APPLICATION

The Applicant, Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E"), respectfully states as follows:

1. The full name and mailing address of LG&E is Louisville Gas and Electric Company, 220 W. Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky 40202. LG&E may be reached by electronic mail at the electronic mail addresses of its counsel set forth below.

2. LG&E is a public utility, as defined in KRS 278.010(3)(a), engaged in the electric and gas business. LG&E generates and purchases electricity and distributes and sells electricity at retail in Jefferson County and portions of Bullitt, Hardin, Henry, Meade, Oldham, Shelby, Spencer, and Trimble Counties. LG&E also purchases, stores and transports natural gas and distributes and sells natural gas at retail in Jefferson County and portions of Barren, Bullitt, Green, Hardin, Hart, Henry, Larue, Marion, Meade, Metcalfe, Nelson, Oldham, Shelby, Spencer, Trimble, and Washington Counties.

3. This filing is made in accordance with Section 278.020(4) of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

4. LG&E was incorporated in Kentucky on July 2, 1913, and is in good corporate standing. A copy of the Certificate is attached as Exhibit B.

5. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 8, on August 23, 2023, LG&E filed with the Commission notice of its intent to use electronic filing procedures in this proceeding. Copies of all orders, pleadings, and other communications related to this proceeding should be directed to:

6. Receipt of the requested certificate will allow LG&E to pursue its bid on a new franchise for which the City of Muldraugh, Kentucky (the "City") has solicited bids pursuant to resolution or ordinance and advertisement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

7. There is and will continue to be a demand and need for electric and gas service in the areas of the City subject to the franchise, and LG&E desires to obtain franchises in accordance with the bidding protocol established by the City.

8. Should LG&E be successful in acquiring said franchises, it will file copies thereof with the Commission.

WHEREFORE, Louisville Gas and Electric Company asks that the Commission enter an Order granting to LG&E a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to bid for and acquire a franchise from the City on or before October 9, 2023.

COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY CITY OF MULDRAUGH

ORDINANCE NO. 385

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A FRANCHISE FOR THE ERECTION, LAYING AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRIC AND NATURAL GAS FACILITIES AND APPURTENANT FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT IN, ALONG AND ACROSS THE PUBLIC WAYS, ROADS, STREETS, ALLEYS, AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF MULDRAUGH, KENTUCKY: FOR FURNISHING AND SELLING ELECTRICITY AND NATURAL GAS BY MEANS OF SAID FACILITIES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SAID FRANCHISE.

WHEREAS, the City of Muldraugh ("City") wishes to ensure that electric and natural gas service

continues to be furnished to its citizens in a reliable and efficient manner;

WHEREAS, the City is aware that the provision of such service requires the continued use of

public streets, ways, alleys and other public places;

WHEREAS, the franchise granted to and acquired by Louisville Gas and Electric Company on

January 11, 2004, under which that utility provided such service, will expire by its terms; January

11, 2024.

WHEREAS, the City wishes to provide for the sale of a new franchise for the benefit of its citizenry, giving effect to Section 96.010 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

Section 1. An exclusive franchise ("Franchise") to use the City's public rights-of-way, as described in the Franchise Agreement attached to this Ordinance, is hereby created.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Franchise created by this Ordinance shall be bid in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and Chapter 424 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as well as any applicable City ordinances.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Franchise created by this Ordinance shall be awarded to the highest and best bidder as shall be determined by the City in its sole discretion. In awarding the Franchise, the City shall consider the technical, managerial, and financial qualifications of the bidder to perform its obligations under the Franchise. <u>Section 4.</u> The winning bidder and the City shall negotiate, execute and be bound by a Franchise Agreement with terms identical to, or substantially identical to, the Franchise Agreement referenced in <u>Section 1</u> above and attached hereto, such Agreement to contain terms "that are fair and reasonable to the City, to the purchaser of the Franchise and to the patrons of the utility" (KRS Section 96.010). Such Franchise Agreement shall become effective with the first billing cycle on or after the expiration of the existing franchise agreement, to allow the City and the winning bidder to develop appropriate procedures for identifying and reviewing the electric and natural gasconsuming entities within the City's corporate limits.

<u>Section 5.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 6.</u> Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement, as applicable.

Section 7. Time is of the essence in carrying out the terms and the provisions of this Ordinance and the Franchise created herein.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage and publication. Read at a meeting of the Muldraugh City Council on the 17th day of July, 2023; a second reading was held on the 31st day of July, 2023; said Ordinance was READ and APPROVED on the 31st day of July, 2023.

Kentucky's quota hunt application period open through Sept. 30 including quota hunt at Otter Creek

The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources offers annual quota hunts for deer, waterfowl and pheasants at state wildlife management areas and other public lands, and for sandhill cranes on a statewide basis. Randomized drawings are conducted to determine recipients of the hunt opportunities that are each limited to a specific quota number. Nov. 3-5, Nov. 10-12 and Jan. 9-10, 2024

Hunters can apply for these quota hunts through Sept. 30 via the MyProfile online portal at fw.ky.gov. Applications are not accepted over the phone, and the minimum fee is \$3 per application. Applicants will receive a confirmation number. Results will be posted online as soon as Oct. 6 through MyProfile.

Kentucky Fish and Wildlife offers 38 deer quota hunts at various wildlife manage-

terfowl quota hunts at five public land locations; pheasant hunts at 3 WMAs; and statewide permits to hunt sandhill cranes.

Locations and dates for 2023-24 deer season quota hunts at Kentucky state parks include:

• Dale Hollow Lake State Resort Park: Nov. 6-10, Dec. 9-10 (youth only) and Jan. 6-7, 2024

Greenbo Lake State Resort Park: State

Green River Lake Dec. 14-17 and Dec. Park: 21-24 Resort Kenlake State Park: 9-12 and Nov. Jan. 6-7, 2024 State Kincaid Lake Park: Dec. 7-10 and Dec. 14-17 Quota deer hunts during the 2023-

ment areas (WMAs) and state parks; wa- ter Creek Outdoor Recreation Area in Meade County is scheduled for Dec. 9-10.

For a complete list of all quota deer hunts, dates and special regulations view pages 39-42 of Kentucky Fish and Wildlife's annual Fall Hunting and Trapping Guide or visit the online Quota Hunts webpage at fw.ky.gov. Some hunts are reserved for youth or mobility-impaired hunters. Kentucky's annual hunting guides (booklets summarizing applicable regulations) are also available at license vendors throughout the state.

Upland bird hunters can apply for pheasant quota hunts that will be held at Green River Lake on Nov. 17-19 and at Yellowbank and Clay WMAs on Dec. 1-3.

The statewide sandhill crane season is Dec. 7 through Jan. 31, 2024. Drawn sandhill crane hunters will be issued printable tags attached to hunting permits, accessible through the online sandhill crane app at fw.ky.gov. Selected applicants must pass an online sandhill crane identification test before receiving a permit, and while hunting must carry the crane permit and tags in addition to a valid Kentucky hunting license and Migratory Bird/Waterfowl Permit.

Quota hunts control the number of hunters in an area to provide quality hunting opportunities and regulate harvests at specific areas. Residents and nonresidents are eligible. Prior to hunts, drawn hunters must purchase applicable licenses and permits to legally hunt during quota hunts.
