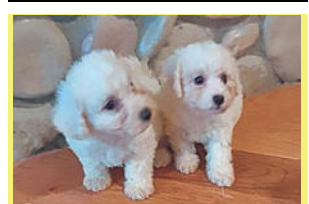

Kentuckians await court's decision on abortion bans

Two months after the Kentucky Supreme Court heard arguments over whether to suspend a pair of major abortion bans, state lawmakers, abortion providers and potential patients are all still waiting to see what the justices will do.

The court itself waited to fully consider the issue until Kentuckians voted on Constitutional Amendment 2, a proposal backed by anti-abortion activists and legislators that would've nixed abortion providers' core argument in a lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the state's near-total "trigger" ban and its prohibition on abortion after about six weeks of pregnancy.

Voters defeated that amendment in November, and the justices heard arguments a week later over whether it should temporarily block both bans and restore abortion access until the broader case over those laws' legality is decided.

Now Kentucky waits. "Many expected a ruling at the close of 2022. What legislation may or may not be necessary is unclear until the court makes its decision," Senate leadership told The Courier Journal in a statement. "While nothing prevents individual lawmakers from introducing legislation, Senate leadership's perspective is that the Kentucky Supreme Court must first speak on the matter."

A spokesperson for the Kentucky House's Republican leadership did not respond to emails and phone calls this week requesting comment.

The court could decide, at any time, whether to temporarily halt the trigger and six-week abortion bans even though newly elected justices have come on board since the case was heard.

Justices Angela McCormick Bisig and Kelly Thompson joined the court this month. They succeeded Justice Lisa-beth Hughes and Chief Justice John Minton Jr., both of whom retired. The new chief justice is Laurance VanMeter.

The two new justices could seek a follow-up hearing before reaching a decision, court spokesperson Jamie Neal said, but they don't have to do that.

"The change in the

composition of the Supreme Court does not impact its ability to rule on pending matters, including cases that were heard by the previous court," Neal said. "Although additional arguments may be scheduled if requested by the new justices, they will be able to read the filed briefs and watch recordings of the oral arguments."

Right now, the next date when the court is scheduled to release fresh opinions is Jan. 19.

Is abortion banned in Kentucky?

As of this month, Kentucky is one of 13 states where abortion has been largely outlawed since Republican-appointed justices on the U.S. Supreme Court reversed the 1973 Roe v. Wade ruling last summer and eliminated a nationwide right to abortion. As in Kentucky, many of those bans are being challenged through lawsuits.

What's next?

There's a lot of talk about what proposals conservative lawmakers in those and other states might pursue next.

In Kansas, for instance, where voters defeated an anti-abortion amendment last year similar to Kentucky's Amendment 2, leading Republican lawmakers have indicated they may pursue more abortion-related legislation this year.

Some anti-abortion groups in the U.S. have called for new laws that would restrict support for women traveling out of state for an abortion and prohibit contraceptive methods such as the emergency morning-after pill or intrauterine devices (IUDs), neither of which cause abortions.

However, it's uncertain if policies like those

will get any consideration from Kentucky's Republican-run legislature.

Have Kentucky lawmakers introduced any abortion-related bills in 2023?

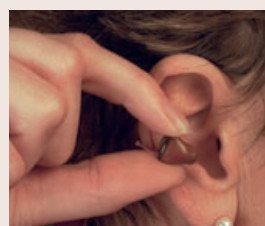
The state's legislators wrapped up the first week of their 2023 lawmaking session earlier this month without introducing any specific abortion-related bills.

The only bill any lawmaker has filed so far that could impact Kentuckians' access to abortion (if those bans ultimately are struck down in court) or to contraceptives is House Bill 58, a new version of a so-called "conscience" bill that would let health care providers, medical facilities and insurance companies refuse to provide or pay for any health care service — except for emergency treatments — that they say violates their conscience.

The legislature considered similar bills in 2020 and 2021 but didn't pass them. Opponents warned that it could limit patient access to a wide range of services, including abortion and contraceptives. (Right now, of course, abortion already is prohibited except in life-threatening situations.) State Rep. Steve Rawlings, a newly elected Republican from Burlington, said he developed this year's conscience bill based on existing legislation in other states and told The Courier Journal via email:

The legislature returns to session on Feb. 7. By then, the Kentucky Supreme Court may have decided whether to temporarily block the trigger and six-week bans — a ruling that apparently will inform the top Senate leaders' approach, at least, to abortion-related issues this year.

