APPLICATION

Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU"), pursuant to KRS 278.018(6), 807 KAR 5:001 Section 14, and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 22, hereby applies for approval of changes in its certified service territory as agreed to with Blue Grass Energy Cooperative Corporation ("Blue Grass Energy").

- 1. KU's mailing address is Kentucky Utilities Company, Post Office Box 32010, 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky 40202. KU may be reached by electronic mail at the electronic mail addresses of its counsel set forth below.
- 2. KU was incorporated in Kentucky on August 17, 1912, and in Virginia on November 26, 1991 (and effective as of December 1, 1991), and is in good standing in both Kentucky and Virginia.
- 3. KU is a public utility, as defined in KRS 278.010(3)(a), engaged in the electric business. KU generates and purchases electricity, and distributes and sells electricity at retail in the following counties in Central, Northern, Southeastern, and Western Kentucky:

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5. <u>Description of Changes in Service Territory</u>:

As explained in this application and in the attached exhibits, KU and Blue Grass Energy have individually agreed to the requested territorial change for five parcels of land described

below. The proposed territorial boundary change serves the purposes of KRS 278.016. The change avoids the wasteful duplication of facilities, the unnecessary encumbrance of the landscape, and minimizes disputes between retail electric providers. No existing customer will change electric provider.

When the two utilities learned of the plan to construct five residential homes in the area off of Mill Creek Pike, KU and Blue Grass Energy engineering staffs together reviewed and studied the planned subdivision layout. As is normal protocol in situations where a new development spans across two utilities' service territories, the companies agreed to redraw the certified service territory boundary line in order to efficiently and fairly align with the new property lines. Due to the location and configuration of the current electric utility facilities in the area, the logistics for KU to serve this particular site are challenging and would cause additional costs to the customers for KU to extend its facilities. KU would need to acquire an easement, as well as traverse a large forested area that would have to be cleared. Blue Grass Energy, on the other hand, could extend its nearby facilities with minimal burden. Therefore it would be in the best interest of both utilities, and of the proposed customers, to change the current service area boundary to allow Blue Grass Energy to extend its nearby distribution facilities to serve the proposed development.

The territorial maps and other attachments provided constitute the entire agreement between KU and Blue Grass Energy.

6. Agreement and Maps:

Application Exhibit 1 of this filing includes the summary list identifying KU and Blue Grass Energy personnel familiar with the specifics of the facilities available, the reason for the proposed change (purposes served under KRS 278.016), and the agreement signed by both parties for the properties involved. Application Exhibit 2 includes the signed territorial (quadrant) map.

Application Exhibit 3 includes the signed detailed site map and includes the locations of KU and Blue Grass Energy distribution facilities.

WHEREFORE, KU hereby requests, pursuant to KRS 278.018, that the Commission enter an order approving the updates to the Quadrant Map to reflect the current requested service territory changes and the agreement between KU and Blue Grass Energy.
