REQUEST 10: Admit whether Section IV (D) of Grant County Fiscal Court Ordinance 01-2008-613 states:

"The owner of any house, building, or property used for human occupaney, employment, recreation, or other purposes under the jurisdiction of this chapter and abutting on any street, alley, or rights-of-way in which there is or may be located a wastewater sewer connected to the treatment facility of the district, is required at the owner's expense to install suitable toilet facilities therein and to connect facilities directly to the proper sewer in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, within 60 days after date of official notice to do so provided the proper wastewater sewer is within 300 feet of any house, building or property used for human occupancy, employment, recreation, or other purpose. This section shall not apply to any person served by a privately constructed, owned, operated, or maintained wastewater sewer and wastewater treatment facility that discharges directly to a natural outlet in accordance with the provisions of this chapter and applicable state and federal laws.

For purposes of calculating 300 feet as indicated in this section, distance will be measured in a straight line from the nearest practical connection point with an existing sewer line to that point of the owner's occupied structure where sewerage is currently discharged from that structure to an existing septic or other sewer treatment facility. All determinations requiring an owner to tap in to the district's system shall be made by the owner to the district no later than 30 days following the district's notification to the owner requiring owner's tap in to the district's system.

The manager of the district may exempt the owner from the tap in requirements of this section if such tap in would be impractical due to topographical or other engineering considerations."

RESPONSE: No, the statement made is incorrect, Section IV (D) of Grant County Fiscal Court Ordinance 01- 2008-613 states exactly the following:

The owner of any house, building, or property used for human occupancy, employment, recreation, or other purposes under the jurisdiction of this chapter and abutting on any street, alley, or rights-ofway in which there is or may be located a wastewater sewer connected to the treatment facility of the district, is required at the owner's expense to install suitable toilet facilities therein and to connect facilities directly to the proper sewer in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, within 60 days after date of official notice to do so provided the proper wastewater sewer is within 300 feet of any house, building or property used for human occupancy, employment, recreation, or other purpose, this section shall not apply to any person served by a privately constructed owned, operated, or maintained wastewater sewer and wastewater treatment facility that discharges directly to a natural outlet in accordance with the provisions of this chapter and applicable state and federal laws.

For purposes of calculating 300 feet as indicated in this section, distance will be measured in a straight line from the nearest practical connection point with an existing sewer line to that point of the owner's occupied structure where sewerage is currently discharged from that structure to an existing septic or other sewer treatment facility. All determinations requiring an owner to tap in to the district's system shall be made by the manager whose decision shall be final. Any appeal from the manager's determination requiring an owner to tap in to the district's system shall be made by the owner to the district no later than 30 days following the district's notification to the owner requiring owner's tap in to the district's system.

The manager of the district may exempt the owner from the tap in requirements of this section if such tap in would be impractical due to topographical or other engineering considerations.

RESPONSE: On April 22, 2004, the City of Crittenden ("Crittenden") and the District entered into an Agreement whereby Crittenden transferred its then existing sanitary sewer system to the District. A copy of that Agreement is attached. At that time, there was one known residential property exempted from the Grant County Fiscal Court Ordinance No. 01-2008-613 ("Ordinance", attached) located on U.S. Highway 25 Crittenden, Kentucky. That residential property was apparently exempted from tapping into Crittenden's sanitary sewer system due to topographical and other engineering considerations. The District had no role in exempting that property.

During September/October, 2022, the District was contacted by Mayor James Purcell regarding three residential properties located on Violet Road, Crittenden, Kentucky. It was the opinion of Mayor Purcell that the District should require those three residential properties to tap into the District's sanitary sewer system pursuant to the Ordinance. It was the opinion of the District that the three residential properties were exempt from the Ordinance due to topographical issues and pursuant to the very language contained in the Ordinance. The controversy continued for several weeks. On November 10, 2022, counsel for the District sent a letter to Mayor Purcell outlining the District's position (attached). This letter specifically explains why the Ordinance does not require the three residences on Violet Road, Crittenden, Kentucky, to tap into the District's sanitary sewer system pursuant to the Ordinance. In that letter, the District requested Crittenden and Mayor Purcell to attend a District meeting to discuss this issue. No response was ever received from Crittenden and/or Mayor Purcell. These are the only three (3) properties known to the District which have been exempted since the District acquired management and control of Crittenden's sanitary sewer system.

To the knowledge of GCSD, there are no exempted commercial properties within its system.

There is a residential property located at 265 Turner Drive, Crittenden, KY, 41030. This property is in a very unique topographical position which would require tapping into the District's sanitary sewer system to be impractical and extremely expensive. See Response to Request No. 13 below.

