Ken also reported that design, estimates, etc., are being worked on for submitting a request for funding of a water source to the Jellico Creek Community from Williamsburg sources. The Board requested that the Underwood Cemetery Road project be included with the application.

Also, the Board discussed the Buck Creek Road break where the water main is broken and valved off. The Board suggested that any breaks that had been valved off should be looked at and repairs initiated as soon as favorable conditions presented themselves.

C. Discussion of McCreary County Water District rate increase.

Chairman Meadors recognized guests Stephen Whitaker, Superintendent of McCreary County Water and Alan Robinson, engineer for McCreary County Water. During discussions, Mr. Whitaker noted that the rate increase should have been instituted when they raised the rates to the federal prison several months ago. Chairman Meadors asked

Mr. Whitaker if he could elaborate on the project that the new rates would cover. Mr. Whitaker said there is a 2 inch line that feeds the Marsh Creek area that's too small and is under very high pressure. In the course of the discussions, Chairman Meadors noted that the WCWD paid for the additional cost of installing a 6 inch main vs a 4 inch main along east highway 92 in McCreary County to serve the Jellico Creek community back in 2007 and that the WCWD had never asked for a break on cost due to the need of extensive flushing to maintain acceptable chlorine levels. He also noted that due to the extreme distance from the McCreary water treatment plant (about 20 miles) that water quality was difficult to maintain, particularly with Disinfectant By-Products (DBPs) during the summer and early fall seasons. Mr. Whitaker questioned the calibration status of the WCWD test kits. General Manager WCWD, Sandy Smith noted that the kits were calibrated once per month as recommended by Kentucky Division of water personnel. Chairman Meadors reiterated the point relating to flushing to keep chlorine levels acceptable and questioned McCreary's flushing claims stating that there was never any indication that flushing had been conducted at the blow-off/hydrant just past the WCWD Master Meter point on 3-C Loop Road. Mr. Whitaker claimed that they did do extensive flushing in their system to keep chlorine up. In the discussions, Mr. Whitaker indicated that the cost to produce a thousand gallons was \$4.50. Chairman Meadors asked if that included the cost of funded depreciation and Mr. Whitaker said it did. Chairman Meadors stated that he foresees a continuing issue with meeting DBP tests well into the future and that the WCWD had been looking at other sources for water, specifically the City of Williamsburg. He further stated that with the 94% (\$3.76 to \$7.29 per 1000 gallons) increase to the WCWD the incentive to find another source was escalated exponentially. In concluding the discussions, Chairman Meadors ask if McCreary could give an additional 30 days in order to allow WCWD time to process a pass-thru rate increase with the Kentucky Public Service Commission. He noted that the notice from McCreary was received a few days after the January Board Meeting. Mr. Whitaker said he would inquire with the PSC but doubted a delay in the rates would be legal or permissible. Chairman Meadors said that WCWD would appreciate anything they could do with a possible delay.

D. Engineering updates

Ken Taylor reported that there wasn't much to report since the last meeting. He did say that the Kentucky Bridge Replacement Program would be replacing a bridge on Imperial Hollow Road and that the WCWD staff would be doing the inspection of the main line relocation. He also stated the KyDOT would cover the costs.

E. Any other floor business

General Manager Sandy Smith reported that there had not been any applications for the Service Technician advertisement. After a brief discussion, the Board suggested advertising again and also doing a word of mouth for referrals and the possibility of contacting former employee Cody Mayne. Chairman Meadors stated that if Cody is considered for re-hire there must be a very clear understanding by him what is permissible and what is not during working hours, etc., of any employee.

Ken continued by stating that a Zoom Meeting was conducted by Dan Mullins and Jason Hawkins with the CVADD and participants from the WCWD, Ken Taylor representing the Cumberland Falls Highway Water District, Ron Herd with the City Utilities (Corbin), Mayor Roddy Harrison and Curtis Woods with the City of Williamsburg, Judge White with the Whitley County Judge's office and Michelle Stewart with Knox County Utility Commission.

After a lengthy discussion, all agreed to split the county amount of SB 36 money four ways between WCWD, CFHWD, Williamsburg and KCUC. \$1,331,833.28/4 = \$332,958.32 each.
