This presentation summarized the changes to Kentucky's Sales Tax exemption for

“residential” utility customers which becomes effective on January 1, 2023. The importance of complying with PSC Orders and the consequences of ignoring or disobeying those Orders was emphasized. Municipal Wholesale Water Rates and the information which municipal utilities need to provide the PSC to facilitate expedited approval of the proposed wholesale rates was discussed. Finally, the presenter emphasized the importance of keeping accurate Minutes of Board meetings.