As to 265 Turner Drive, Crittenden, KY 41030, the residential property was exempted due to extreme topographical issues. In order for the property to tap-in to the District's system, an on-site low pressure grinder pump would need to be installed due to elevation differences. The operational cost and expense and installation cost and expense would be prohibitive.

The U.S. 25, Crittenden, Kentucky property was exempted by the City of Crittenden prior to GCSD's taking over the system. The reasons for that exemption are unknown.

RESPONSE: The District in currently in the process of conducting a facilities plan and eventually hopes to complete a treatment plant expansion project. We have done work with HMB Professional Engineering and their reports are attached.

In 2021 and 2022, GCSD undertook an engineering project to determine if the District's sanitary sewer treatment capacity could be increased through the improvement and installation of Equalization Tanks. That project was discontinued due to construction bids received. A copy of the Equalization Tank Project Engineering Plans and Specifications is attached.

REQUEST 20: Provide a detailed description of GCSD's relationship with the City of Crittenden. Ensure to include whether GCSD has a physical office in the city for customers to call for assistance, come in to pay their bill, etc.

RESPONSE: There is no direct relationship between the District and the City of Crittenden. The District does have office space located within the City of Crittenden. That office space is leased from the Bullock Pen Water District. The District's office is open Monday through Friday during normal business hours, where customers may call for assistance, pay bills, and generally make any inquiries. The current relationship between the District and the City of Crittenden has deteriorated significantly in the last few years.

By way of historical perspective, GCSD would state the following. During or about 2004, the City of Crittenden owned, operated and managed a "City" sanitary sewer system servicing residents within the City of Crittenden political boundaries. During or about 2004/2005, the City of Crittenden contacted the Grant County Fiscal Court ("Fiscal Court") to determine if the Fiscal Court would take over the operation and maintenance of the City of Crittenden sewer system. The Fiscal Court made the decision to remove the sanitary sewer system from the control of the City of Crittenden and create a new entity known as "Grant County Sanitary Sewer District". By Ordinance No. 2002-453, the Grant County Sanitary Sewer District was created. On April 22, 2004, the City of Crittenden and GCSD entered into an Agreement (attached, see Response to Request #11), whereby GCSD "purchased from the City of Crittenden the entire sanitary sewer system. At the time of that purchase, the City of Crittenden made various representations and warranties completely set out in the Agreement. Those representations and warranties provided the following:

- (a) Crittenden represents and warrants that the sanitary sewer transmission, collection, treatment and processing systems being transferred to the District and all Assets identified on Schedule A are in a reasonable state of repair and that there are no known defects or deficiencies with respect to any of the equipment, systems, Assets or other property being transferred to District by Crittenden.
- (b) Crittenden is not in default with respect to any term, condition or covenant of any outstanding debt agreement or with respect to any other contract which it may have with any third party concerning the Assets being transferred herein or the Debt

instrument being assumed by the District.

- (c) Execution of this Agreement by Crittenden does not violate any term, condition or covenant of any agreement with any other entity, institution, law or regulation.
- (d) Crittenden has operated its sanitary sewer treatment plant and all Assets in full and complete compliance with all federal, state and local rules, regulations and laws concerning the transmission, collection, treatment and processing of sewage.
- (e) Crittenden is not subject to any litigation or any adverse action by any federal, state or local governmental agency relative to any violation of any federal, state or local rule, law or regulation concerning the collection, transmission, treatment and processing of sewage.
- (f) Crittenden's books and records regarding the operation of its sanitary sewer system and all Debt and Assets are complete, accurate and have been maintained in a reasonable manner so as to accurately reflect the current financial condition and state of affairs of the sanitary sewer system.
- (g) Crittenden does not have any employees or any independent contractors under contract with the City of Crittenden regarding the operation of its sanitary sewer system except Mr. Carl Crone who has an annual contract as an independent contractor, a copy of that contract being attached hereto and identified as Schedule D.
- (h) Crittenden does not have any outstanding accounts payable other than the Debt instrument identified in Schedule C and those debts which are necessarily incurred by Crittenden in the day-to-day operation of its sanitary sewer system.
- (I) Crittenden has maintained all customer billing records consistent with generally accepted accounting principles and that all books and records regarding customer billings and Crittenden's sanitary sewer system accurately reflect the true state of its customer and financial affairs.
- (j) Crittenden is not under contract with any entity or individual for the purpose of providing materials, supplies or other equipment for use by Crittenden in the operation of its sanitary sewer system.
- (k) That the real estate to be transferred herein to the District is free, clear and unencumbered.
- (1) That Crittenden's customer deposit accounts with a current balance of approximately \$55,000.00 accurately reflects those customer deposits on account with Crittenden.

