In accordance with the requirements of the Kentucky Public Service Commission (*PSC*) as set out in In accordance with the requirements of the hentucky Public Service Commission (PSC) as set out in 807 KAR 5,069, Section 3, notice is hereby given to the customers of the Sandy Hook Water District ("District") of a change in water rates for users of the District's water system. The changes in water rates are required by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, acting through Rural Development ("RD") in connection with a loan by RD to the District in the principal amount of \$2,901,000 to be evidenced by the issuance by the District of its waterworks revenue bonds in such amount, which RD has agreed to purchase provided the District meets certain conditions of RD, including revising the water rates as set forth below:
