Dear Customer.

Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC, a subsidiary of Central States Water Resources, Inc. (CSWR), is in the process of acquiring your community's sewer systems.

Who Is Bluegrass Water?

Waterborne illness and unsafe environmental conditions caused by aging wastewater systems are on the rise. Bluegrass Water is committed to bringing safe, reliable and environmentally responsible water resources to every community we serve. We transform how water and sewer utilities work by using technology and innovation to quickly assess and invest in reliable infrastructure that meets stringent state and federal safety standards, ensuring your community has access to safe and reliable water resources while protecting the aquifers, lakes, rivers and streams that are essential to our world.

About Our Investment in Your Community:

Currently, the Delaplain wastewater system is unable to properly treat wastewater because the wastewater received by the plant exceeds its capacity by 40%-50%. The plant has consistently failed to meet Kentucky's permit limits for the system's treated wastewater, regularly putting the health of residents at risk and polluting the environment by failing to meet limits for waste solids, ammonia, dissolved oxygen, E.Coli and total residual chlorine.


We have submitted a request to the Kentucky Public Service Commission to acquire Delaplain. Bluegrass Water plans to invest more than \$1.1 million in the Delaplain system to ensure you have access to clean, safe and reliable wastewater systems – something that has not been the case for residents in your area for many years.

If approved, we plan to make improvements to address the issues with your wastewater system, including:

- Adding capacity and improving the treatment processes at the facility to provide proper treatment of incoming wastewater.
- Adding monitoring systems at plant and all five lift stations to notify operators of potential system failures.
- Updating the site to meet safety requirements.
- Hiring and training of professional operators.
- Providing 24/7 Customer Service and emergency response.

Since Bluegrass Water acquired its first systems in Kentucky, the company has invested more than \$2.5 million to improve and upgrade facilities used to provide service. This investment is part of a larger plan to invest approximately \$7.6 million more on additional improvements to systems across the state, including in Delaplain.







This plan is part of a request Bluegrass Water submitted to the Kentucky Service Commission (PSC) to increase water and wastewater rates to its existing customers to cover the investments made to bring clean, safe and reliable water services to Kentuckians.

Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company is regulated by the Kentucky Public Service Commission (PSC). You have the opportunity to provide comments to the PSC and Office of Public Counsel regarding Bluegrass Water's request within 30 days of the date of this notice.

Your comments should include a reference to case number 2020-00290. The Public Commission will review all customer comments submitted in response to this notice. All comments will be filed in the official case file for review by the commissioners.

Once Acquisition Takes Place:

At this time, your wastewater rates will not change, although there may be an increase in rates once repairs and improvements of the sewer system are approved by the state's public service commission.

Soon, you will be receiving a new sewer bill in a monthly cycle which includes a new customer service telephone line available for questions about your bill or account status. You will receive your bill in the mail for the previous month during the first week of each month; bills are due the last business day of each month. Late fees are assessed before the next billing cycle. The customer service and account information will be included on the bill for reference.

Dear Potential Bluegrass Customer:

We're writing to you about the wastewater services in your community.

Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC (Bluegrass Water) has asked the Kentucky Public Service Commission (Commission) to acquire the system that serves your community. The Commission case number for that application is 2020-00297.

On September 30, 2020, Bluegrass Water submitted to the Commission a request for a general adjustment of rates charged for service. The request seeks to increase annual sewer operating revenues by \$2,177,052 (Case # 2020-00290). Since last year, Bluegrass Water has invested nearly \$2.5 million in urgently needed improvements in the Kentucky communities it serves to ensure access to clean, safe and reliable drinking water and wastewater systems. Over the next 18 months, Bluegrass Water intends to invest approximately \$5 million more in its Kentucky systems to ensure they are able to provide safe and reliable service. Increased costs attributable to these and other improvements make it necessary to seek a rate increase at this time.

Because the Commission has not yet ruled on either the acquisition or rate increase requests, there will be NO CHANGE in your billing at this time and you should continue to pay your current service provider for the service you receive. Any future change in the rates you are charged must first be approved by the Commission.

Please take notice of the following information about the proposed rate adjustment that is described below and presented on the enclosed table:

The table compares current rates for communities served by Bluegrass Water to the increased rates the company is requesting and shows the proposed increases as both a percentage and a dollar amount. The Commission, the state agency that regulates all utility services in Kentucky, will rule on this request and may order rates to be charged that differ from the proposed rates found in this notice. The average customer usage is unknown and the average bill in each service area relates directly to the current rates per month shown in the enclosed sheet. The date the proposed rates were filed with the Commission was September 30, 2020, with a proposed effective date of October 30, 2020. On October 30, 2020, the Commission suspended the proposed rates for six months while it reviews the application. As a result, the proposed rates will not go into effect before May 1, 2021.

