SECTION 90.07 WHEREAS, the City Council has heretofore adopted an ordinance regarding the keeping of live-stock and fowl; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Calhoun has elected to amend said ordinance. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT OR-

DAINED that Section 90.07 · Keeping of Livestock and Fowl Prohibited, is hereby amended as

follows §90.07 KEEPING OF LIVE-STOCK AND FOWL PROHIB-ITED

(A) Definition. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the con-text clearly indicates or requires a

different meaning. ANIMAL UNIT. Any one of the following: One horse, one mare and suckling colt, one mule, one cow, one bull, one steer, one cow and suckling calf, one heifer, one hog, one pig, two ponies, two ponies with their suckling colts, five sheep, five goats, more than ten but less than 100 chickens, 75 ducks, 75 geese, 50 turkeys. PONY. A horse that weighs 650

pounds or less. (B) In order to regulate and re-strict the keeping of cattle, horses, mules, ponies, hogs,

chickens, ducks, geese, sheep and goats in the city limits, and to promote the public health and general welfare of the residents of the city, it shall be unlawful for

any person, firm, corporation, and/or organization to keep, harbor or maintain any animals set forth above, on or about their premises, unless the resident maintains at least one acre of pasture for each animal unit or portion thereof. A resident may, however, keep a maximum of ten hen chickens, but no roosters, on any lot of at least 10,000 square (C) The Chief of Police is hereby

authorized, and it shall be his or her duty, to enforce the provisions of this section.

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#### PLANNING AND ZONING ORDINANCE 04-2022

SUMMARY OF Ordinance Outlining Planning and Zoning

An ordinance of the City of Sacramento, Kentucky, enacted in accordance with a Comprehensive Plan and the Provisions of Sections 100.201 and 100.207, Kentucky Revised Statutes, dividing the City into zoning districts, encouraging, regulating, and restricting therein the location, construction, reconstruction, alteration and use of structures and land; promoting the orderly development of residential, commercial, industrial, recreational, and public areas; providing for adequate light, air, and convenience of access to property by regulating the use of land and buildings and the bulk of structures in relationship to surrounding properties; limiting congestion in the public right-of-ways; providing the compatibility of different land uses and the most appropriate use of land; providing for the administrative officers as provided hereafter, and prescribing penalties for the violation of the provisions in this ordinance or any amendment thereto, all for the purpose of protecting the public health, safety, comfort, and general welfare; and for the repeal thereof.

All prior ordinances and regulations promulaged by the City of Sacramento, to the extent same conflict with this Ordinance 04-2022, are hereby revoked and rescinded

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be administered by a Planning and Zoning Administrator, appointed by the Mayor

In order to ensure fair treatment of all citizens the following fee schedule for building permits will be enforced by the Zoning Administrator:

Mobile homes	\$50.00
Homes (priced under \$50,000)	75.00
Homes (priced over \$50,000)	100.00
Garage	20.00
Commercial	1.00 per thousand
Industrial	1.00 per thousand

Section 401 Penalties for violation

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined not less than five (5) dollars nor more than fifty (50) dollars for each offense. Each day such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense

This City shall establish a schedule of fees, charges and expenses and the collection thereof for all matters pertaining to planning and zoning

In their interpretation and application, the provisions of this ordinance shall be held to the minimum requirements, adopted for the promotion of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare. Wherever the requirements of this ordinance are at variance with the requirements of any other lawfully adopted rules, regulations, ordinances, deed restrictions or covenants, the most restrictive or that imposing the higher standards, shall govern.

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COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY MCLEAN COUNTY FISCAL COURT SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS TO ORDINANCE 21.230-1 THE MCLEAN COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

The McLean County Fiscal Court adopted the following amendments to Ordinance No. 21.230-1.

Section 5.16 B is amended to allow the supervising official along with the Judge-Executive to select job candidates to be presented to fiscal court for approval for hiring.

Section 5.29 is deleted in its entirety and the substituted is the following:

SECTION 5.29 FUNERAL (BEREAVEMENT) LEAVE

When an employee's immediate family member dies, the Fiscal Court allows up to three (3) days off with pay. Immediate family member, as defined for bereavement, is defined as parents, grandparents, spouse, brothers, sisters, children, grandchildren, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, parent or step-parent of spouse, step-parent, step-child, foster parent or foster child.