- (m) Crittenden does not owe any accrued employ benefits, including but not limited to pension contributions, unpaid insurance premiums, accrued vacation time, and the like for any employee performing or conducting any work relative to Crittenden's operation of its sanitary sewer system.
- (n) There are no pending or threatened claims by any individual or other entity regarding any products liability or other civil action or claims and/or damages by any individual or entity arising by, from or through Crittenden's operation and maintenance of its sanitary sewer system.

Immediately after assuming control and management of the sanitary sewer system, the District began incurring significant and substantial problems with the system. Moreover, the District soon learned that the sewer rates established by the City of Crittenden were grossly understated and were not sufficient to provide for the daily maintenance and operation of the sanitary sewer system. As a result, the District initiated a rate increase case with the Public Service Commission captioned:

"APPLICATION OF THE GRANT COUNTY SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT FOR CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY - INITIAL OPERATIONS WITH TARIFF, PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION CASE NO. 2005-00314". See hyperlink to Case #2005-00314: https://psc.ky.gov/Case/ViewCaseFilings/2005-00314

As a part of that rate increase application, the District provided a summary of the then current conditions of the sanitary sewer system that was transferred to the District. A copy of the summary of those conditions is included in the attached hyperlink. Briefly stated, the sanitary sewer system was in a significant state of disrepair. Sufficient operational funds and revenues were not available for the District to provide sanitary sewer service. During the first few months of the District's operation of the sanitary sewer system, the Fiscal Court provided funding for the District without which, the District could not have existed. As a direct result of the numerous misrepresentations of the City of Crittenden regarding the condition of the sanitary sewer system, the District incurred thousands of dollars in repair costs which the City of Crittenden refused to reimburse. Needless to say, these material misrepresentations regarding the sanitary sewer system strained the relationship with the District.

Over time, the relationship with the City of Crittenden had improved. In fact, the District provided assistance to the City of Crittenden on an emergency basis if the City of Crittenden was in a bind. For example, the District agreed to provide billing services for the City of Crittenden trash collection at a minimal cost. The District also provided emergency field services to the City of Crittenden. That service has continued through the present, however, the District is currently reevaluating its position in that regard.

In the summer of 2021, there were reports that potential federal funding ("ARPA") would

become available through cities and counties to be used for water and/or wastewater treatment projects. The District contacted the City of Crittenden to see if any of the funds distributed to the City of Crittenden would be available for District purposes. Specifically, the District was considering the expansion of its wastewater treatment plant as it had reached maximum treatment capacity. After contacting the City of Crittenden, the District was advised that no ARPA funding would be coming from the City of Crittenden to the District for any projects. The City of Crittenden advised the District to simply raise its customer rates to pay for potential expansion and upgrade of the sanitary sewer system. In early 2022, the District was contacted by Mayor Jim Purcell in an effort to seek authority to appoint Commissioners to the District. In addition, the City of Crittenden wanted to know if there was any way the District could avoid Public Service Commission oversight (see attached correspondence dated May 16, 2022 and May 17, 2022 from Mayor Purcell). The District informed the City of Crittenden that the District could not be relieved of Public Service Commission oversight. In addition, the District could not allow the City of Crittenden to appoint Commissioners. This information was sent to the City of Crittenden by the District's legal counsel (see attached).

During this same period, the City of Crittenden through its Mayor, Jim Purcell, began a campaign of making comments that the District was not requiring residents within its service area to tap into then currently available sewer lines. The District requested Mayor Purcell to attend District meetings on more than one occasion. In each instance, Mayor Purcell declined. The City of Crittenden indicated that there were three (3) specific cases where the District was not following the Grant County Sanitary Sewer Ordinance No. 01-2008-613. Those three residences were allegedly located on Violet Road, Crittenden, Kentucky. In response to the allegations from the City of Crittenden, the District's counsel send a letter of explanation dated November 10, 2022 (attached. see Response to Request No. 11), explaining exactly why the three customers identified by the City of Crittenden should not be required to tap into the District's then existing sanitary sewer lines. Again, the District requested the City of Crittenden to attend a District meeting to discuss these issues. Again, the City of Crittenden refused.

Obviously, the relationship between the District and the City of Crittenden has deteriorated significantly. The District has made attempts to meet with the City of Crittenden without success. The City of Crittenden merely insists on making allegations of malfeasance on the part of the District without any justification or basis in fact.

REQUEST 21: Explain in detail whether GCSD provides annual reports of any kind to the City of Crittenden. Explain why or why not.

RESPONSE: The District does not provide annual reports of any kind directly to the City of Crittenden. There is no requirement under state or local law requiring such a reporting. However, the District submits all of its annual audited financial reports, Division of Water reports, Public Service Commission reports, and the like which are available to the City of Crittenden at any time.

RESPONSE: The District does not provide water service to any customers located within the City of Crittenden, residential or otherwise. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the vast majority of District sanitary sewer customers are located within the City of Crittenden.