If the Commission does not receive a written request for intervention establishing the grounds for the request (including the status and interest of the party) within thirty (30) days of the initial mailing of this notice, it may take final action on the application.



Gentlemen,

I read with great interest your motion to intervene on behalf of Scott County in the matter of Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC (Bluegrass Water) application for an adjustment of sewage rates, filed as Case # 2022-00432.

As I'm sure you're well aware, On October 1, 2020, Bluegrass Water filed an application with the Kentucky Public Service Commission (KPSC) for approval of construction and an adjustment of rates pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, filed as Case #2020-00290.

On August 2, 2021 the Kentucky Public Service Commission (KPSC) issued a "Final Order" in Case #2020-00290, approving most of Bluegrass Water's demands, including outrageous rate increases up to 587.8%!

Furthermore, Bluegrass Water continues to expand their reach, by acquiring more water and wastewater systems, and on February 27, 2023, filed an application with the KPSC for yet another unjust rate increase for an additional 15.6%!

This is an issue of great importance, not only to Scott County, but to more than 3,500 households and businesses in many counties throughout Kentucky.

In October, 2020, I formed Bluegrass Water Resistance--a Facebook group dedicated to overturning the August 2, 2021 the KPSC "Final Order," and now also trying to prevent yet another unjustified rate increase.

However, having filed multiple complaints with the appropriate state agencies to no avail, we believe legal action is warranted against the KPSC and/or Bluegrass Water, and are currently seeking legal representation in the form of a class action lawsuit on our behalf.

Any assistance or referral your office could provide in locating a class action law firm that would be interested in taking our case would be greatly appreciated.

I recently received a letter from Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC dated February 27, 2023 indicating their application and request for adjustment of rates and approval of construction per PSC Case #2022-00432.

I live in the I-75/Delaplain Exchange (Riffton Meadows) neighborhood, which as part of Case #2022-00432. Our neighborhood is facing a potential increase in Total Monthly Sewer - Single Residential service from \$12.50 per month to \$99.37 per month. This is a proposed monthly rate increase of 694.9%.

I strongly request intervention regarding this case under the following grounds:

1. Power Imbalance/Monopoly/Market Failure/Fairness in Taxation - This is a private company, buying up sewer systems that provide a public good (sewer + environmental impact). Bluegrass Water speaks about costs/benefits, etc. as if we had a market here. But, I have only one choice of where to get my sewer services and no other choice of rates. If they dramatically increase their revenue stream, they can sell this system for a profit based on years of higher rates extracted from me and my neighbors without assistance from state or local governments and outside a system of state and municipal grants. Systems owned by municipalities all over Kentucky are eligible for grants and are receiving grants, because they are facing many of the same repair issues that we are facing, related to providing clean water and living conditions. State and local taxes are available to assist them, but not available to assist me. Other systems, further out in the county (Mallard Point, etc) were acquired years ago by GMWSS. This is a course that enables their taxes to support maintenance and upgrade to their systems. I challenge the legitimacy of a private system like this that provides a public good, where the "buyers" have no recourse to seek better rates in the market and where the "seller" is free to seek an almost 7x increase. Our only advocate is the PSC. I want more government involvement in ensuring that the burden of these public matters do not fall unfairly to a subset of private systems without government grants and assistance that are available to other taxpayers and municipal systems.

2. Outrageous Amount of Increase - The proposed rate increase of 694.9% is totally outrageous and beyond reason. A recent report from energy.gov showed that from 2008-2016, the average annual wastewater price escalation rate in the South-South East region, which includes the state of Kentucky, was 3.2% (U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy, Water and Wastewater Annual Price Escalation Rates For Selected Cities across the United States, September 2017). Based on this information, the proposed rate increase of 694.9% requested by Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC would equate to the average annual wastewater price escalation rate of 3.2% being applied for 209 consecutive years all at once. Some regulation of the amount of increase

allowed in a year or over a period of time needs to be applied.

3. Financial Hardship - This increase will place an undue hardship on me. Like me, others in the Delaplain area face hardship as people on fixed incomes, single parents, elderly, workers who haven't seen raises in years and others. A significant portion of us don't get an \$86.87 monthly raise – ever. Comparable sewer rates (even in cities that include both water and garbage in their costs) are more like \$45/month. As rural customers, we pay over \$30/month for garbage service AND we pay for sewer costs separately. With this increase, we would have a combined garbage/sewer bill of \$130/month, \$90 more than our peers. We have no city to advocate for us. And, since we are small, non-municipal systems, we are unlikely to receive state funds for system upgrades.

