and have the opportunity to assist in the continued success of the premier program in college basketball."

UK still has an opening for an assistant coach that will also serve as one of the program's off-campus recruiters. Orlando Antigua and Chin Coleman currently hold two of those three positions, with the Cats still looking for a replacement for former Kentucky assistant K.T. Turner, who accepted the head coaching position at UT Arlington in March.

Longtime Calipari assistant Bruiser Flint also remains on staff and could fill the other new position made available through the NCAA rule change.

The Herald-Leader was told that Welch's duties will include opposition scouting and game planning, overseeing the program's on-court player development plans, and assisting with the team's offensive strategies. His role is expected to be similar, in some regard, to one previously held by John Robic, who was the longest-serving staff member over Calipari's coaching career - a total of 19 seasons as a full assistant, with stops at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky before parting ways with UK's program in 2021.

Welch, who was born in Maine and grew up in Las Vegas, played college basketball at Nevada before finishing his career at UNLV for the 1985-86 season. He worked for three years as a grad assistant at UNLV under Hall of Fame coach Jerry Tarkanian and then spent two seasons as a full assistant at Long Beach State.

When Tarkanian accepted the head coaching position at Fresno State, he made Welch one of his first hires and retained him for his full tenure with the Bulldogs from 1995 to 2002.

Upon Tarkanian's retirement in 2002, Welch moved on to the NBA. where he was an assistant coach with the Memphis

at those stops included Hall of Famers Hubie Brown and George Karl, as well as Doc Rivers, who was named one of the NBA's "15 greatest coaches" as part of the league's 75th anniversary honors in 2021.

Welch's tenure in the NBA ended in 2020, when the Clippers parted ways with Rivers, who landed the Philadelphia 76ers head coaching position. Welch was most recently the head coach of a professional team in Mexico.

WELCH-CALIPARI CONNECTION

While Calipari and Welch have never served on the same coaching staff, their relationship stretches back more than two decades, and it's clear that a mutual respect was quickly formed.

Calipari had been the head coach at Memphis for two seasons by the time Welch landed his first NBA job in the same city in 2002, as an assistant with the Memphis Grizzlies.

Following the 2002-03 basketball season, Welch called Calipari and said there was a junior college coach he wanted him to meet.

"I've always respected Johnny Welch," Calipari told Sports Illustrated in a 2008 story that recounted that meeting and what came next. "He's a Basketball Benny, knows coaches, studies the game. He says, 'Look, I've got a guy coming in here, and I want him to spend some time with you. You ought to look at his offense.'

Kentucky fans know that the term "Basketball Benny" – when used sincerely, as it was here is the ultimate compliment from Calipari, and the man Welch wanted him to meet that day -Vance Walberg – ended up having a profound impact on Calipari's coaching style.

Walberg was the innovator of what is now known as the dribble-drive motion offense, which Calipari adopted aspects of for his Memphis teams after meeting with the coach that summer. The offensive approach became synonymous with Calipari's Walberg, who was a high school coach in the city at that time.

'I've been around some unbelievable coaches Tark, Hubie Brown, Mike Fratello, now George Karl and Tim Grgurich – and I've learned as much from Vance as from anybody else," Welch told SI for that 2008 article.

Calipari was obviously smitten with Walberg's techniques, as well.

As Welch's career took him to several other NBA stops - and Calipari departed Memphis for Kentucky in 2009 -the two coaches remained in contact. And Welch has left behind a string of favorable impressions from some big names in professional basketball.

A 2012 profile in the Denver Post – toward the end of Welch's eight-year run with the Nuggets was filled with praise from those around the organization at the time.

"I don't want to talk about him — because I don't want any other team to take him," said general manager Masai Ujiri. "He's the best, he's the best in the NBA, there's no doubt about it. No disrespect to anybody, but he's the best player development coach in the NBA. He takes basketball seriously — his work, his trade."

Ujiri ended up winning the NBA Executive of the Year Award after that season and was later the architect of the Toronto Raptors roster that won the 2019 championship.

The praise for Welch also extended to the players.

