



Extreme cold and pressures on the regional grid are resulting in scattered power outages and we need our customers' help by reducing energy consumption.


Our team is working diligently to help minimize extended impacts to our customers and as part of those efforts, we are performing brief service interruptions in intervals across our service territories.

As always, but especially in times of extreme cold, our employees are working around the clock to ensure safe, reliable service to our customers and the communities we serve.