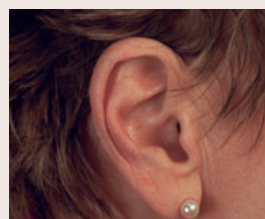

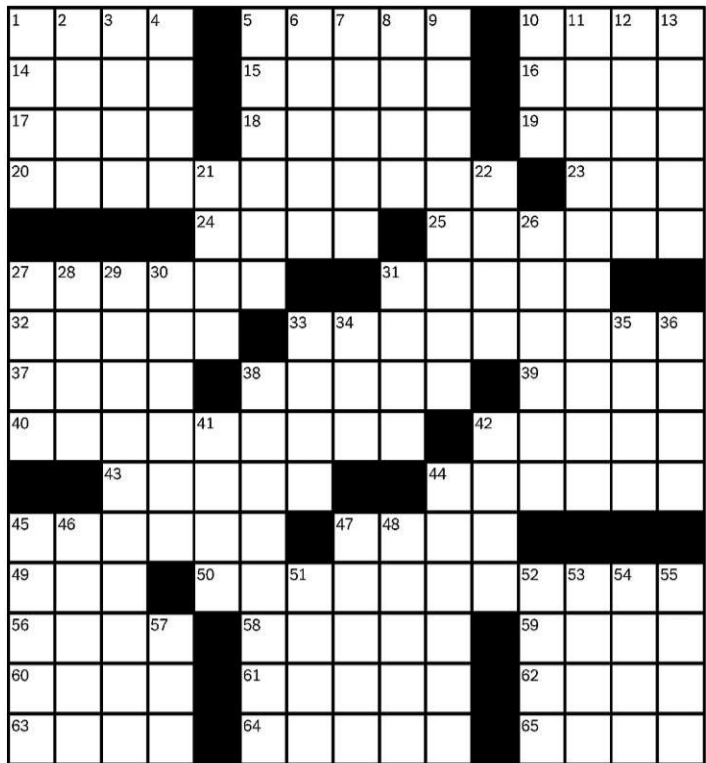

Anonymous: Understand this problem is entirely hers to solve. As you plant your feet on this truth, your actions can remain caring, loving and involved. Baylor out of women's poll for 1st time since '04

Baylor's 19-year run in The Associated Press women's college basketball poll is over. The Bears had been ranked for 365 consecutive polls before falling out Monday after losing twice last week. Baylor had been in the AP Top 25 since Jan. 5, 2004, including a 21-week run at No. 1 in 2011-12. Only Tennessee (565) and UConn (556) have had longer streaks in the 46-year history of the poll. The fifth-ranked Huskies' run in the poll is still active. While Baylor is sitting just outside the Top 25, South Carolina continued its stay at No. 1. The Gamecocks, who were the unanimous choice again from a 28-member national media panel, have held the top spot for 30 consecutive weeks. That streak ties UConn for fourth longest all-time. Ohio State moved up a spot to No. 2 after Stanford lost to Southern Cal on Sunday. The Cardinal fell to fourth. It's the Buckeyes best ranking since they were second in the final poll of the 2006 season. Ohio State has never been No. 1. LSU is third for the Tigers' highest mark since Feb. 27, 2006. The Tigers, who honored all-time great Seimone Augustus with a statue before Sunday's game, are one of three unbeaten teams left, joining South Carolina and Ohio State. The Gamecocks and Tigers meet on Feb. 12 in South Carolina. Indiana was sixth and Notre Dame seventh. Utah, UCLA and Iowa finished off the top 10.

Texas returned to the AP Top 25 at No. 25 after falling out of the poll in late November. The Longhorns started the season at No. 3, but an injury to star guard Rori Harmon sidetracked them early. They had a great week, beating then-No. 23 Kansas and then-No. 15 Iowa State last week. Colorado also entered the poll this week at No. 24, a year after the team's last appearance. The Buffaloes beat then-No. 14 Arizona on Friday, a week after handing Utah its first loss of the season. Arizona fell to 19th this week. Kansas also fell out of the poll.

STREAKING Maryland now has the second-longest active poll streak, having been ranked for 241 consecutive weeks. South Carolina is third with 198. Stanford and North Carolina State round out the top five, with 94 and 93 weeks, respectively.

FALLING WOLFPACK N.C. State dropped nine spots to 20th in the poll — its lowest mark since the
