The Applicant's public involvement efforts began in early 2020 and have included two in-person public information meetings, individual meetings with local landowners, numerous meetings with local officials, and the creation of an official project website.

The official Project website was established in July 2022 and includes a general summary of the Facility, a preliminary map of the Facility Area, information on the date and location of the public information meeting, and a contact form to facilitate communication with a Bright Mountain representative. In early September 2022, Bright Mountain representatives gathered in the City of Hazard with local officials to announce a donation of \$20,000 to the Foundation for Appalachian Kentucky. The Applicant's donation was intended to provide aid in the wake of devastating flooding which occurred earlier in 2022.

The Applicant has held many meetings with local officials to establish an open line of communication regarding the Facility. Table 1, below, details the meetings that Bright Mountain representatives have held with local and state government officials and other local stakeholders.

An additional public information meeting was held on August 22, 2023, again at West Perry Elementary. The meeting was attended by local landowners, community members, and Perry County Judge/Executive Scott Alexander. 

2022-2023 Environmental Studies

AVANGRID continues to complete studies to determine the environmental feasibility of the site for a solar array. The team will conduct a review of the project with input from consultants that will include field work and consultation with federal and local agencies like USFWS and KDNR.

2022-2023 Kentucky PSC Permit




