ast Thursday, eight of us volunteers, from both the museum and the Treasure House, got together for our first Christmas social at the museum. The group

included me, Connie Caraway, Gale Harberson, Ruth Ann Conrad, Anna Pinkston, Anita Austill, Carol Heppler and Kathy Iones.

There was lots of food and chatter. It gave us a chance to visit when we weren't working, and get to know one another better. We also exchanged gifts, à la Dirty Santa — but a kinder, gentler Santa-at least this year. Everyone had a nice time, and we look forward to having another social next December. Thanks for the great idea to get together, Connie!

Here at the museum and research center we get all kinds of queries.

Oftentimes someone will come in asking about a particular family that once lived in

the area. Anita, our curator, knows about every family that has lived in the county, it seems, and if she doesn't - whenever someone comes in

inquiring — she knows how to figure it out, or who to call to get the answer.

When Jennie Seymour, another volunteer, is in the museum, and she and Anita put their heads together, one or the other — or both — will know about the family in question. Since I'm not originally from this county, I'm always amazed just listening to them.

Another query is about finding an old article, or an old obituary. If they're available online, we can bring them up, and we've printed out many articles and obituaries for visitors. This is also

how I'm able to research for different articles I've done.

There is an old story about how three guys pitched in money to pay for a lot, so that a church could be built on that lot in Island. There was a question about one of the men mentioned in the story — Bob Veach; could they be talking about the then-15-yearold Bobby Veach, who would later find fame in Major League Baseball? The time frame was 1903.

While the story, as recalled in 1959, might be true as far as who paid for the lot, when I researched, there wasn't a deed with the names of those three men on it, and no deed for Bob Veach, in any variation of his first or last name. Recently, one man

emailed the museum to ask about induction paperwork for four men with the surname of Howard. All had served in the 3rd Kentucky Cavalry (Union). Could we help him? I told him that we

have access to the info from their induction on Ancestrv.com.

In addition, we have books titled "Report of the Adjutant General of the State of Kentucky,' with the names of all who served during the Civil War from Kentucky — both Union and Confederate. I emailed him pictures which showed the Howards' name, rank, when they enrolled, and when and where they mustered in, and he's now planning a visit to the museum.

Most recently we had a visitor come in who wanted to know when a woman's body had been discovered in the Green River in Calhoun. The time frame was the mid-1980s, and he gave the name of the woman who had been found.

With no results coming up on my search of that name, he remembered that she had been married, and recalled her married name. Correcting the search name in the computer,

the woman came up right away, and I was able to print those out for him. Anita Austill is also

a great source for locating cemeteries. She knows where all of the cemeteries are in the county — and many located elsewhere and can help direct you to their locations. She has photographed over 83,000 headstones — in McLean County and neighboring counties and uploaded them all to FindaGrave.com. Now that's dedication.

So if you've reached a brick wall on someone in your family tree, or you're looking up something else — and get stumped — give us a call. We'll do our best to help you.

The Parks, Playgrounds, and Recreational Board hereby is charged with the authority and duty to investigate, analyze and advise the City with regard to the management, [and] control, [the] operation and utilization of the City's parks, playgrounds and recreational facilities. The Board also is directed and authorized to make recommendations to the City Council with regard to expenditures for maintenance and improvements to the City's parks, playgrounds and recreational facilities

The Heart of Paducah Homebuyer Program is an affordable housing program that gives people a chance to be homeowners who would otherwise be unable to. The program is now open for applications.

The newly constructed homes will be built in the Walter Jetton Area, the city of Paducah's initial Southside housing focus area. One home has already been built, and more are on the way.

The available housing plans are for up to four-bedroom homes with 1,000 to 1,400 square feet, depending on the family's needs and budget.

The Paducah Alliance of Neighbors runs the program and requires applicants to meet several qualifications:

Must not have owned a home in the past three years. The exception to this requirement is divorcees who do not retain ownership rights of marital

Have no more than \$50,000 in cash or similar assets.

Have a credit score above the 680 range.

Have a household income at or below 80% of the HUD Area median income for McCracken will bring to this neighbor-County.

Philadelphia Eagles have bigger problems than 3-game losing streak

The Philadelphia Eagles have bigger problems than a three-game losing streak.

Jalen Hurts questioned the commitment of his teammates following a stunning 20-17 loss at Seattle on Monday night.

Darius Slay praised his own performance but said the rest of the defense stunk after a 33-13 loss at Dallas last week.

First-year defensive coordinator Sean Desai was stripped of his play-calling duties after 13 games. Fans and some in the media are calling for the same for first-year offensive coordinator Brian Johnson because a talented group has underachieved.

After a 10-1 start, the Eagles have crashed. And, they're not handling adversity well considering some of the finger-pointing and blame-shifting.

Getting whipped by the 49ers (11-3) and Cowboys (10-4) provided a reality check after two impressive wins over Kansas City and Buffalo. The Eagles were in control in Seattle for most of the game until Drew Lock turned into Drew Brees and led an improbable, 92-yard touchdown drive in the final two minutes.

Hurts, who played through an illness, threw two interceptions in the fourth quarter and hasn't often looked this season like the QB who finished second in NFL MVP voting and had a stellar game in the Super Bowl loss to the Chiefs.

"I've been talking about execution all year, being on the same page, everyone being on the same page," Hurts said following Monday's loss. "We didn't execute. I don't think we're all, we're committed enough. Just got to turn it around. You know, it's a challenge that we have to embrace. Just continue to see it through." Hurts is an excellent

team leader. He chooses his words carefully. He's calculated. Calling out his teammates wasn't a slip-up in the heat of the moment. He was intentional. Obviously, Hurts sees something he doesn't like whether it's on the practice field, in team meetings or inside the locker room.

How the rest of the team responds will determine whether the Eagles can get back to contention for the Super Bowl.

The road isn't going to be easy because San Francisco would have to collapse to lose the No. 1 seed. But the Eagles have a chance to regroup after a brutal six-game stretch and still have an inside track on winning the NFC East.

Philadelphia faces Tommy DeVito and the New York Giants (5-9) on Christmas Day and once again in the final week and the Arizona Cardinals (3-11) in between.

Hurts knows they have to improve to go deep in the playoffs. have it. The trust that we have in one another, how much we communicate as players. ... We just have to be better; I have to be better. Minimize the mistakes, the penalties, the mental errors. Play team football and it starts with me leading that. We've lost games because I can be better. That will change everything, and I accept that."

The Buffalo Bills aren't finished after all.

They have gone from being a major disappointment to being the team nobody wants to face in the playoffs. After beating the Chiefs in Kansas City thanks to Kadarius Toney's offside penalty, the Bills routed the Cowboys 31-10.

At 8-6, their path to the playoffs is complex. But, they could be in position to play for the AFC East title in Week 18 if they beat the Chargers (5-9) on the road this Saturday and the Patriots (3-11) at home next week. One loss by the Dolphins (10-4) either to Dallas or Baltimore in the next two games coupled with Buffalo winning twice suddenly makes the final game of the regular season in Miami a win-