When an employee's extended family member dies, the Fiscal Court allows up to eight (8) hours off with pay for the day of the funeral. If the funeral service falls on a weekend or holiday, the employee shall be allowed to take the 8 hours off with pay on the day preceding or the day following the weekend or holiday. No additional compensation will be provided if the employee does not take the funeral (bereavement) leave. Extended family member is defined as brother in-law, sister-in-law, niece, nephew, grandparent of spouse, great grandparent or aunt or uncle of employee or employee's spouse.

In the event an employee desires to extend leave beyond the days set out above due to a death in the immediate or extended family, the employee may use sick leave, vacation leave or time without pay upon receiving approval from the Judge-Executive.

D. Supervisors should immediately notify the Judge-Executive when one of the employees in his or her department has a death in their family. The Fiscal Court will send a bereavement gift not to exceed SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$75.00) when an employee's immediate family member passes away. This condolence will be sent through the Fiscal Court secretary's office and not through the individual department

Section 5.35 B. is amended to remove the statement that the county does not contemplate the granting of compensatory time or the payment of overtime and substitute said language with the statement that Overtime will be authorized by documented approval by the Judge-Executive.

Section 5.46 D. is amended to remove the language stating that upon resignation an employee shall receive compensation for accrued vacation time.

Section 5.55 A. is amended to add that prior to atTanging for overnight travel, a travel request form shall be submitted to the county finance officer and the Judge Executive for written approval one month prior to the travel. Budgetary restriction will apply and detern line final approval.

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# **Bills promote better healthcare in Kentucky**

On Friday, Gov. Andy Beshear joined state lawmakers and health care advocates in the Capitol Rotunda to ceremonially sign six bills that provide Kentucky families with better access to health care.

The bills the Governor signed support lung cancer screenings and community health workers, and they improve access to dental care, mental health benefits. stroke care and medication.

"One of the reasons I became Governor is because I believe health care is a basic human right. I believe that government should do everything possible to make sure people have access to health care no matter where they live, no matter how old or young they are, no matter how much money they have," Gov. Beshear said. "Every Kentuckian should be able to get health care for themselves and for their families."

First, the Governor signed House Bill 219, sponsored by Rep. Kim Moser of Taylor Mill, which establishes a lung cancer screening program in the Kentucky Department for Public Health. The bill also sets up a lung cancer screening fund and a Lung Cancer Screening Advisory Committee, in order to catch the disease earlier.

"We worked really hard to get this bill through and it passed unanimously," Dr. Mike Gieske, a primary care doctor with St. Elizabeth Healthcare, said. "We are going after cancer with lung cancer screening, even what we find in the late stages. There is a tremendous amount of hope. We can make a big difference.'

"Kentucky Medical Association is thrilled to see House Bill 219 officially signed into law," KMA Executive Vice-President Patrick Padgett said. "Kentucky currently has the highest incidence rate of lung cancer in the U.S. and consistently ranks at the top of the list in lung cancer deaths. This legislation will increase lung cancer screening, reduce the state's morbidity and mortality from lung cancer, reduce the cost associated with treatment and raise public awareness regarding the benefits of screening. Lung health is a top priority for KMA members, and we thank the physicians who advocated tirelessly for this bill, as well as its sponsor, Rep. Moser, for helping see this important legislation cross the finish line."

Second, the Governor signed House Bill 525, which provides funding and other support for community health workers who work primarily in underserved communities. Community health workers help Kentuckians make the best possible health care decisions. They advise people on matters such as how to deal with chronic illness and assist them in learning about preventive care services.

"It is a step toward making a statewide system of navigation to improve access to health care," Rep. Moser said. "We have expanded Medicaid, yet there are still people who are not accessing care for a variety of reasons. We know that our community health workers are those individuals who can really connect the dots for individuals who are struggling."

Next, the Governor signed House Bill 237, co-sponsored by Rep. Moser and Rep. Lisa Willner of Louisville, which increases the number of mental health professionals able to treat patients, particularly in underserved areas. The bill also adds cultural and social training requirements for psychologists so they can better understand all the factors that influence their patients' decision-making, particularly when it comes to issues related to health and quality of life.

House Bill 237 follows two other mental health bills signed by the Governor last month: House Bill 127, which expands access to assisted outpatient treatment, and House Bill 562. which promotes mental health care for first responders.

"Thank you to Gov. Beshear, thank you to everybody that's here today, thank you to Rep. Moser for this really important bill to expand health care access to make it easier to attract and retain psychologists across Kentucky," Rep. Lisa Willner said. "As we have opened up access to mental health care through telehealth, it is so important that psychologists across the state have strong training and cultural determinants of health and social determinants of health, and that's what this bill does."

