, Kentucky, prior to August 3, 2022. Because of the delay by the *Booneville Sentinel*, the paper of record for Owsley County, Kentucky, in publishing the notice of hearing until August 3, 2022, the Kentucky Press Association was unable to confirm the timely publication of the notice by that paper prior to August 3, 2022.

Kentucky Power is concurrently filing a motion for leave to deviate from the Commission's July 13, 2022 Order and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b)(6) with respect to the August 3, 2022 publication by the *Booneville Sentinel* of the notice of hearing.

A SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE 2022-01 AMENDING THE OCCUPATIONAL TAX (PAYROLL DEDUCTION) EMPLOYEE LICENSE FEE TAX FOR THE CITY OF OLIVE HILL, KENTUCKY

SUMMARY

Ordinance 2022-01 is an Ordinance amending Ordinance 2017-06 and setting the occupational tax (payroll deduction) employee license fee tax for the City of Olive Hill, Kentucky to an amount equaling Two Percent (2%).

The occupational tax (payroll deduction) employee license fee tax is imposed for the privilege of engaging in occupations, trades, professions, businesses or other undertakings within the City. It applies to all work done or services performed within the City, whether a resident or non-resident. It is the employer's obligation to deduct from the pay due any employee the amount of the license fee measured by the compensation due each employee multiplied by two percent (2%) and paid to the City Clerk on a quarterly basis.

The amounts deducted shall be paid to the Clerk on a quarterly basis. This applies only to compensation for work within the City. If the compensation is a mix between work performed inside the City or outside of the City, the amount paid to the City Clerk shall be attributable to the portion for services performed within the City. Travel outside the City for seminars, training sessions, business meetings of conferences of similar purposes, when done by a full-time employment within the City shall be includable as services performed within the City. Compensation received from federal,

state, county, and municipal government agencies is subject to the provisions of this Ordinance. Exemptions have not been established except any which may be identified by Statute.

Failure or omission of the employer to comply with the Ordinance will result in removal of the employer's business license (permit) to operate within the City. The failure or omission of the employer does not relieve the employee from the payment as required by this Ordinance. The employer shall file a return by January 21 of each year a showing of the adjusted taxable gross amount of compensation of each employee and the amount of the license fees deducted and paid by the employer for the preceding calendar year, and the last known address of each employee. The employer shall furnish a statement showing the total amounts deducted to the employee on or before January 31 of each year.

It is the City Clerk's obligation and duty to collect and receive license fees imposed by this Ordinance and keep records showing the amounts from each employer. The City Clerk, under the Mayor's direction, is empowered to adopt and enforce regulations pertaining to the provisions of the Ordinance, including but not limited to the re-examination and correction of returns if there is overpayment or underpayment.

Employers are required to keep true and accurate records/returns. Only the City Clerk or other agent or employee designated by the mayor and approved by city council are authorized to examine records to determine accuracy or, if no return was made, to ascertain the amounts due under the terms of this Ordinance.

All information requested as a result of returns is confidential except for official purposes in accordance with proper judicial order or otherwise provided by law. Any person or agent divulging confidential information is subject to appropriate actions and liable to the aggrieved party as provided by law. The City may disclose or receive information to the commissioner of revenue of the Commonwealth or duly authorized agent. The City may publish statistics based upon the information in a manner that will not reveal data with respect to the individual returns of an individual or employer.

If the license fees imposed remain unpaid when they come due it shall bear interest at the rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum and any person who fails to pay license fees when due will be charged a penalty of five percent (5%) of the unpaid amount. If a person or an employer fails or refuses to pay fees after withholding the same shall be liable to the City for the unpaid amount and interest at the rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum. Any person or employer who fails, neglects or refuses to withhold funds, file any return or sworn statement, fails to pay fees to the City or refuses to permit the City Clerk or designated person to examine records, or shall knowingly make an incomplete, false or fraudulent return or do anything whatsoever to avoid full disclosure shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor under the jurisdiction of Carter County District Court.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the general expenses of the City. All fees collected shall be paid into the general fund.

one of the various technicians working on the truck had dropped a screwdriver into the engine and – either through oversight or negligence – left it there. It was apparently fine there for a while, until it bounced around, hit the cooling fan, and was knocked into the radiator, where it caused a hole.