4. Lack of Diligence - It is not clear that Bluegrass Water Utility Water Operating Company, LLC has diligently looked to control costs or obtain multiple bids for proposed system improvements.

5. Excess Profit for a Public Utility - According to its letter dated 02/27/2023, Bluegrass Water Utility Water Operating Company, LLC states that it seeks to increase revenues by \$1,291,491 per year. They would recover their investment in only a few years; this is for systems with a life far beyond. This is too much burden to place on small residential customers.

6. Inadequate Records Access - In the filing per Case #2022-00432, many of the financial records of Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC and their presumed attempts to justify the proposed rate increase are redacted. This makes it impossible for residents of Delaplain or their representatives to fully vet the claims of Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC and properly challenge their outrageous, proposed rate increase of 694.9%.

Thank you for your timely consideration of the concerns stated above regarding the proposed rate increase of 694.9% in residential sewer service for I-75/Delaplain residents like us. I look forward to your rejection of this outrageous request of Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC per Case #2022-00432.

1. Power Imbalance/Monopoly/Market Failure/Fairness in Taxation — This is a private company, buying up sewer systems that provide a public good (sewer + environmental impact). Bluegrass Water speaks about costs/benefits, etc. as if we had a market here. But, I have only one choice of where to get my sewer services and no other choice of rates. If they dramatically increase their revenue stream, they can sell this system for a profit based on years of higher rates extracted from me and my neighbors without assistance from state or local governments and outside a system of state and municipal grants. Systems owned by municipalities all over Kentucky are eligible for grants and are receiving grants, because they are facing many of the same repair issues that we are facing, related to providing clean water and living conditions. State and local taxes are available to assist them, but not available to assist me. Other systems, further out in the county (Mallard Point, etc) were acquired years ago by GMWSS. This is a course that enables their taxes to support maintenance and upgrade to their systems. I challenge the legitimacy of a private system like this that provides a public good, where the "buyers" have no recourse to seek better rates in the market and where the "seller" is free to seek an almost 7x increase. Our only advocate is the PSC. I want more government involvement in ensuring that the burden of these public matters do not fall unfairly to a subset of private systems without government grants and assistance that are available to other taxpayers and municipal systems.

2. Outrageous Amount of Increase - The proposed rate increase of 694.9% is totally outrageous and beyond reason. A recent report from energy.gov showed that from 2008-2016, the average annual wastewater price escalation rate in the South-South East region, which includes the state of Kentucky, was 3.2% (U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy, Water and Wastewater Annual Price Escalation Rates For Selected Cities across the United States, September 2017). Based on this information, the proposed rate increase of 694.9% requested by Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC would equate to the average annual wastewater price escalation rate of 3.2% being applied for 209 consecutive years all at once. Some regulation of the amount of increase allowed in a year or over a period of time needs to be applied.

3. Financial Hardship - This increase will place an undue hardship on me. Like me, others in the Delaplain area face hardship as people on fixed incomes, single parents, elderly, workers who haven't seen raises in years and others. A significant portion of us don't get an \$86.87 monthly raise — ever. Comparable sewer rates (even in cities that include both water and garbage in their costs) are more like \$45/month. As rural customers, we pay over \$30/month for garbage service AND we pay for sewer costs separately. With this increase, we would have a combined garbage/sewer bill of \$130/month, \$90 more than our peers. We have no city to advocate for us. And, since we are small, non-municipal systems, we are unlikely to receive state funds for system upgrades.

4. Lack of Diligence - It is not clear that Bluegrass Water Utility Water Operating Company, LLC has diligently looked to control costs or obtain multiple bids for proposed system improvements.

- 5. Excess Profit for a Public Utility According to its letter dated 02/27/2023, Bluegrass Water Utility Water Operating Company, LLC states that it seeks to increase revenues by \$1,291,491 per year. They would recover their investment in only a few years; this is for systems with a life far beyond. This is too much burden to place on small residential customers.
- 6. Inadequate Records Access In the filing per Case #2022-00432, many of the financial records of Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC and their presumed attempts to justify the proposed rate increase are redacted. This makes it impossible for residents of Delaplain or their representatives to fully vet the claims of Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC and properly challenge their outrageous, proposed rate increase of 694.9%.

Thank you for your timely consideration of the concerns stated above regarding the proposed rate increase of 694.9% in residential sewer service for I-75/Delaplain residents like us. I look forward to your rejection of this outrageous request of Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC per Case #2022-00432.

