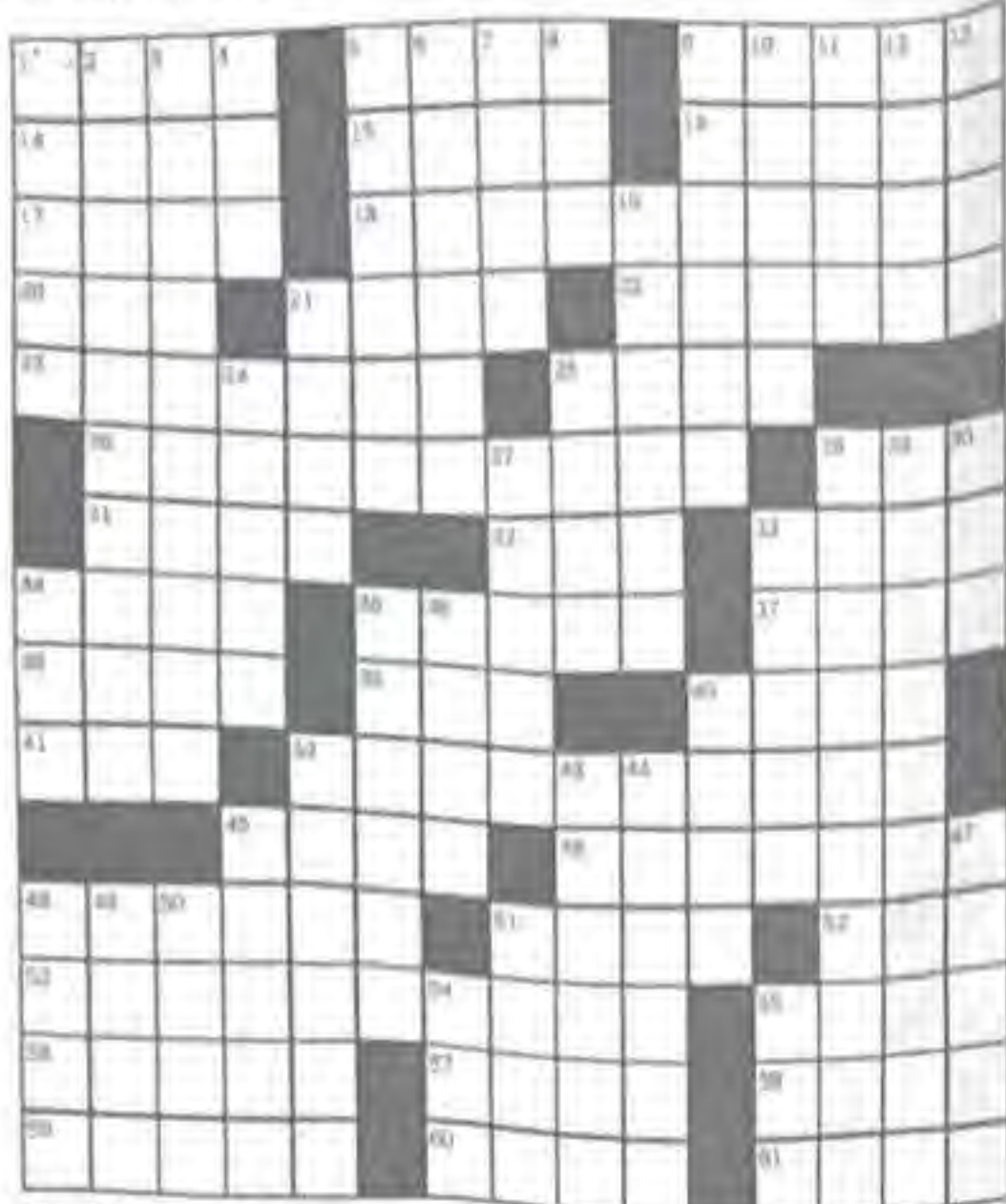

Their husband derails the family vacation

Dear Carolyn: I am frustrated by the way my husband's procrastination affects the family. One example: Last week, we both had the week off and planned to drive to the beach four hours away. The day before our scheduled departure, my husband told me he hadn't done a work assignment yet and needed to before he could leave town. I took the kids to the pool all day so he could finish, but when I returned, he hadn't even started. He'd spent the day watching Netflix and panicking about the work that wasn't done. It ended up taking him two more days to start the project — which then only took three hours to actually complete. We lost two prepaid nights in a hotel.

This is a common pattern: He says he needs to do something, so I take over all household responsibilities so he can do it, and then he still doesn't do it. What do I do? A friend said I should have left without him and let him suffer the consequences, but, in this case, and many cases, the "consequence" would be that he ends up getting a quiet house to himself for a week while I

solo-wrangle a 2-year-old and 4-year-old by myself at the Jersey Shore.

Just. Do. It.: This could be a neurological issue, an anxiety issue or some other issue in your husband's mind or character, and so not your issue to solve for him. I assume that informed your friend's answer, and it's not wrong.

Because it makes your life worse, however, it's a serious marital issue, and therefore your issue. Attrition is one of love's top causes of death. Plus, all those family adventures you don't have are memories you don't form and therefore can't summon years later to renew and reinforce your bond. It's the family's issue.

