The Shelbyville Municipal Water & Sewer Commission (SMW&SC) Is providing notice that on February 15, 2021 a proposed increase in water rates was approved by the Commission, including wholesale water rates to Water Districts, and recommended these changes to the City Council which had their 1<sup>st</sup> reading on March 4, 2021, with the 2<sup>nd</sup> was held on March 18, 2021. This ordinance allowed the Commission to do annual increases of 2.5% annually to all water and sewer customers. The SMW&SC is in process of filing this week with the Public Service Commission the wholesale Rates it shall charge the West Shelby Water District. These rates will be effective for water service rendered on and after July 19, 2022. The proposed rates are as follows:
