APPLICATION

Louisville Gas and Electric Company (“LG&E” or the “Company”) hereby requests, pursuant to the Commission’s Orders in Case No. 2012-00222¹, that the Commission issue an order approving its revised rates for its Gas Line Tracker Adjustment Clause (“GLT”) effective for services rendered on and after May 1, 2023. In support of this Application, the Company states as follows:

1. The full name and mailing address of LG&E is Louisville Gas and Electric Company, 220 W. Main Street, Louisville, KY 40202. LG&E may be reached by electronic mail at the electronic mail addresses set forth below.

2. LG&E is a utility engaged in the electric and gas business. LG&E generates and purchases electricity and distributes and sells electricity at retail in Jefferson County and portions of Bullitt, Hardin, Henry, Meade, Oldham, Shelby, Spencer, and Trimble Counties. LG&E also purchases, stores, and transports natural gas and distributes and sells natural gas at retail in

Jefferson County and portions of Barren, Bullitt, Green, Hardin, Hart, Henry, Larue, Marion, Meade, Metcalfe, Nelson, Oldham, Shelby, Spencer, Trimble, and Washington Counties.

3. LG&E was incorporated in the Commonwealth of Kentucky on July 2, 1913. LG&E attests that it is in good corporate standing.

4. LG&E is a utility as defined by KRS 278.010(3)(a) and (b) and provides retail gas service to approximately 333,000 customers in seventeen counties in Kentucky.

5. In this filing, LG&E is submitting a tariff filing, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1, setting forth revised rates for its GLT Adjustment Clause.

6. LG&E proposes to change its GLT charges to the rates presented below:

7. LG&E's summary of its revised GLT billing factors to become effective with services rendered on and after May 1, 2023 is attached as Exhibit 2. The distribution charge per month comprises two components: a forecasted rate component based on the forecasted GLT revenue requirement for 2023 and a true-up rate component that true up the 2022 forecasted GLT revenue requirement to actuals and accounts for actual GLT revenues collected during 2022. The transmission credit per Mcf comprises only a true-up rate component since there are no gas

transmission programs currently eligible to be recovered through the GLT. The calculations and supporting documentation for the 2022 True-Up rate components for the GLT distribution charge and GLT transmission credit are attached as Exhibit 3. The calculations and supporting documentation for the 2023 Forecasted rate component for the GLT distribution charge is attached as Exhibit 4.

8. After the elimination of the Transmission Modernization Program from GLT recovery in Case No. 2020-00350², LG&E collected additional revenues through the forecasted rate component from January 2022 through April 2022 that are proposed to be returned to customers by updating the true-up rate component effective for services rendered May 1, 2023 through April 30, 2024. The support showing the amount of revenues to be returned to customers is included as Page 5 of Exhibit 3³. LG&E plans to file a subsequent tariff by March 1, 2024 to reduce the GLT transmission credit to zero.