Since purchasing the sewer system that serves you, Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC (Bluegrass Water) has invested nearly \$16 million in Kentucky communities to ensure that you, your families and your neighbors have access to clean, safe and reliable wastewater resources. The infrastructure upgrades to the sewer system serving you may include installation of remote monitoring equipment to assure facilities are closely tracked and work properly at all times; sewer plant improvements to ensure proper treatment including flow equalization, replacement of blowers, pipes, and diffusers in aeration tankage, and many more necessary repairs. As a result of these efforts and additional improvements planned, Bluegrass Water expects to submit a request on February 27, 2023 to the Kentucky Public Service Commission (PSC) for a general adjustment of rates charged for service in order to increase annual sewer operating revenues by \$1,291,491.

Please take notice of the following information about the proposed rate adjustment that is presented below:

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Bluegrass Water, but the PSC, the state agency that regulates all utility services in Kentucky, may order rates to be charged that differ from the proposed rates found in this notice. The Company has proposed raising your residential rate from the present rate of \$12.50 to the proposed rate of \$99.37 which represents an increase of \$86.87 or 694.9% and also represents the effect upon the average bill for residential customer the change in an average bill. The Company has proposed raising your commercial rate from the present rate of \$8.89 per 1000 gallons to the proposed rate of \$248.43 fixed charge plus a usage charge of \$14.91 per 1000 gallons. The average customer usage for commercial customers is approximately 122,001 gallons and the effect the proposed rate will have on the average bill for each customer is \$982.83 or 90.6%. The date the proposed rates are expected to be filled with the PSC is February 27, 2023; the proposed effective date of the rates is for service rendered on and after March 31, 2023.

I'm writing today on behalf of the attached list of businesses located in the Delaplain Industrial Park located in Scott County, Kentucky and connected to the Delaplain wastewater treatment plant operated by Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company LLC which are impacted by KY PSC Rate Case 2022-00432. These businesses request that the PSC intervene to evaluate the appropriateness of the proposed rate increase and the blending of a fixed monthly rate + monthly rate per 1000 gal of water usage. Bluegrass upon purchasing the sewer system must have considered the expected growth in residential neighborhoods and customers that would have justified the operational investments as well as the larger source of revenue to recover those capital investment costs. The proposed 90.6% increase does not seem warranted given the growing revenue base and will have significant cost impact on operations and products sold to our customers. With the proposed rate increase Aichi-Forge USA operations at 596 Triport Road, Georgetown, KY 40324, we estimated our bill will increase by an average of \$10,000/mo., \$120,000/yr. This is a significant impact to our bottom line that will need to be offset.

In addition, we request the PSC to intervene regarding the rate increase for residential customers from \$12.50 to the proposed \$99.37. Some of the affected residents are employees for the listed companies and this would create a financial burden for them.

We ask that the PSC intervene to determine the appropriate rate and duration to offset the necessary capital improvements for the Delaplain Wastewater treatment operation.

Dear Customer:

We're writing to update you on the wastewater services that serve your community.

Since purchasing the sewer system that serves you, Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company, LLC (Bluegrass Water) has invested nearly \$16 million in Kentucky communities to ensure that you, your families and your neighbors have access to clean, safe and reliable wastewater resources. The infrastructure upgrades to the sewer system serving you may include installation of remote monitoring equipment to assure facilities are closely tracked and work properly at all times; sewer plant improvements to ensure proper treatment including flow equalization, replacement of blowers, pipes, and diffusers in aeration tankage, and many more necessary repairs. As a result of these efforts and additional improvements planned, Bluegrass Water expects to submit a request on February 27, 2023 to the Kentucky Public Service Commission (PSC) for a general adjustment of rates charged for service in order to increase annual sewer operating revenues by \$1,291,491.

Please take notice of the following information about the proposed rate adjustment that is presented below:

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Bluegrass Water, but the PSC, the state agency that regulates all utility services in Kentucky, may order rates to be charged that differ from the proposed rates found in this notice. The Company has proposed raising your rate from the present rate of \$85.97 to the proposed rate of \$99.37 which represents an increase of \$13.40 or 15.6%. The date the proposed rates are expected to be filed with the PSC is February 27, 2023; the proposed effective date of the rates is for service rendered on and after March 31, 2023. As there are only flat rates included in the existing tariff or which affect existing customers, the average customer usage is unknown and the effect the proposed rate will have on the average bill for each customer is an increase of \$13.40 or 15.6%.