# Manfred defends treatment of minor league players

#### **BY RONALD BLUM** AP BASEBALL WRITER

LOS ANGELES - Baseball Commissioner Rob Manfred defended the sport's treatment of minor leaguers, prompting immediate criticism from a players' advocacy group.

"I kind of reject the premise of the question that minor league players are not paid a living wage,' Manfred told the Baseball Writers' Association of America before Tuesday's All-Star Game.

"I think that we've made real strides in the last few years in terms of what minor league players are paid, even putting to one side the signing bonuses that many of them have already received. They receive housing, which obviously is another form of compensation."

MLB raised minimum salaries in 2021, increasing Class A pay from \$290 to \$500 per week. Double-A from \$350 to \$600, and Triple-A from \$502 to \$700 over the roughly five-month season. Players are only paid in-season, with salaries ranging from roughly \$5,000-\$15,000 annually.

Amateur players residing in the United States and Canada who are selected in this week's amateur draft have slot values for their signing bonuses, which clubs use as guidelines, ranging from \$8.8 million for the first pick to iust under \$150,000 for the last selections of the 10th and final round. MLB says it spends about \$450 million each year on signing bonuses for first-year players.

Last November, MLB announced it was requiring teams to provide furnished accommodations, with a single bed per player and no more than two players per bedroom. Teams are responsible for basic

utility bills.

baseball players work second jobs because their annual salaries are insufficient to make ends meet," Harry Marino, executive director of Advocates for Minor Leaguers, said in a statement responding to Manfred. "His suggestion that minor league pay is acceptable is both callous and false.'

Papers filed Friday in federal court revealed MLB agreed to pay \$185 million to settle a lawsuit by minor leaguers. MLB agreed in the deal to rescind any prohibitions against teams paying wages to minor league players outside of the season.

"Most minor league perhaps 23,000 players could share the money with an average payment of \$5,000 to \$5,500, with \$55.5 million going to the players' lawyers.

Leaders of the Senate Judiciary Committee have asked Manfred to explain by next Tuesday the impact of potential legislation stripping the sport's antitrust exemption from covering the sport's relationship with minor league players.

# **Researchers: Chinese-made GPS tracker highly vulnerable**

#### **BY FRANK BAJAK** AP TECHNOLOGY WRITER

BOSTON - A popular Chinese-made automotive GPS tracker used in 169 countries has severe software vulnerabilities, posing a potential danger to highway safety, national security and supply chains, cybersecurity researchers have found.

A report by the Boston cybersecurity firm BitSight says the flaws could let attackers remotely hijack deviceequipped vehicles, cutting off fuel to them and otherwise seizing control while they travel.

The researchers say users should immediately disable the MV720 GPS tracker until a fix becomes available. The report was released Tuesdav to coincide with an advisory from the U.S. Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency listing five vulnerabilities.

data on vehicle location, they typically also monitor other metrics, such as driver behavior and fuel usage. Via remote access, many are wired to cut off a vehicle's fuel or alarm, lock or unlock its doors and more.

Using the MV720, which BitSight says costs less than \$25 per unit, a malicious user could remotely cut off the fuel line of a vehicle in motion, know a vehicle's real-time location for espionage purposes or intercept and taint location or other data to sabotage operations, said the principal BitSight researcher on the project, Pedro Umbelino.

He said multiple malicious

# **Governor Officially Announces 988 Suicide Lifeline**

By Tom Latek **Kentucky Today** Although the ser-

vice began last Saturday, Gov. Andy Beshear was joined by mental health advocates during a Capitol press conference on Monday to announce the launch of the new 988 hotline.

"The commonwealth is joining states across the nation in implementing the simple three-digit suicide and mental health lifeline," he said. "Calling or texting this number will connect Kentuckians facing risk of suicide, mental health distress, or addiction crisis, with compassionate and trained counselors, who

are ready to help." Like 911 and other national three-digit phone numbers, 988 was created to be easier to remember than a

ten-digit number, and make crisis care easier to access on a 24/7/365basis, free to callers.

"This number is the 911 of mental health," Beshear said. "Counselors respond to calls, chats or text messages directly from those who are in need, as well as Kentuckians who are concerned about a loved one or a friend who may need help."

In addition, to the phone number, there is also a companion web-988.ky.gov, to site.

help connect to the lifeline, or to learn more about it.

"This is another example of how this administration believes health care is a basic human right," he noted, "That applies to treating mental health the same way we do physical health."

Beshear said calling 988 connects you to one of 13 regional call centers around Kentucky. "With this change, we anticipate an increase in the number of calls, and that's a good thing; because we know there are a number of people out there who need help and aren't reaching out for it."