I elaborated this because it's such a tough spot for you both. No one (healthy) wants to have or be a spousal homework monitor, so attrition is a risk here as well. But your husband clearly needs monitoring if he hopes to stay married, employed and bonded to his kids.

The best option this leaves for you is to serve as a kind of before-and-after bracket, where you initiate the remedy process and

then support the one he chooses, but the remedy itself is on him.

Specifically, you begin a multipart conversation and note that your current leave-him-to-it strategy isn't effective. Then you sit down to brainstorm and assess alternatives. Hire an organizer? Get neuropsych testing and any follow-up treatment? Identify and replicate conditions where he is able to focus? People don't need an ADHD diagnosis to benefit from related work strategies, so hit the search engines.

Again — you only precipitate the change. He makes it, then you support it. This may still be more involvement in a fellow adult's workload than you ever wanted, but that's the riddle of life partners and executive function problems: How much extra work do you assume to preempt doing all the work? Loading nonexecutive household responsibilities, or ones he procrastinates less, onto his side of the ledger is one way to correct potentially relationship-killing imbalances. So are vacations that anticipate his disability, whether it's official or not — with contingencies built in.

Will hurricanes Idalia, Franklin impact Cincinnati's weather?

Region will continue to see dry, sunny days through Labor Day

As two hurricanes approach the southeastern U.S., Greater Cincinnati will continue to experience relatively dry and sunny days.

According to CBS News, Hurricane Idalia is expected to grow to at least a Category 3 before making landfall on the Florida Gulf Coast on Wednesday. Hurricane Franklin, the first major hurricane of the Atlantic season, was labeled a Category 4 with 140 mph maximum sustained winds Tuesday morning and has already caused "life-threatening surf and rip current" along the southeastern coastline.

But according to the National Weather Service, effects from the two hurricanes are not expected to

impact the Ohio Valley Region at this time. Instead, more dry weather and below-normal temperatures will continue.

Dry and cool conditions will persist through the week. Precipitation chances will remain very low. Temperatures will not warm up until the end of the week, with a warm forecast predicted for Labor Day weekend.

Duke Energy, Ohio task force deploy for hurricane

Preparations for Hurricane Idalia are not limited to Florida and Georgia. Ohio's Task Force 1 Urban Search and Rescue Team has been packing up to deploy and Duke Energy is mobilizing thousands of workers.

Idalia is expected to make landfall on Florida's Gulf Coast on Wednesday. Many residents there have already been told to evacuate.

Meteorologists have told residents to expect storm surges of up to 12 feet and winds of at least 75 miles an hour.

Eight additional FEMA urban search and rescue teams have been deployed in addition to Ohio's task force, which is based in Vandalia.

Duke Energy said it is mobilizing 4,500 workers ahead of the storm so that outages can be addressed quickly.

The storm is expected to cut across the entire state of Florida and travel up the Atlantic Coast, possibly hitting Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina.

'A horror movie': Juvenile who shot infant, teen to be tried as adult

Jesse Mascus was 15 years old when prosecutors say he fired his way into a Paddock Hills apartment, went into a dark bedroom and started shooting.

Mascus fired 12 shots, according to prosecutors, mortally wounding 17-year-old Tyeion Spraggs, who was asleep in bed. A 1-year-old boy who was in the same bed was wounded.

The shooting, Assistant Prosecutor Linda Scott said at a hearing Monday in Hamilton County Juvenile Court, was like something "out of a horror movie."

"Anybody could have been in that bed," Scott said. "His disrespect for human life cannot be rehabilitated in juvenile court."

Judge Stacey DeGraffenreid ruled that Mascus was not amenable to treatment and rehabilitation in the juvenile system. Mascus, now 16, will be prosecuted as an adult.

He faces charges including aggravated murder, burglary and felonious assault. The Enquirer is now naming him because he is being prosecuted as an adult.

Psychologist's findings

In July, DeGraffenreid found that there was enough evidence for Mascus to stand trial as an adult. Monday's amenability hearing surrounded whether he could be rehabilitated in the juvenile system before he turns 21.

A psychologist said Mascus could not be rehabilitated, according to DeGraffenreid. The psychologist also found that he is physically, emotionally and psychologically fit to be transferred.

Mascus' attorney, Bradley Fox, said there are programs available in the juvenile system that could help Mascus. Fox noted that Mascus has some mental issues, including attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, conduct disorder and "cannabis-related disorder."

Fox also said Mascus had "suffered a lot of childhood trauma." He did not give specifics.

Fox said Mascus maintains his innocence.

Prosecutor: Jealousy led to shooting

The shooting happened Feb. 18 at approximately 4:43 a.m. Scott said it was sparked by jealousy. Mascus' on-again, off-again girlfriend lived at the apartment, ac-

cording to testimony, and Mascus was upset that Spraggs was there with her that night.

Four months before the shooting, Mascus ran away from Hillcrest Academy, a juvenile facility, and cut off his electronic monitoring unit, according to Scott. He was warned by authorities at the time of the shooting.

Mascus will continue to be held in the county youth center. DeGraffenreid set his bond at just over \$1 million.

Another man, 23-year-old Mykale Dudley, also faces murder charges in the case. Prosecutors say he went into the apartment with Mascus and acted as "a look out."
