Enclosed please find an Electronic Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN"), to enable Kentucky Utilities Company (the "Company") to apply for an electric franchise with the City of Glencoe (the "City") pursuant to KRS 278.020(4). Pursuant to Ordinance No. 2022-001, the City Council of Glencoe, Kentucky was directed to advertise for bids for the sale of an electric franchise in the City. The Company asks that the Commission enter an Order granting a CPCN to bid for and acquire a franchise from the City on or before April 8, 2022. The franchise to be obtained will replace the previous franchise.

6. Receipt of the requested certificate will allow KU to pursue its bid on a new franchise for which the City of Glencoe, Kentucky (the “City”) has solicited bids pursuant to resolution or ordinance and advertisement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

7. There is and will continue to be a demand and need for electric service in the areas of the City subject to the franchise, and KU desires to obtain a franchise in accordance with the bidding protocol established by the City.

8. Should KU be successful in acquiring said franchise, it will file copies thereof with the Commission.

WHEREFORE, Kentucky Utilities Company asks that the Commission enter an Order granting to KU a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to bid for and acquire a franchise from the City on or before April 8, 2022.

Amended Ordinance No. 2022-001
An ordinance of the City of Glencoe, Gallatin County, Kentucky, amending Ordinance 2021-007 creating a franchise for the erection, laying and maintenance of Electric Facilities and Appurtenant Facilities and Equipment in, along, and across the public ways, roads, streets, and alleys, and other public places in the City of Glencoe, Kentucky: for furnishing and selling electricity by means of said facilities; and providing for the sale of said franchise

Whereas, the City of Glencoe ("City") wishes to ensure that electric service continues to be furnished to its citizens in a reliable and efficient manner.

Whereas, the City is aware that the provision of such services requires the continued use of public streets, ways, alleys, and other public places;

Whereas, the franchise granted to and acquired by Kentucky Utilities Company on April 8, 2002, under which that utility provided such service, will expire by its terms on April 8, 2022;

Whereas, the city wishes to provide for the sale of a new franchise for the benefit of its citizenry, giving effect to Section 96.010 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes;

Whereas, the City has determined that language clarifying Section 5 of Ordinance No. 2021-007 is necessary to be consistent with standard language used by other cities and recognized by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS AMENDED BY THE CITY OF GLENCOE, GALLATIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. An exclusive franchise ("Franchise") to use the City's public rights-of-way, as agreed to by the City and the Purchaser of the Franchise, is hereby created.

Section 2. The franchise created by this Ordinance shall be bid in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and Chapter 424 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as well as applicable City Ordinances.

Section 3. The Franchise created by this Ordinance shall be awarded to the highest and best bidder as shall be determined by the City in its sole discretion. In awarding the Franchise, the City shall consider the technical, managerial, and financial qualifications of the bidder to perform its obligations under the Franchise.

Section 4. The winning bidder and the City shall negotiate, execute, and be bound by a Franchise Agreement. Such Agreement to contain terms "that are fair and reasonable to the City, to the purchaser of the Franchise and to the patrons of the utility" (KRS Section 96.010). Such Franchise Agreement shall become effective with the first billing cycle on or after the expiration of the existing Franchise Agreement. to

to develop appropriate procedures for identifying and reviewing the electric-consuming entities within the City's corporate limits.

Section 5. As compensation for these Franchises granted to the Company, the City shall receive payment of a total annual fee of three (3) percent of gross receipts per year from the Company's sale of electricity and natural gas to electric or natural gas-consuming entities inside the City's corporate limits; provided, however, that such fee shall be payable by the Company only if and to the extent the Company is authorized by the Kentucky Public Service Commission (or its successor) to pass through such fee to the entities served by it inside the City's corporate limits; and provided further, the City shall provide the Company a list, in electronic format, of all electric and natural gas-consuming entities within the City limits that are to be served by the Company, which list shall be updated annually.

Section 6. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement, as applicable.

Section 8. Time is of the essence in carry out terms and provisions of this Ordinance and the Franchise created herein.

This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage and publication according to law. Read at a meeting of the Glencoe City Council on the 14th day of February, 2022; a second reading was held on the 16th day of February, 2022.

SUMMARY: Notice is given that the Rural Utilities Service (RUS) has made a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) with respect to a request for possible financing assistance for East Kentucky Power Cooperative (EKPC) for the Boone-Williamstown 69 kV Transmission Line Rebuild Project located in Boone, Gallatin, and Grant Counties, Kentucky.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The proposed project consists of rebuilding the existing 28.4 mile electric transmission line that is located on private properties in portions of Boone, Gallatin, and Grant Counties, Kentucky. The proposed project will occur within the existing 100-foot-wide ROW easement, which encompasses roughly 344.2 acres. The proposed project will consist of removing the existing transmission line and associated wood pole structures and constructing the new line in its place. Alternatives that were considered by RUS and EKPC, and that are included in the EA include the No Action Alternative and the proposed project.

The availability of the EA for public review was announced via public notice in the Gallatin County News on January 19, 2022, and January 20, 2022; the Boone County Recorder on January 20, 2022, and January 27, 2022, and the Grant County News, on January 20, 2022, and January 27, 2022. The EA was available for public review at the USDA website and at the Grant County Library at 201 Barnes Road, Williamstown, KY 41097. No comments were received during the 14-day comment period that extended from January 19, 2022 to February 4, 2022.

Based on its EA and commitments made by EKPC, RUS has concluded that the project would have no significant impact (or no impacts) to water quality, wetlands, floodplains, land use, aesthetics, transportation, or human health and safety. RUS has concluded that the proposed project would have no adverse effect on historic properties listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. RUS has also concluded that the proposed project will have no adverse effects to federally listed threatened and endangered species, candidate species, or federally designated critical habitat. The proposed project would not disproportionately affect minority or low-income populations.

No other potential significant impacts resulting from the proposed project have been identified. Therefore, RUS has determined that this FONSI fulfills its obligation under the National Environmental Policy Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.), the Council on Environmental Quality Regulations (40 CFR §§ 1500-1508), and USDA Rural Development's Environmental Policies and Procedures (7 CFR Part 1970) for its action related to the project.

RUS is satisfied that the environmental impacts of the proposed project have been adequately addressed. RUS's federal action would not result in significant impacts to the quality of the human environment, and as such, will not prepare an Environmental Impact Statement for its action related to the proposed project.