The truck has been repaired by multiple shops, and a roadside assistance service over the past several months, Loperfido said, and there is no way of knowing who left the screwdriver under the hood of the truck.

"We've had three different shops service it, and one roadside service, so we're not sure who's responsible," he said.

Loperfido also reported that the service has run into an issue with Rowan County refusing transports back to Carter County. Patients at St. Claire who need rides back home to

discharged are not being serviced by Rowan County ambulances, he said. Instead the patients have to wait until a Carter County ambulance is available – either during a lull in activity or after transporting a patient to the same hospital. It's an issue that he knows have troubled some families, whose relatives have had long waits to get home after being discharged. But, Loperfido added, the emergency ambulance service has to balance emergency calls with transport requests. Emergency calls, he said, are always going to take precedence.

Valerie Nolan noted during her financial report that, with the new billing company the ambulance service is utilizing, they are now bringing in more money from billing than they are in tax revenue from the county, an important step in financial stability for them,

months, Nolan reported, patient revenue has increased by more than \$440,000 and they ended the last fiscal year with \$60,485.16 more in income than budgeted for. While payroll is still consuming a significant chunk of that income, at just over 73 percent and more than \$4,000 over budget for the month of June, and \$113,000 over budget for the year, the billable income is up for that period too. The ambulance service brought in a total of \$1,256,343.82 in tax revenue last year, and just under \$2 million – \$1,968,990.74 – in patient revenue. That's even with monthly write-offs of several thousand dollars for charity applications. In June, for instance, the charity application write-offs came to \$5,473.02 for deceased patients, Nolan said.

Gardening in hot weather, chicken predators

Stay Safe: Tips for Gardening in Extreme Heat - 7 sensible tips to cope with heat when gardening by Robin Sweater

If you like to garden, be careful in extreme heat. Here are seven sensible tips to keep in mind during hot and humid weather. Whether you like it hot or not, it is important to take care while working outside.

I like hot summers, but I know that my opinion is in the minority when I hear my fellow gardeners complaining about the heat and humidity. Here's how to cope with the heat when you're in the garden:

1. Do your heaviest work early in the morning, as early in the day as possible, or in the evening. It's good for both you and the plants. Take a cue from South American and Mediterranean countries where it is siesta time from 11 to 2 in the afternoon. Sit in the shade, relax and enjoy your garden, listen to the birds and watch the butterflies. The weeds will still be there waiting for you once the day cools down.
2. Slow down and ease yourself. Take frequent breaks. It's okay if you can't get as much done during a hot, muggy day as you can on a cooler day.
3. Keep hydrated. Drink plenty of cool water before, during and after working outside. Don't wait until you are thirsty to drink. And no alcohol. It just dehydrates you. Get in the habit of bringing a water bottle with you if needed. Drink in small sips to avoid getting waterlogged. If you're feeling dehydrated, consider a sports beverage which will place the salt in your sweat on your skin.
4. Don't forget the sunscreen! Apply the sunscreen 30 minutes before going outdoors. (I apply when I get up in the morning as part of my routine.) You may have to reapply it after sweating.
5. Wear a hat. A proper sun hat shades not only your face but your ears and neck as well. Wear light-colored clothes to reflect sunshine, too.
6. Tie a wet bandanna around your neck or even drape a wet cotton dish towel over the nape of your neck. If you have considered buying one of the fancy cooling towels, save your money. Consumer Reports tested several along with an ordinary kitchen towel (smooth, not Terry cloth) and found that they only varied by about 2 degrees. Better yet, top the wet bandanna or towel into the fridge or freezer for a while.
7. Go inside if you feel yourself getting overheated or breathing too heavily. Take a cooler shower or spray yourself with the garden hose!

