

CUSTOMER NOTICE OF REVISIONS TO POLE AND STRUCTURE ATTACHMENT CHARGES – RATE PSA

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, on August 30, 2024, Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Kentucky Utilities Company (“the Companies”) will file with the Kentucky Public Service Commission (“Commission”) revisions to its Pole and Structure Attachment Charges – Rate PSA tariff (“Rate PSA”). The primary purpose of the proposed revisions is to conform the Rate PSA to the Emergency Amendments to 807 KAR 5:015 (Access and Attachments to Utility Poles and Facilities) adopted by the Commission on May 31, 2024, **as revised after comment on August 15, 2024**. Unless suspended by the Commission, the revised Rate PSA will become effective on September 30, 2024.

You received a prior Customer Notice that the Companies filed proposing revisions to their Rate PSA on July 31, 2024. However, the Commission further revised its Emergency Amendments to 807 KAR 5:015 on August 15, 2024. Therefore, the Companies are withdrawing their July 31, 2024 tariff filing and replacing it with a proposed Rate PSA version that complies with the most-recently revised Emergency Amendments. The substantive revisions to the Rate PSA are outlined below.

Definitions

The definitions of “High Volume Application” and “Larger Order” have been revised to conform to the Emergency Amendments referenced above. Under the Emergency Amendments, a “Larger Order” is an application (or multiple applications with a 30-day period) for 500 to 2,999 poles, whereas the previous definition of “Larger Order” was an application (or multiple applications with a 30-day period) for 300 to 999 poles. A “High Volume Application” is an application (or multiple applications) in excess of a “Larger Order.” The revised definitions will apply for such period as the Emergency Amendments remain in effect. Upon expiration of the Emergency Amendments, the previous definitions of “High Volume Application” and “Larger Order” will be reinstated.

Website

The revised Rate PSA includes a new section entitled “Website” which identifies the URL for a website maintained by the Companies. The website identified in this section includes the information required by Section 3(5)(b) of 807 KAR 5:015E, as well as other materials useful or pertinent to the pole attachment process. The revised Rate PSA explains that the information posted on the website may be updated from time to time.

Section 7 – Attachment Applications and Permits

Advance Notice of Larger Orders: During the period the Emergency Amendments remain in effect, if an Attachment Customer submits an application (or multiple applications within a 30-day period) to make attachments to more than 500 poles, the Attachment Customer is now required to provide Companies with at least 90 days’ advance written notice before submitting such

application (or applications) in accordance with Section 4(8)(g) of 807 KAR 5:015E. The notice shall be provided in the manner set forth in Companies' Third Party Pole Attachment Handbook.

Make-Ready Surveys: During the period the Emergency Amendments remain in effect, Companies may not require an Attachment Customer to submit a Make-Ready Survey as part of a complete application. Further, during the period the Emergency Amendments remain in effect, an Attachment Customer may submit a survey with an application in accordance with Section 4(2)(a)(6), 807 KAR 5:015E. The revised Rate PSA also provides that Companies may, upon written notice to Attachment Customer, waive the applicable period for Companies' performance of the Make-Ready Survey in order to accelerate Attachment Customer's right to perform self-help surveys as permitted under 807 KAR 5:015 or 807 KAR 5:015E.

Make-Ready Survey Timelines: The revised PSA includes an additional chart setting forth the applicable time periods for Companies performance of the Make-Ready Survey during the period the Emergency Amendments remain effective. The timelines within the new chart conform to Sections 4(2)(b) and 4(8)(b) of 807 KAR 5:015E.

Timelines for Completing Make-Ready: The revised Rate PSA includes an additional chart setting forth the applicable time periods for Companies' performance of Make-Ready Work during the period the Emergency Amendments remain effective. The timelines within the new chart conform to Sections 4(4) and 4(8)(c) of 807 KAR 5:015E.

Section 8 – One-Touch Make-Ready

The revised Rate PSA includes an additional chart setting forth the applicable time periods for Companies' review on the merits of a One Touch Make-Ready application during the period the Emergency Amendments remain effective. The timelines within the new chart are an effort to conform to Sections 4(11) of 807 KAR 5:015E.

A person may also examine the proposed tariff at the Commission's offices located at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., or may view and download the proposed tariff through the Commission's website at <http://psc.ky.gov>.

The terms and conditions in the revised Rate PSA are proposed by Companies, but the Commission may order terms and conditions that differ from those proposed. A person may submit a timely written request for intervention to the Commission by email to pscled@ky.gov or mail to Kentucky Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602, establishing the grounds for the request, including the status and interest of the party. If the Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of initial publication or mailing of the notice, the Commission may take final action on the proposed tariff.
