Owsley County has been awarded federal funds under the Emergency Food & Shelter National Board Program.

Owsley County has been chosen to receive \$10,230 for Phase 40 to supplement the Emergency Food and Shelter programs in the county.

The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and consists of representatives from The Salvation Army; American Red Cross; United Jewish Communities; Catholic Charities; USA; National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.; and, United Way of America. The Local Board was charged to distribute funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high need areas around the country.

A Local Board made up of local officials and representatives will determine how the funds awarded to Breathitt County are to be distributed among the Emergency Food and Shelter programs run by local service agencies in the area. Owsley County has distributed Emergency Food and Shelter funds previously. These agencies were responsible for providing meals, shelter and utilities.

Utility Disconnections are Dangerous, Ineffective, and Unnecessary

from front off if a doctor or service provider certifies that a disconnection would threaten their health and safety, and prevented utilities from disconnecting if a customer pays 10 percent of their bill or \$200, whichever was less. However, that legislation did not pass. The measures proposed in House Bill 66 align with the recommendations outlined by the Energy and Policy Institute and Center for Biological Diversity. The study recommends permanent state moratoriums on utility shut-offs if customers meeting established poverty criteria cannot pay their bills, or temporary moratoriums for extreme weather. It also recommends reconnection criteria that prioritize low-income communities when climate disasters cause power outages. The study recommends that states adopt strong accountability mechanisms for utilities to focus on performance, and that states make utilities bear the cost of fossil fuel price volatility instead of allowing them to pass costs on to ratepayers. Fuel price volatility was a huge issue in Kentucky this winter. In Olive Hill, for example, customers recently experienced jumps of up to \$400 on their bills due to fuel adjustment charges. While major utilities in other states are focusing on expanding the renewable energy sources feeding their grids to bring down these fuel costs, LGE and KU recently proposed investing \$1.2 billion dollars in two new natural gas powered facilities. That kind of continued dependence on fossil fuels increases the likelihood that customers will be subject to ongoing fuel adjustment charges. As extreme weather events become more and more common, we must place the interests of everyday Kentuckians ahead of high-paid utility executives and their investors. We need solutions like those outlined here, alongside policies and programs that help our families and businesses access energy efficiency and clean energy to lower our bills. We need our utilities to leverage unprecedented federal incentives, like the Inflation Reduction Act signed into law in 2022, to help us pay for the clean energy future that Kentuckians want and deserve. Finally, we need citizens to get involved with groups like Kentuckians for Energy Democracy, a citizen led effort to help fellow community members understand our immense collective power.

moved license and permit exemptions for resident owners of, and others who live or work on, small tracts of farmland. The bill made the following changes: Kentucky resident

owners of farmlands of less than 5 acres, their spouses and their dependent children must buy applicable licenses and permits in order to hunt or fish on their farmlands. Tenants, their spous-

es and their dependent children also must buy applicable licenses and permits in order to hunt or fish on farmlands of less than 5 acres where they reside and work.

Persons to whom these changes apply must be able to show they are properly licensed while hunting or fishing on those properties smaller than 5 acres. Otherwise, they risk being issued a citation.

The bill also removed the requirement that an applicant under the age of 16 get written consent from a parent or legal guardian before applying for a youth statewide hunting license. It does not change the requirement in regulation regarding parents or other adults accompanying youths in the field.

The bill also designated Kentucky Fish and Wildlife as a state purchasing agent and clarified that any contracts available to multiple state agencies the for procurement of goods or services must also be available to the department, including but not limited to electronic access to the statewide accounting system. In addition, it also created a mechanism and process for the formation of an evaluation and selection committee for engineering and engineering-related services to allow Kentucky Fish and Wildlife to perform its own evaluations of proposals, it defined participation requirements in Kentucky Fish and Wildlife's architectural services and requires the department to promulgate regulations to implement procedures for the procurement of engineering services. Senate Resolution 160: A resolution confirming the appointment of Gregory Wade Cecil to the Fish and Wildlife Resources Commission.

House Bill 144: An act relating to privacy This bill created a new section of KRS Chapter 15 to: define terms; provide protections from in-person access to private open land by law enforcement: and require law enforcement to use bodyworn cameras and audio devices while on private open land. Conservation officers may continue accessing private land to dispatch crippled, distressed, dangerous or invasive wildlife when necessary; to conduct compliance checks or surveillance based upon a reasonable suspicion; or if property boundaries are unfenced or cannot be reasonably iden-

tified. House Bill 444: An act relating to government agencies, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

This bill provides a 6-percent salary increase for eligible state workers, including all Kentucky Fish and Wildlife employees. This includes employees who are on initial probation. Raises will be effective in July 2023. House Bill 373: An

act relating to peace

officer certification.

