I Want to Hold Your Hand

Last week we talked about a different music genre called jazz. This week, we are turning to Rock and Roll.

If you are familiar with the song "I Want to Hold Your Hand" then you probably know who the original singers were - The Beatles.

The Beatles were a part of what was known as the British Invasion.

The British Invasion was a cultural phenomenon of the mid-1960s, when rock and roll pop music acts from the United Kingdom and other aspects of British culture became popular in the United States and significant to the rising "counterculture" on both sides of the Atlantic Ocean. Pop and rock groups such as the Beatles, the Zombies, the Rolling Stones, Small Faces, the Dave Clark Five, the Hermitz, the Animals, Gerry and the Pacemakers, the Searchers, the Yardbirds, the Who and Them as well as solo singers like Dusty Springfield, Cilla Black, Petula Clark, Tom Jones and Donovan, were at the forefront of the "invasion". (Surely you remember some of these)

Released in the United Kingdom on Nov. 29, 1963, "I Want to Hold Your Hand" was a runaway hit in the band mates' homeland, notching their fourth consecutive No. 1 single and racking up sales of more than 1.5 million copies by the end of January 1964. (I graduated from high school in 1963, so I remember the Beatles quite well!) As pop-music masterworks go, the Beatles' "I Want to Hold Your Hand" is one of the most ambitious, self-conscious compositions in the fabled Lennon-McCartney songbook. It would also be the classic tune that would alter the group's fortunes across the globe.

Originally written after manager Brian Epstein urged the band to aspire for a distinctly American sound "I Want to Hold Your Hand" offered a deft blend of African American rhythm and blues, West Coast surf music and high-octane rock 'n' roll. As John Lennon later recalled, "We wrote a lot of stuff together, one on one, eyeball to eyeball. Like in 'I Want To Hold Your Hand' I remember when we got the chord that made the song. We were in Jane Ashor's house, downstairs in the cellar playing on the piano at the same time. And we had, 'Oh you-u-ugot that some thing ...' and Paul hits this chord, and I turn to him and say, 'That's it!' I said, 'Do that again!' In those days, we really used to absolutely write like that - both playing into each other's noses." But the unparalleled success behind "I Want to Hold Your Hand" - like so many of pop music's greatest stories of fame and fortune - was, purely and simply, about timing. Recorded in 17 takes at Abbey Road Studios on Oct. 17, 1963, it was the first Beatles recording to benefit from four-track technology. Yet in many ways, the song's breakthrough success was even more dramatic and serendipitous in the United States. While "I Want to Hold Your Hand" wouldn't be released stateside until Dec. 26, 1963, it marked their first appearance on Capitol Records, the American subsidiary of their U.K. parent label, EMI. As it happens, Capitol's international A&R executive Dave E. Dexter Jr., had been rejecting the Beatles' music for American release throughout 1963. Given the group's massive British success in the summer and autumn months, EMI's managing director L.G. Wood ordered Capitol to release the Beatles without delay. In spite of his misgivings about the band's sound, even Dexter couldn't resist the magic of "I Want to Hold Your Hand." As Dexter later recalled, "I heard about four bars of that, and I grabbed it!" Capitol initially scheduled the single's release for mid-January in preparation for the band's Feb. 9 appearance on "The Ed Sullivan Show."

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RATE CHANGE
On or about February 7, 2023, Nicholas County Water District ("District") anticipates filing an application with the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("PSC") pursuant to KRS 274.023 requesting approval of an increase in its rates for water service. The change in water rates are required by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, acting through Rural Development ("RD") in connection with a loan by RD to the District in the principal amount of \$1,221,000 to be evidenced by the issuance by the District of its waterworks revenue bonds in such amount, which RD has agreed to purchase provided the District meets certain conditions of RD, including setting the water rates as set forth below:

The proposed monthly water rates shall be effective for water sold after the date of the final approving order of the PSC, which order is expected to be issued no later than 30 days of the filing of the Application and the meeting of the minimum filing requirements. Such date is expected to be on or about March 7, 2023. The Application for approval of the rate change will be filed with the PSC and may be examined during normal business hours at the following locations: (1) Nicholas County Water District Office, 1819 Old Paris Road, Carlisle, KY 40311; (2) PSC, 211 5th Street, Frankfort, Kentucky; Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. E.T., and (3) the PSC website at <http://psc.ky.gov>. Direct link to case documents is <https://psc.ky.gov/Cases/VolCaseFilings/2023/00621>. Comments regarding the Application may be submitted to the PSC via its website or by mail to PSC, P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.

The proposed rates are required under the terms of an agreement between the District and RD and KRS 274.023. Does not grant the PSC any discretionary authority to modify or vary any portion of the agreement between the District and RD, or to defer the issuance of all necessary orders to implement the terms of the agreement. The RD is an proceeds will be used to finance the costs of the installation of 1600 new radio read meters, replacement of two pump stations, and the replacement of approximately 7000 LF of problematic PVC pipe with new ductile iron.