"He pushes you — if you do a Welch workout, you know it," said Nuggets forward Corey Brewer, who won two national titles at Florida and spent 13 years in the NBA. "He's the hardest-working coach I've ever played with. He's there every day, constantly wants to work you out, tries to get you better. And that's what you need when you're a young team, no doubt about that."

WELCH AT KENTUCKY

Welch will be getting a young team next season in Lexington — a roster that features the No. 1-ranked recruiting class, headlined by presumptive starting point guard DJ Wagner, an electric offensive player who has shown an innate ability to slash toward the basket.

Figuring out the best ways to utilize Wagner's unique skill set — as well as those talented, if unproven, players around him - is likely to be at the top of Welch's to-do list starting with this summer's workouts.

"Point guards — he loves point guards — he teaches pick-and-roll stuff, angles," Karl told the Denver Post of Welch in 2012. "And when you defend this particular way, what your options are, what you have to do. The perimeter guys, he works with their footwork to get ready to shoot the ball. And he can handle the big guys very well, too. He does big-men footwork drills and catches. ...

"What I think he does very well is he takes what I want and incorporates it into his drills and repetition. John and I are very seldom not on the same wavelength."

A few years later, at the beginning of Welch's four-year run as a Clippers assistant, Rivers and NBA point guard legend Chris Paul were among those who praised his energy level, teaching methods and immediate ability to connect with players and gain their trust on the court.

"He's got the ear of a lot of our guys," Rivers said then. "The work has been noticeable, and it's been great."

While Welch's offensive style and teachings have evolved over the years, he's spoken at previous stops about playing fast and beginning the offensive attack early in the possession, a style that Calipari has had success with in the past, especially when he's had the type of point guards that Wagner projects to be.

"A big emphasis has just been: push the ball, play as fast as we can," Welch said while coaching the Kings' summer league team before the 2015-16 season. "We think every-

thing's easier early in the clock, whether it's penetrations, pick-and-rolls, post-ups - we want to get into it as fast as we can. Then sprint back and make the other team play half-court offense."

In that same interview, it was pointed out that Willie Cauley-Stein then an NBA rookie after three years at Kentucky had said that what Welch was doing was similar to the style he had played in Lexington.

"Willie's way ahead of the game," Welch said then. "Willie's done a great job of running the floor and getting down the court early, and then playing behind or under the defense. We try to penetrate a lot, and we want Willie right by the rim to - if we miss a layup - to tip it in. Or as a target on our penetration – to pass it to him for easy baskets."

UK's roster remains somewhat unsettled for the 2023-24 season, but Welch should have several talented and versatile players at his disposal while helping Calipari craft an offensive approach for this group of Wildcats.

Welch will also bring a trusted voice to Calipari's inner circle, an energetic coach who might just open up some new wrinkles to the way Kentucky plays moving forward.

"John Welch has been involved in every level of basketball and been an important part of the development of NBA careers for guys like Carmelo (Anthony), Pau Gasol, DeMarcus Cousins, Blake Griffin and Brook Lopez,' Calipari said Monday. "He loves the game and will be a tremendous asset to our young players and our staff. John has worked closely for decades with Vance Walberg, who developed the dribble-drive offense, and was a pioneer of bringing it to the NBA. With the strength of our guards and perimeter players we need to get back to that style of play.

"John will be involved heavily in our offensive strategy and will be our lead coach in on-court player development. We're excited to have him join our program."

High School.

It seems likely that Plummer will be Louisville's immediate starter with Allen vying with true freshman Pierce Clarkson to be the Cardinals' quarterback of the future.

With an established program, Stoops has not been as prolific in the portal as Brohm but has, by most accounts, done good work in addressing perceived UK roster weaknesses.

Included in Kentucky's 2023 transfer haul are four offensive linemen -Marques Cox (Northern Illinois), Courtland Ford (Southern California), Ben Christman (Ohio State), and Tanner Bowles (Alabama) — who figure to be "in the rotation" as UK seeks to rebuild an offensive front that lost its mojo in 2022.

Kentucky, too, used the portal to grab its presumed starting quarterback for 2023. Devin Leary, the former North Carolina State star, was generally considered the top QB in the portal at the time he committed to the Wildcats.

In former Vanderbilt standout Ray Davis (1,042 rushing yards last season with five touchdowns plus three receiving TDs), Kentucky also got its likely No. 1 running back for 2023 via transfer.