This bill amends various portions of Chapter 15 as it relates to peace officers in Kentucky and allows an officer who has been on inactive status for less than one year to return to certification status with no additional training requirements. The bill also redefines several key terms in the chapter.

House Bill 115: An act relating to service animals.

This bill expands the definition of service animal to include "police dog" as, "any dog owned or employed by a law enforcement agency as defined in KRS 61.298 for the purpose of detecting criminal activity enforcement of laws, and apprehension of offenders." Assault on a service animal in the first degree is a Class D felony.

Kentucky Fish and Wildlife currently has three K-9 service dogs partnered with conservation officers.

intellectual disability. Reorganization of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, Sen. Stephen Meredith – SB 48 implements changes to the Cabinet for Health and Family Services based on recommendations from the 2022 Interim Cabinet for Health and Family Services Task Reorganizational Force.

To improve maternal mental health out-Sen. Shelley comes. Funke Frommeyer – SB 135 directs the Cabinet for Health and Family Services to provide access on its website to an evidence-based clinical assessment designed to detect the symptoms of perinatal mental health disorders. It seeks to create awareness and better education about the symptoms of perinatal mental health disorders to expectant and new mothers.

Increasing access to public assistance for disabled Kentuckians, Sen. Danny Carroll – SB 160 exempts money held in STABLE Kentucky accounts from consideration when determining eligibility for public assistance programs.

Reporting of child abuse and neglect, Sen. Julie Raque Adams – SB 229 ensures that the reporting of child abuse and neglect is properly communicated to the appropriate agencies. The measure also allows the Department for Community Based Services to initiate an assessment or an investigation when child abuse is suspected and allows discretion to make announced or unannounced home visits depending on the severity of the case.

Most of these measures will take effect on Thursday, June 29, except for those that have emergency clauses or include a specific date.

Using social media wisely

Social media is very much a part of our culture, with most young people and adults regularly using the outlets to connect with their friends and family. When used appropriately, social media can be very positive. However, misuse can lead to serious consequences. For example, cyberbullying has increased with the popularity of social media. In some cases, thieves have used social media accounts to target their victims.

Some social media outlets have member guidelines, such as Twitter and Facebook, that require account holders to be at least 13 years old. However, some young people falsify their ages to gain entry.

Here are some tips to help you and your children safely navigate social media platforms.

> · Ensure you and your child use your real names and ages when activating social media accounts.

• Do not post personal information, such as social security numbers, home addresses, phone and details numbers about when you are on vacation or not home, on social media sites to avoid becoming a target for thieves.

· Make sure you and your child personally know each person listed as your friends or followers.

• Use social media privacy settings but realize that what you say on social media is never private

• Monitor your child's accounts and your friends and followers' feeds to ensure no one has posted private or inappropriate information about you or your family. Ask your friends to remove any information involving you or your family that you feel is inappropriate or private. Remove tags from any inappropriate photos your friends may post of you and your family.

Remind your child that what they say and do online can have real-life consequences, both now and in the future.

• Encourage your children to talk to you if someone's online behavior makes them feel uncomfortable or threatened.

I am moving from Fountain Valley, California (92708) to Spirit Lake, Idaho (83869).

I have a 2019 front-wheel-drive Chevy Trax with 15,728 miles.

As I am not used to driving in super cold weather with snow and ice, I'm guessing I should probably trade for a four-wheel-drive vehicle ... with heated seats and a heated steering wheel. Do you have any recommendations?

I'm looking to keep the price below \$30,000, and newer is better so I can get a warranty. — Jennifer First of all, thanks for pro-

viding your new zip code. Now I know where to ship you 10 pairs of Bronko Nagurski long underwear.

Yes, you should definitely get a vehicle with all-wheel drive, heated seats and a heated steering wheel. If they have heated seat belts and radio dials, consider those, too.

You might even want to get four snow tires when you get to Idaho depending on how comfortable you feel driving there and how often you have to drive in unplowed snow.

I would recommend you get your new car before you move. Why? Because the market for your two-wheel drive Chevy Trax will be more limited in Spirit Lake, Idaho. You'll get more for

it by selling it in California, where it's a perfectly useable car.
