Potential Air, Water and Waste Permitting Requirements

All necessary air, water, and waste permits have been or will be obtained before construction and operation of the Project, as applicable, and may include the following:

No specific permits appear to be applicable to an onsite well or septic system, if included as a part of the O&M building.
