## Kansas City Chiefs win Super Bowl LVII!!!

Super Bowl LVII was this past Sunday, Feb. 12, 2023, at the State Farm Stadium in Glendale, Arizona. The Kansas City Chiefs, led by QB Patrick Mahomes, faced off against the Philadelphia Eagles, led by QB Jalen Hurts. This years Super Bowl was significant because it featured brothers Tim and Jason Kelce facing off against one another, on opposing teams.

The pre-game festivities included R&B singer Babyface performing "America The Beautiful", actress Sheryl Lee Ralph performing "Lift Every Voice And Sing", and Ky. native Chris Stapleton singing a spectacular performance of the national anthem. Each song was also interpreted in American Sign Language by 2022 Oscar winner Troy Kotsur.

The game began with Kansas City winning the coin toss and deferring to the Eagles. Both teams were pretty well stacked against one another, with each team scoring well during the first half. The Eagles had the momentum going into halftime with a ten-point lead, with a score of 24-14, and Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes aggravating a previously injured high ankle sprain during the final minutes of the half.

R&B singer Rihanna performed a pretty

lackluster set during the Halftime Show featuring a floating stage setup where she performed a plethora of her hit songs, which included "Work", "Umbrella", "Run This Town" and more. The set featured no special guests, a few racy dance moves, and her debut of a baby bump, which she publicly revealed the next day that she was expecting her second child with rapper ASAP Rocky, which explains why the pregnant singer pretty much performed the Super Bowl set without a lot of physical movement.

The second half began with a TD drive from the Chiefs, led by Mahomes, who showed no signs of the ankle sprain bothering him. Both teams were tied at 35-35 in the final few minutes of the game, when a defensive holding penalty was called on the Eagles, giving the Chiefs a new set of downs and putting them in field goal range. The Chiefs then kneeled a few times to wind the clock down to less than a minute and kicked the game-winning field goal to end the Super Bowl with a score of 38-35 and their third overall Super Bowl win. The first being at Super Bowl 4 in 1970 against the Vikings, the second at Super Bowl 54 in 2020 against the 49ers, and this year against the Eagles.

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RATE CHANGE

On or about February 15, 2023, Rowan Water, Inc. ("RWI") anticipates filing an Application with the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("PSC") pursuant to KRS 278.023 requesting approval of an increase in its rates for water service. The changes in water rates are required by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, acting through Rural Development ("RD") in connection with a loan by RD to RWI in the principal amount of \$1,120,000 to be evidenced by the issuance by RWI of its promissory note in such amount, which RD has agreed to purchase provided the RWI meets certain conditions of RD, including revising the water rates as set forth below:

The proposed monthly water rates shall be effective for water sold after the date of the final approving Order of the PSC, which Order is expected to be issued no later than 30 days of the filing of the Application and the meeting of the minimum filing requirements. Such date is expected to be on or about March 15, 2023. The Application for approval of the rate change has been filed with the PSC and may be examined during normal business hours at the following locations: (i) Rowan Water, Inc., 1765 Christy Creek, Morehead, KY 40351; (ii) PSC, 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., E.T.; and (iii) via the PSC website at <http://psc.ky.gov>. Comments regarding the Application may be submitted to the PSC via its website or by mail to PSC, P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602.

The proposed rates are required under the terms of an agreement between RWI and RD and KRS 278.023 does not grant the PSC any discretionary authority to modify or reject any portion of the agreement between RWI and RD, or to defer the issuance of all necessary orders to implement the terms of the agreement. The RD loan and grant proceeds will be used to finance the costs of the installation of approximately 8000 LF of PVC water main and two new booster pump stations.