Protecting Chickens From Predators

When I am asked what the most difficult aspect of raising backyard chickens is, without hesitation, I respond, "Keeping them safe from predators." If you keep chickens long enough, eventually you'll have a run-in with a predator. Learn more about protecting your chickens.

Unfortunately, chickens are very low on the food chain and pretty much everything wants to eat them. No matter where you live, you have to worry about predators. They exist in urban, suburban, and of course rural areas, and are always on the lookout for an easy meal. But realistically, it's not a losing proposition to raise chickens. It's just a matter of being smarter and more vigilant than the predators.

Nocturnal Predators

Fortunately, most of the common predators are predominantly nocturnal and hunt mainly under the cover of darkness. It's rare to see a raccoon, opossum, weasel, coyote, fisher cat or wolf out and about during daylight hours, although a hungry or sick animal can become desperate and emerge from hiding. Locking your chickens up in a coop with latches on the doors that even a wily raccoon can't open is your best line of defense against a night attack. Windows and vents should be covered with 1/2" x 1/2" welded wire to prevent even the smallest of weasels from gaining access. (Chicken wire is useless as window covering since a raccoon or other animal can easily chew through it.)

Solar-powered blinking lights installed around the perimeter of the coop can help to keep wild animals at bay, since they believe the red lights are the eyes of another predator. If you can't be home until later in the evening, an automatic coop door is helpful since it shuts as dusk approaches once the chickens have all gone to roost.

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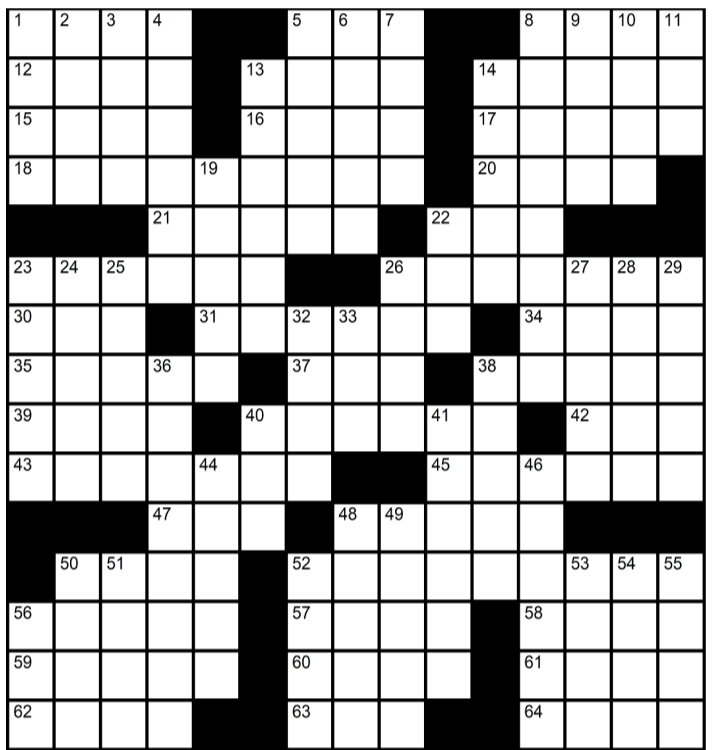



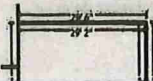

I bought a 2022 Subaru Forester back in December. I also paid to have the dealer install a trailer hitch. Well, all these months later, I've been getting the runaround from Subaru of America and the dealership saying that they don't know when the hitch for the 2022 Forester will be available.

So, do you think it would be safe to get U-Haul or another trailer company to install a hitch, or would it be better to wait and have the dealer install a Subaru-approved hitch?

The dealership claims that the Subaru hitch would