Brohm's mere presence

at U of L – coupled with the perception of early recruiting success - has energized what has, in recent years, been a downtrodden Cardinals fan base. Entering his 11th season

as Kentucky head man, Stoops (school-record 66 victories) put a charge into the Big Blue Nation by successfully luring popular offensive coordinator Liam Coen back to Lexington after the latter spent the 2022 season as OC for the NFL's Los Angeles Rams.

Coen's return is credited for UK's ability to land a top portal quarterback in Leary and a highly touted high school QB prospect in Bolev.

Bottom line: When one is starting a new program, there is more chance for dramatic action, which Brohm has taken.

Yet Stoops has seemed to make the right moves in addressing the problem areas that led to the Cats' disappointing 7-6 campaign last season.

He considers himself an overall obedient kid growing up, but like many, he was able to reflect on a few whippings along the way. Appalachian life taught him a little bit about everything. Raising cattle, working in the hay, tending to tobacco, and being in the garden were all a part of the Appalachian education young Veneable was imbued with. Though it was hard, he made sure to mention he enjoyed this time in his life much more than he does the new way of doing things. His grandparents taught him how to use what he had and to never let anything go to waste. It may have been more challenging, but it was smarter.

Canning and meat preservation are just a couple of chores that helped maintain Venable's family throughout the year. At the end of their harvest, they would have an abundance of vegetables, soups, meats, and fruits. And to reap

the rewards of their labor, his grandmother prepared an Appalachian smorgasbord when preparing meals. Flash explains that she wouldn't just prepare you a sandwich, but a fullon feast with all the fixings!

At 19 years of age, Venable enlisted into the United States Army during the Cold War and was placed

sergeants who were Vietnam veterans who stayed stern to their roots. He was present to watch the military service group go from old to new with several advancements and he picked up several skills that would shape his character as to who he is today. Surprisingly, he considers his 5 years of time and experience in the military as enjoyable

Today, Billie Venable continues to contribute to his community by carrying several roles. He is employed by the Jackson County Transfer Station as an equipment operator, assists in being a community dog catcher, and is a school bus driver. Overall, Venable is a hometime guy



that many would consider a treasure with his knowledge of the Appalachian way of life. He is firm in his belief that life in Appalachia is more than a dialect, but simply the way of life you have to experience to understand.

After three years of Medicaid enrollments piling up to a record number, those on the program must go through a renewal process

Kentuckians on Medicaid need to pay attention to any correspondence from the state's Medicaid program. The Department for Medicaid Services has resumed its annual renewal process for Medicaid members because the pandemic rules that allowed continuous enrollment have ended.

The process that allows Medicaid agencies to restart the annual renewals -- and kick off those who no longer qualify -- has been dubbed "Medicaid unwinding," a process that will take 12 months to complete, since it will use each Medicaid member's renewal month.

"We are currently outreaching to individuals with a May 31 renewal date. This means those individuals have until that date to renew with Medicaid," Susan Dunlap, spokeswoman for the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, said in an email.

"The most important thing Kentuckians on Medicaid need to be doing right now relating to the unwinding includes making sure we have upto-date contact information," Dunlap said. "That way, Medicaid can contact members about renewing, if needed. We are telling all our members to visit their account at kynect.ky.gov to review their information and make sure everything is correct. If they do not have an account, we recommend they create one." At a monthly stakeholder meeting in April, Deputy Medicaid Commissioner Veronica Judy-Cecil encouraged Kentuckians to use their Kynect health-benefits account for renewal. "It is going to be the fastest and easiest way for redetermination to be processed," she said. If not signed

up for Kynect, Medicaid members can complete and return forms via mail or fax, Judy-Cecil said. They can also call Kynect (1-855-459-6328) or the Department for Community-Based Services, or visit a DCBS office, a licensed insurance agent, or a Kynector, who helps Kentuckians enroll in coverage through Kynect.

As the Medicaid rolls have piled up with automatic renewals and additional enrollments, a record number of Kentuckians were enrolled in the program on April 1: 1,725,467. But in April, the state started informing people with May renewal dates that they needed to renew their membership and while we don't know all of the reasons for the drop, enrollment for May has already declined to 1,712,381. (For county-by-county enrollment numbers, click here.)

