Unaccounted-For Water Loss Reduction Plan, Surcharge and Monitoring

Dear Ms. Bridwell:

The Lake Village Water Association Infrastructure Improvement Plan submitted as part of Case No. 2022-00325 includes the implementation of a Service Line Replacement Program for certain areas within the distribution system. The Infrastructure Improvement Plan includes the replacement of service lines located along Hughley Lane, Paradise Camp Road, Cedar Lane and Norman's Camp Road. Water Loss Surcharge proceeds have accumulated to \$36,106.58. The Association would like to begin replacing service lines in the areas identified in the plan, with Project 1 consisting of approximately 30-35 service lines along Hughley Lane and Paradise Camp Road.

The Association is requesting that the Commission consider the approval of the use of \$30,000 to cover the cost of the service line replacements. The Association will provide all of the material used for the replacement and will perform as much labor as possible. Due to workload and priorities such as the day to day operation and maintenance of the distribution system, constant leak detection and tasks related to the Contract 14 Distribution System Improvement Project construction activity, the Association published an Invitation to Bid for the labor portion of the Service Line Replacement Program. The Association received one sealed bid from AY Landscaping and Construction, Inc. AY Landscaping and Construction, Inc. will complete all road bores for the project and will assist Distribution Operators with service line replacements located adjacent to the water main. The Association anticipates that the project can be completed within 60 days of approval by the Commission.

There are important steps you can take to help your aging parents find health care and living assistance, and to secure financing for the cost eral modifications - some of sonal assistance.

Many adults have aging parents who are in need of health-care and living assistance. There are a number of resources today that can help them grow old gracefully, either in their existing home or in a facility, along with multiple options for financing the cost of the care.

Living Options:

Living Alone

Depending on the Independence of your parents, living alone in their existing house may be an option. However, you may need to make sev-

them expensive - to make their home environmentally safe and suitable for an aging person. For instance, imporight safety features such as a first-floor bathroom, grab bars in hallways and bathrooms, and an emergency response system may be necessary.

If your parent requires assistance with meals or chores, there are several services which can provide support, such as Menls on Wheels, which are free for anyone over 60.

Living with Family Some families choose to move an aging parent into their own home. If you can do this with minimal conflict, this can be beneficial as it avoids having to maintain a second home — and of course can be less expensive. If your purent has dementia or other health issues, adult day care can be helpful, as it allows them to socialize with other adults.

Assisted llying

If your parents are independent and can care for themselves, they may be eligible to enter a continuing-care retirement community, where they can rent (or purchase) an apartment and be eligible for nursing care, if it becomes necessary. Consider purchasing long-term care insurance, which can help pay for nursing home costs or the cost of on in-home aide.

Nursing home

If your parents need more extensive care and require a nursing home, research the options extensively. You may need to reserve a space far in advance, as waiting lists are often long at popular facilities. The government provides limited financial assistance for families paying for norsing home care. Financing longterm care can be a tremendous challenge for many adults.

Financing Long-Term Care

Medicate will only pay the full cost of professional help if a physician cerlifies that your parent requires musting care and if the services are provided by a Medicare-certified home health cure agency. However, Medicare will pay for nursing home care for the short-term only, with benefits restricted to low-income individuals with limited assets.

You can offset some of these costs, as you can claim a federal lax credit up to \$3,000 off the cost of in-home care or day care.

You can use a flexible spending account, too, which helps you pay for a certain amount of covered expenses with pretax dollars.

With the cost of elderly care continually on the rise, financial planning can be on important step in providing adequate support for your paients' future well-being.
