Kentucky Power Company gives notice of its filing of the following attached documents as evidence of the publication of the public notice required by 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b) and the Commission's June 2, 2023 Order in this case:

(a) The July 14, 2023 affidavit of Holly Willard, Bookkeeping Assistant, Kentucky

Press Service, Inc., including list of publications and publication dates; and

(b) A copy of the accompanying newspaper "tear sheets," verifying the contents of the required notice of hearing and that the notice was published.

Further, the Company used its best efforts to give notice of the hearing in compliance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b). The Company's Notice of Filing Proof of Request for Publication of Hearing Notice (filed herein on June 29, 2023) reflects that it made the request for publication with the Kentucky Press Service on June 28, 2023.

Kentucky Power was informed on July 13, 2023 by the Kentucky Press Service that the *Greenup Beacon* (Greenup County) did not publish the notice on July 4, 2023 or July 11, 2023 as requested by the Company and Kentucky Press Service. The Company requested, via the Kentucky Press Service, that the *Greenup Beacon* run the notice on its next publishing date, Tuesday, July 18, 2023 (two days prior to the hearing in this case). The *Greenup Beacon* publishes once weekly

on Tuesdays, and as such, will not publish the notice within the 7-21 day window prior to the July 20, 2023 hearing as prescribed by regulation.

Kentucky Power was informed by the Kentucky Press Service that the *Greenup Beacon* is a family-owned and run publication with four employees. The Company's notice for this case was originally set to run in the *Greenup Beacon* on July 4, 2023. However, the newspaper's publisher became ill and subsequently passed away. For this reason, the newspaper was unable to run the Company's notice on July 4, 2023 or on July 11, 2023 as requested. The affidavit of Holly Willard confirms that the newspaper has included the Company's notice in the July 18, 2023 publication that is set to print today, July 17, 2023 and that will be circulated on July 18, 2023.

Kentucky Power acted in good faith and with due care in arranging for the timely publication of the notice and used its best efforts to give notice of the hearing in compliance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b). Due to reasons outside the Company's control, the notice was not published in one of the newspapers in the Company's service territory within the acceptable publication window. The notice was timely published in each of the remaining 19 newspapers in the Company's service territory as indicated in Ms. Willard's affidavit.

For the foregoing reasons, and to the extent the Commission deems it necessary, Kentucky Power requests that the Commission grant a deviation from the requirements of its June 2, 2023 Order and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9(2)(b). Respectfully submitted,

A Morgan County paranormal investigation group has been investigating the presence of ghostly entities at sites throughout the region since last year.

The group, known as the Eastern Kentucky Ghost Squad, consists of investigators Bobbie Jo Wright and her husband, Ray Wright, and Freddie Lewis, all of West Liberty

Bids sought for network of EV charging stations

FRANKFORT, Ky. - The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) has issued a "final Request for Proposals" (RFP) to build up to 37 electric vehicle (EV) charging stations along Kentucky interstates and parkways, after receiving approval from the Federal Highway Administration.

Most of the money to build the network will come from federal formula funds, made possible by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, with a match by private-entity funds. Proposals will be due by 5 p.m. (ET) on August 24.

The EV Charging Program

RFP encourages proposals from private-sector entities. Selected parties will be responsible for constructing, owning, operating and maintaining new EV charging stations across the state.

The EV stations must be open to the public 24 hours a day, seven days a week and power any non-proprietary electric vehicle model.

Firms selected to develop sites within the statewide network will be contractually required to operate and maintain the stations for five-years.