In April, the Medicaid department "estimated approximately 240,000 may lose eligibility" in the unwinding, health-cabinet spokesman Brice Mitchell said in an email. "However, until someone goes through redetermination, it is impossible to accurately forecast who will lose eligibility." been made and over 17,791 calls had been received related to renewals, according to the Public Health Emergency Unwinding website.

Judy-Cecil said Medicaid has prioritized contacting the Medicare-eligible population, since many Kentuckians stayed on Medicaid when they turned 65 instead of switching to Medicare. That was allowed because the national public-health emergency rules required the state to continue coverage to get extra federal funds.

The priority from July until the end of the unwinding will be to reach out to those on Medicaid who make too much money to stay on the program. Judy-Cecil said it's important to make sure this group is aware of the ability to get federally subsidized health insurance to maintain their coverage.

Judy-Cecil also wants providers to help out by reminding their Medicaid patients of their renewal date, which is available on each patient's KYHealthNet webpage.

Of that 240,000, an estimated 75,000 have incomes over 138% of the federal poverty level, the Medicaid limit, and are likely to qualify for federally subsidized health insurance through Kynect.

Judy-Cecil said the state will reach out to Medicaid members about 90 days before their Medicaid renewal end date. Members will also get a notice about 60 days before their renewal end date and if there is no response by the 15th of their renewal month, they will get another notice. Members will get a notice of eligibility, a renewal packet or a request for more information.

As of May 9, about 69,000 outreach calls had

AN ORDINANCE OF THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF GRANT, KENTUCKY RELATING TO AN AMENDMENT OF THE ORDINANCE REGULATING THE COLLECTION OF SUBSCRIBER FEES I MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR FIRE DEPARTMENTS

WHEREAS, the Grant County Fiscal Court has heretofore and on July 1, 2013 adopted an Ordinance Number 03-2012-656, pursuant to KRS 75.450 (7) requiring the annual membership charges and/or subscriber fees to be added to the property tax bills; and,

WHEREAS, the Magistrates of the Grant County Fiscal Court have sought to review the Ordinance for its' effectiveness in addressing the needs of the volunteer fire departments serving the residents of Grant County, Kentucky; and,

WHEREAS, the current Ordinance requires the Volunteer Fire Departments of Grant County to prepare an annual report showing the funds collected, yearly, and then report those findings to the Grant County Fiscal Court for review during the month of July of each year, approximately six (6) weeks after the May 15 deadline for membership dues modifications; and

WHEREAS, the Grant County Fiscal Court believes that the date (May 15) listed in the Ordinance was arbitrarily set with no direct correlation as to when the membership dues must be certified to the Grant County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Grant County Fiscal Court is now desirous of amending its ordinance to more closely align the date in the Ordinance to that date when the membership dues must be certified to the Grant County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Grant County Fiscal Court wishes to enact the amendment stated herein effective May 2, 2023;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of the County of Grant, Commonwealth of Kentucky, as follows:

That SECTION III, SUBSECTION B "Membership Dues/Subscriber Fees; Establishment of Fire District Fees" NOW READS AS FOLLOWS:

Section III: Membership Dues / Subscriber Fees: The following membership dues / subscriber fees shall be in place upon adoption of this Ordinance:

B. Establishment of Fire District Fees: Each Magistrate shall submit any suggested increase or decrease in the amount of the membership dues of each respective fire district, within their area, to the Judge Executive, in sufficient time that their proposal may be considered, and a new Ordinance passed, in time for the Court to certify to the Grant County Clerk, in writing, no later than May 15 of each year, the amount of the membership dues for each respective district. In the event a Magistrate fails to submit proposed changes to the annual dues of the fire district in time for passage of an Ordinance, before May 15, or if the new Ordinance does not pass, the dues for that fire district shall remain the same as the prior year and the County Clerk's Office shall rely upon same in the printing of property tax bills.

That SECTION III, SUBSECTION B "Membership Dues/Subscriber Fees; Establishment of Fire District Fees" SHALL NOW READ AS FOLLOWS:
