Response No. 2:

While preparing these responses to the Siting Board's data request, the applicant discovered the

application incorrectly identified the corporate entity of the proposed transferee. The application

on page 1 incorrectly identified the transferee as "Martin County Solar Project II, LLC"

(subsequently shortened to "Martin County Solar II"). The applicant hereby notifies the Board that

the correct name of the proposed transferee corporate entity is Martin County II Solar Project,

LLC. See attached certificate of authority for Martin County II Solar Project, LLC. The applicant

respectfully requests that the Siting Board recognize the reference to Martin County Solar Project

II, LLC on page 1 of the application as the correct entity name, Martin County II Solar Project,

LLC. Henceforth, the applicant will refer to the proposed transferee as Martin County II Solar

Project, LLC or "Martin County II." As described in Response No. 1, Savion, LLC is the parent

company to both Martin County Solar Project, LLC, and Martin County II Solar Project, LLC. See

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

Request No. 3:

Provide the corporate structure of Savion, Martin County Solar, and Martin County Solar II, if the

transfer is approved.

Response No. 3:

Savion, LLC is the parent company of both Martin County Solar Project, LLC, and Martin County

II Solar Project, LLC, and will remain the parent company of Martin County Solar Project, LLC

and Martin County II Solar Project, LLC if the Siting Board approves Martin County Solar Project,

LLC's transfer request.

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Request No. 4:

Provide the reasons, and support, for the division of the project into Martin County Solar and

Martin County Solar II.

Response No. 4:

There are three reasons for the division of the project. First, the project's development and

construction phases are lengthy, taking several years to complete the necessary environmental,

permitting, and real estate due diligence necessary to prepare the site for construction activities.

Former coal mines, like the project site here, present site-specific challenges that require additional

time and study. Thus, some portions of the site require additional time and study before they are

ready for construction activities to commence. In order to avoid delaying the start of construction,

Savion, LLC has proposed to bifurcate the construction certificate so that construction can

commence on the first phase of the project, while the remaining due diligence necessary for

portions of the property that will make up the second phase is being completed. Additionally,

although the power will all be injected into the AEP/PJM grid at the Inez substation, the Renewable

Energy Credits (RECs) may be sold to different parties. This bifurcation of the Construction

Certificate will allow for a more discrete project for each REC buyer. Finally, the project site is

split between two landowners. Bifurcating the permit will result in a phased project with project

boundaries aligning with landowner's property boundaries, which will create a more efficient real

estate review process for this complicated site.

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Request No. 5:

Provide the reasons why, if approved, Martin County Solar and Martin County Solar II cannot be

developed at the same time.

Response No. 5:

The phases of the project that would be constructed by Martin County Solar Project, LLC and

Martin County II Solar Project, LLC, respectively, are being developed simultaneously. However,

as described above in Response No. 4, the project's unique siting context has caused delays with

certain due diligence activities, resulting in a portion of the project falling behind its originally

anticipated construction schedule.

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Request No. 7:

Refer to the Application, page 5. Explain the environmental compliance that is necessary for the

project and the costs of that compliance.

Response No. 7:

The term "diligence" better describes the activities taken by the applicant related to environmental

conditions than "compliance." The applicant undertook extensive environmental due diligence

activities for the project. In addition to typical due diligence steps, the project conducted a thorough

search and review of surface and subsurface permits/rights, an inquiry into the status of those

surface and subsurface permits, and investigations into existing oil and gas operations on the site.

Accurately determining the precise costs of the project's environmental due diligence activities is

impossible because the environmental due diligence activities were bundled together with all the

due diligence activities necessary to successfully permit the construction of the solar electric

generation facility.

Request No. 8:

Refer to the Application, page 5. Explain how splitting the project into two parts, Martin County Solar, and Martin County Solar II, will affect the Industrial Revenue Bond (IRB) and Payment in Lieu of Taxes agreement (PILOT) with Martin County Fiscal Court. Include in the response whether Martin County Solar and Martin County Solar II have notified all appropriate authorities of the intention to bifurcate the ownership and all other aspects of the project and received permission to do so.

Response No. 8:

The applicant intends to request a separate, proportional IRB/PILOT from Martin County for Martin County II Solar Project, LLC, with identical terms as the terms applicable to the IRB/PILOT for Martin County Solar Project, LLC. As noted on page 5 of the application, the IRB/PILOT agreement contemplated development of the project into two or more phases, which is reasonable for a project under unique conditions such as a reclaimed coal mine. The separate IRB/PILOT agreement for Martin County II Solar Project, LLC, is for its applicable portion of the project in conjunction with Martin County Solar Project, LLC, and thus will not duplicate or otherwise alter the total funds pledged by either party to the original IRB/PILOT inducement. The applicant properly notified all appropriate authorities of its intent to bifurcate its construction certificate. Notice of the proposed bifurcation is required only for the Siting Board and Martin County Fiscal Court pursuant to mitigation measure 28 in Appendix A to the Siting Board's final order granting the applicant's construction certificate in Case No. 2021-00029 (the "facility certificate"). Pursuant to the Siting Board's December 20, 2022 Order, the applicant provided the Martin County Judge Executive and the Martin County Fiscal Court with notice of the applicant's application to bifurcate its facility certificate. The application was transmitted via FedEx and

received by the Martin County Judge Executive and the Martin County Fiscal Court on January 9,

2023. The applicant provided the Siting Board with evidence of notice on January 9, 2023.

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Request No. 9:

Refer to the Application, page 5. Explain how splitting the project into two parts, Martin County

Solar, and Martin County Solar II, will affect the financial agreement with the Kentucky Economic

Development Finance Authority.

Response No. 9:

The project will be split proportionally by size and cost, with the majority of development

occurring under Martin County Solar Project, LLC. Of the 200 megawatts (MW) proposed under

the construction certificate granted to the applicant in Siting Board Case No. 2021-00029 (the

"facility certificate"), Martin County Solar Project, LLC will develop generation capacity for

approximately 111 MW, with Martin County II Solar Project, LLC developing the remaining 89

MW immediately thereafter. Thus, optimally, the effect of the project's bifurcation would result

in the proportional division of the financial agreement with the Kentucky Economic Development

Finance Authority (KEDFA) according to the power generated by each entity.


