We asked Stott's Construction to give a price on the relocation of the 6" line. This would prevent any issues for the CCWD as well as the Dollar General Store in the future. The price to move the 6" line would be \$17,500. This is an amount they are not wanting to pay. The Board told Matthew to get in touch with them and invite them to meet with the entire Board or at least a couple of the Board members to see if this issue can be resolved. The Board also proposed that they consider moving their entrance as to avoid any conflict with the existing 6" line.

Yaro Herman attended the Board meeting inquiring that the Board consider a line extension to his property on Crawley Road. Matthew will contact the John Phelps about running a line along the county road right of way. Matthew will also obtain the cost of materials and inform Mr. Herman the amount that he would be required to pay before this project can be completed.

Matthew inquired of the Board on behalf of David Cross. Mr. Cross is wanting to pay for a new line extension in Irish Bottom. The problem is that Mr. Cross is having trouble obtaining a signed easement from the current property owners in order to install this new line. He has proposed putting the water line in the middle of the road for a distance until the adjacent property has been bypassed. Matthew has already informed him that this was not an option but he wants a response from the Board. The response of the Board is that we will not put the water line in the middle of the road for any distance and that Mr. Cross must obtain signed easements before this project can begin.

The minutes of the December 28, 2020 meeting were approved on a motion by Mark Vibbert, second by Jay Cary; all in favor.

The Board performed the financial review and approved all checks that were issued.

Manager's Report: New meter reading equipment is working great. We used the new Mole at Sharp Point and it works great. Eisenberg off North 61 has low pressure. We will tie his line in after the pump station to solve this issue. The Board discussed performing leak detection for our customers past the meter. This would involve using our listening device only, no digging and no inside work. The PSC says that this would fall under a regular service call and that the \$35 service charge would apply if so decided. A motion to accept this new policy was made by Mark Vibbert, second by Jay Cary; all in favor. Matthew found a trailer that Eric Carver had for sale. A trailer to haul both our Ditch Witch as well as our mower on. Eric is asking \$2,000 for the trailer. A motion to purchase the trailer was made by Mark Vibbert, second by Jay Cary; all in favor with Eric Carver abstaining from the vote. We have not heard back from David Cross or Yaro Herman concerning the new line extensions they proposed.
