Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 5, Warren County Water District (“Warren District”) moves that this matter be closed and removed from the Commission’s docket. In support of its Motion, Warren District states:


1. On July 7, 2023, Warren District gave notice of its intent to apply for a declaratory order regarding the need for a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the proposed construction of certain water distribution facilities.
2. The circumstances giving rise to Warren District’s notice have significantly changed. The need for a declaratory order does not presently exist.
3. Construction of the proposed facilities for which Warren District intended to seek a declaratory order has not commenced and will not commence

until a certificate of public convenience and necessity or a declaratory order regarding the need for a certificate has been obtained.

WHEREFORE, Warren District requests that this matter be closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
